A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the registration and titling of military
- vehicles.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.30, subsection 2, Code 2011, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 2. <u>a.</u> Unless otherwise provided for in this chapter, the
 4 department or the county treasurer shall refuse registration
 5 and issuance of a certificate of title unless the vehicle bears
 6 a manufacturer's label pursuant to 49 C.F.R. pt. 567 certifying
- 7 that the vehicle meets federal motor vehicle safety standards.
- 8 <u>b. A military vehicle</u>, other than a vehicle that runs on
- 9 continuous tracks or wheels and tracks, that was originally
- 10 manufactured for and sold directly to the armed forces of the
- 11 United States in conformity with contractual specifications,
- 12 as provided in 49 C.F.R. § 571.7, may be registered and issued
- 13 a certificate of title if the owner provides satisfactory
- 14 evidence to the department that the vehicle is substantially
- 15 in compliance with federal motor vehicle safety standards.
- 16 The department may adopt rules as necessary concerning the
- 17 registration and titling of military vehicles in accordance
- 18 with this chapter.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- 20 Under current law, military vehicles which are retired from
- 21 use by the United States armed forces are not eligible for
- 22 registration and titling in this state because they do not
- 23 have a manufacturer's label certifying that the vehicle meets
- 24 federal motor vehicle safety standards. Although federal law
- 25 does not allow the application of the manufacturer's label on
- 26 military vehicles, some of those vehicles do meet federal motor
- 27 vehicle safety standards. This bill allows the department
- 28 of transportation to register certain military vehicles that
- 29 were manufactured in conformance with United States military
- 30 requirements, other than a vehicle that runs on continuous
- 31 tracks or wheels and tracks, if the owner provides satisfactory
- 32 evidence that the vehicle is substantially in compliance
- 33 with federal motor vehicle safety standards. The department
- 34 is authorized to adopt rules as necessary concerning the
- 35 registration of military vehicles.
