A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to school district teaching assignments and
- 2 responsibilities, student advancement by a teacher or school
- district, and providing for the withholding of state aid to
- 4 school districts under certain conditions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 256.7, Code 2011, is amended by adding
- 2 the following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 31. Adopt rules specifically defining the
- 4 amount of state aid to be withheld from a school district for
- 5 a violation of section 279.65.
- 6 Sec. 2. Section 256.9, subsection 52, Code 2011, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 52. Establish and maintain a process and a procedure, in
- 9 cooperation with the board of educational examiners, to compare
- 10 a practitioner's teaching assignment with the license and
- 11 endorsements held by the practitioner. The director may report
- 12 noncompliance issues identified by this process to the board of
- 13 educational examiners pursuant to section 272.15, subsection
- 14 3, and may provide for the withholding of state aid to a school
- 15 district if the department determines that the school district
- 16 has inappropriately assigned a teacher in violation of section
- 17 279.65, subsection 4.
- 18 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 279.65 Teacher of record contact
- 19 hours and endorsements student advancement.
- 20 l. The state board of education shall define the term
- 21 "teacher of record" by rule. The definition shall provide,
- 22 at a minimum, that the term identifies the teacher who has
- 23 responsibility for providing instruction to a given student for
- 24 a given subject during each semester. A student may have more
- 25 than one teacher of record if the school district utilizes team
- 26 teaching in a given subject or when another teacher provides
- 27 supplemental instruction. The state board of education shall
- 28 determine under the definition the share of instructional
- 29 responsibility to be apportioned to each teacher of a subject
- 30 or grade level. The definition shall establish guidelines
- 31 for determining whether a teacher of record is a classroom
- 32 instructor or provides supplemental education in a subject.
- 33 2. At least twice annually, a teacher of record and the
- 34 teacher's supervisor shall verify and, where appropriate,
- 35 correct the roster of students for whom the teacher has been

- 1 assigned responsibility. The teacher of record shall have
- 2 at least fifty percent of the total contact hours with a
- 3 given student in a given subject, except when the coursework
- 4 is offered as an advanced placement class or as online
- 5 postsecondary-level coursework.
- 6 3. A student shall not advance to the next grade level or
- 7 the next level of coursework unless the student demonstrates
- 8 proficiency by successfully meeting the minimum course
- 9 requirements which shall be equally administered for all
- 10 students as demonstrated by the teacher of record's published
- 11 standards for competency and proficiency for the grade level
- 12 or course or by the school district's published standards for
- 13 competency and proficiency for the grade level or course.
- 4. A teacher of record, in accordance with section 272.7,
- 15 shall hold an endorsement for the type of service for which the
- 16 teacher is employed.
- 17 5. If the department of education determines that a school
- 18 district is not in compliance with this section, the department
- 19 shall instruct the director of the department of management
- 20 to withhold state aid to the school district in an amount
- 21 specified under section 256.7, subsection 31. The department
- 22 of education shall direct the department of management to
- 23 restore the amount withheld pursuant to this subsection if the
- 24 department of education determines that the school district is
- 25 in compliance with this section.
- 26 EXPLANATION
- 27 This bill directs the state board of education to define
- 28 "teacher of record" by rule, provides for the number of contact
- 29 hours a teacher of record must have with a given student for
- 30 a given subject, provides that a student shall not advance to
- 31 the next grade or course level unless the student meets the
- 32 teacher of record's standards, and requires that a teacher of
- 33 record hold an endorsement in the subject for which the teacher
- 34 is responsible. The bill provides for the withholding and
- 35 restoration of state aid to a school district that violates the

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1 provisions of the bill. A student may have more than one teacher of record if the 3 school district utilizes team teaching in a given subject 4 or when another teacher provides supplemental instruction. 5 The state board shall determine the share of instructional 6 responsibility to be apportioned to each teacher of a subject 7 or grade level. The definition shall establish guidelines 8 for determining whether a teacher of record is a classroom 9 instructor or provides supplemental education in a subject. At least twice annually, a teacher of record and the 10 11 teacher's supervisor shall verify and, where appropriate, 12 correct the roster of students for whom the teacher has 13 been assigned responsibility. The teacher of record shall 14 have at least 50 percent of the total contact hours with a 15 given student in a given subject, except when the coursework 16 is offered as an advanced placement class or as online 17 postsecondary-level coursework.

A teacher of record shall hold an endorsement for the type of 18 19 service for which the teacher is employed.

20 A student shall not advance to the next grade level or 21 the next level of coursework unless the student demonstrates 22 proficiency by successfully meeting the minimum course 23 requirements which shall be equally administered for all 24 students as demonstrated by the teacher of record's published 25 standards for competency and proficiency for the grade level 26 or course or by the school district's published standards for 27 competency and proficiency for the grade level or course. 28 If the department of education determines that a school 29 district is not in compliance with the provisions of the bill, 30 the department shall instruct the director of the department 31 of management to withhold state aid to the school district in 32 an amount specified by the state board under rules the bill

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35 withheld if the department of education determines that the

33 requires the state board to adopt. The department of education 34 shall direct the department of management to restore the amount
