A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the composition of the board of massage
- 2 therapy and the education requirements for licensed massage 3 therapists.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 147.14, subsection 1, paragraph q, Code
2 2011, is amended to read as follows:

3 q. For massage therapists, four members licensed to practice 4 massage therapy, two members who are instructors at a school 5 of massage therapy in the state of Iowa, and three members who 6 are not licensed to practice massage therapy and who shall 7 represent the general public.

8 Sec. 2. Section 152C.3, Code Supplement 2011, is amended 9 by striking the section and inserting in lieu thereof the 10 following:

11 152C.3 Requirements for licensure.

12 1. a. The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A 13 to establish a procedure for licensing of massage therapists. 14 The rules shall establish minimum educational requirements and 15 specify and define the required massage therapy academic course 16 units.

b. License requirements shall include the following:
(1) Graduation from an accredited high school or the
equivalent.

(2) Graduation from a postsecondary educational institution
21 offering academic credit or clock-hour training in a massage
22 therapy curriculum approved by the board.

23 (3) Passage of a licensing examination given or approved by24 the board.

(4) Payment of a fee required by the board which shall
compensate and be retained by the board for the costs of
administering this chapter.

28 c. To be approved by the board an educational institution29 shall do all of the following:

30 (1) Require that applicants are at least eighteen years of 31 age and have earned a diploma from an accredited high school 32 or the equivalent.

33 (2) Require for graduation satisfactory completion of all
 34 coursework required by the educational institution and proof of
 35 passing an entry-level, competency-based examination.

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(3) Award upon completion a certificate, diploma, or
 2 academic degree and transcripts.

3 (4) Maintain student records indefinitely.

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(5) Pay a fee established by the board.

5 2. In addition to provisions for licensure, the rules shall6 include the following:

7 a. Requirements regarding completion of at least twelve 8 hours of continuing education annually regarding subjects 9 concerning massage and related techniques or the health and 10 safety of the public, subject to reduction by the board if, 11 after public notice and hearing, the board determines that the 12 welfare of the public may be adequately protected with fewer 13 hours.

14 b. (1) Requirements for issuance of a reciprocal license 15 to licensees of states with license requirements equal to or 16 exceeding those of this chapter. The rules shall provide for 17 issuance of a temporary reciprocal license for licensees of 18 states with lesser requirements.

19 (2) A person who applies for licensure from another 20 state who provides satisfactory proof of having been 21 licensed in another state for at least twelve months in the 22 twenty-four-month period preceding the application submission, 23 whose license is currently in good standing with that state, 24 has no history of disciplinary action against such license, 25 meets or exceeds Iowa's educational requirements, and has proof 26 of passing an exam approved by the board may be considered for 27 licensure by the board.

3. A massage therapist licensed pursuant to this chapter
shall be issued a license number and a license certificate.
EXPLANATION

In order to be licensed under current law, a massage therapist must complete a massage education curriculum at a school approved by the board of massage therapy requiring at least 600 hours of supervised academic instruction. This bill bill eliminates the 600-hour requirement and substitutes specific

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1 educational requirements and requires approval of massage

2 therapy schools by the board of massage therapy.

3 The bill also adds two representatives of massage schools to 4 the board of massage therapy.

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
