HOUSE FILE 24 BY J. TAYLOR

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for administration of a civics examination
- 2 by school districts and accredited nonpublic schools as a
- 3 condition of high school graduation.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 256.9, Code 2011, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 62. Approve alternative civics assessments
4 pursuant to section 280.9A, subsection 1, paragraph "b".

5 Sec. 2. Section 280.9A, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 1. The board of directors of each local public school 8 district and the authorities in charge of each nonpublic school 9 shall require that all students in grades nine through twelve 10 <u>successfully</u> complete <u>or pass, as applicable</u>, as a condition of 11 graduation, <u>instruction</u> <u>the following:</u>

12 <u>a. Instruction</u> in American history and the governments of 13 Iowa and the United States, including instruction in voting 14 statutes and procedures, voter registration requirements, 15 the use of paper ballots and voting systems in the election 16 process, and the method of acquiring and casting an absentee 17 ballot.

b. A civics examination. The examination shall be the
same as, and shall include all questions used in, the latest
available civics examination administered by the United States
citizenship and immigration services office. The proctored
examination shall be completed without ancillary materials and
only students who score a proficiency of seventy-five percent
or higher shall be considered to have successfully passed the
examination. Alternative assessment measures approved by the
department of education pursuant to section 256.9, subsection
as defined in section 256B.2, subsection 1, and to students
identified as limited English proficient pursuant to section
280.4.

31 Sec. 3. STATE MANDATE FUNDING SPECIFIED. In accordance 32 with section 25B.2, subsection 3, the state cost of requiring 33 compliance with any state mandate included in this Act shall 34 be paid by a school district from state school foundation aid 35 received by the school district under section 257.16. This

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LSB 1372YH (3) 84 kh/sc 1 specification of the payment of the state cost shall be deemed 2 to meet all of the state funding-related requirements of 3 section 25B.2, subsection 3, and no additional state funding 4 shall be necessary for the full implementation of this Act 5 by and enforcement of this Act against all affected school 6 districts.

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EXPLANATION

8 This bill requires students enrolled in school districts 9 and accredited nonpublic schools to successfully pass as 10 a condition of graduation a proctored civics examination 11 that is the same as the latest available civics examination 12 administered by the U.S. citizenship and immigration services 13 office. Students are prohibited from using ancillary materials 14 during the examination and must achieve a score of at least 75 15 percent to successfully pass the examination.

16 The director of the department of education is tasked with 17 approving alternative assessment measures that school districts 18 and accredited nonpublic schools may administer to children 19 requiring special education and to English language learners. 20 This bill may include a state mandate as defined in Code 21 section 25B.3. The bill requires that the state cost of 22 any state mandate included in the bill be paid by a school 23 district from state school foundation aid received by the 24 school district under Code section 257.16. The specification 25 is deemed to constitute state compliance with any state mandate 26 funding-related requirements of Code section 25B.2. The 27 inclusion of this specification is intended to reinstate the 28 requirement of political subdivisions to comply with any state 29 mandates included in the bill.

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
