A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for the collection and retention of fees by
- 2 the public employment relations board.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 20.6, Code 2011, is amended by adding the 2 following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 4A. Establish and collect fees payable by a 3 4 person or entity accessing one or more services available from 5 or through the board. The board may charge a person or entity 6 a fee for accessing the services of the federal mediation 7 and conciliation service through the board if the person or 8 entity does not otherwise have a right to directly access such 9 services, unless otherwise prohibited by federal law. 10 board shall only establish and collect fees necessary for the 11 board to continue offering services required by this chapter. 12 A fee shall not exceed the cost of the service associated 13 with the fee. The board shall not establish a fee which 14 would significantly impair the accessibility of any service 15 provided by the board. All fees collected by the board shall 16 be retained as repayment receipts, as defined in section 8.2, 17 and such fees shall be used exclusively to offset the costs of 18 administering this chapter.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill provides that the public employment relations 21 board has the power to establish and collect fees payable by 22 a person or entity accessing one or more services available 23 from or through the board. The bill provides that the board 24 may charge a person or entity a fee for accessing the services 25 of the federal mediation and conciliation service through 26 the board if the person or entity does not otherwise have 27 a right to directly access such services, unless otherwise 28 prohibited by federal law. The bill provides that the board 29 can only establish and collect fees necessary for the board 30 to continue offering services required by Code chapter 20. 31 The bill specifies that a fee cannot exceed the cost of the 32 service associated with the fee or significantly impair the 33 accessibility of any service provided by the board. The bill 34 provides that fees collected by the board shall be retained as 35 repayment receipts to be used by the board to offset the costs
