HOUSE FILE 379 BY KLEIN

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to access to and funding of the educational
- 2 services offered under a home school assistance program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 299A.2, Code 2011, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 299A.2 Competent private instruction by licensed
 4 practitioner.
- 5 If a licensed practitioner provides competent instruction
- 6 to a school-age child of compulsory attendance age, the
- 7 practitioner shall possess a valid license or certificate which
- 8 has been issued by the state board of educational examiners
- 9 under chapter 272 and which is appropriate to the ages and
- 10 grade levels of the children to be taught. Competent private
- ll instruction may include, but is not limited to, a home school
- 12 assistance program which provides instruction or instructional
- 13 supervision offered through an accredited nonpublic school or
- 14 public school district by a teacher, who is employed by the
- 15 accredited nonpublic school or public school district, who
- 16 assists and supervises a parent, guardian, or legal custodian
- 17 in providing instruction to a child. If competent private
- 18 instruction is provided through a public school district, the
- 19 child shall be enrolled and included in the basic enrollment
- 20 of the school district as provided in section 257.6. Sections
- 21 299A.3 through 299A.7 do not apply to competent private
- 22 instruction provided by a licensed practitioner under this
- 23 section. However, the reporting requirement contained in
- 24 section 299A.3, subsection 1, shall apply to competent private
- 25 instruction provided by licensed practitioners that is not
- 26 part of a home school assistance program offered through an
- 27 accredited nonpublic school or public school district.
- 28 Sec. 2. Section 299A.8, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 29 follows:
- 30 299A.8 Dual enrollment.
- 31 If a parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a school-age
- 32 child who is receiving competent private instruction under
- 33 this chapter or a child over compulsory age who is receiving
- 34 private instruction submits a request, the child shall also be
- 35 registered in a public school for dual enrollment purposes.

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- 1 If the child is enrolled in a public school district for
- 2 dual enrollment purposes, the child shall be permitted to
- 3 participate in any academic activities in the district and
- 4 shall also be permitted to participate on the same basis as
- 5 public school children in any extracurricular activities
- 6 available to children in the child's grade or group, and the
- 7 parent, guardian, or legal custodian shall not be required to
- 8 pay the costs of any annual evaluation under this chapter. If
- 9 the child is enrolled for dual enrollment purposes, the child
- 10 shall be included in the public school's basic enrollment
- 11 under section 257.6. A pupil who is participating only in
- 12 extracurricular activities shall be counted under section
- 13 257.6, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (6). A pupil
- 14 enrolled in grades nine through twelve under this section shall
- 15 be counted in the same manner as a shared-time pupil under
- 16 section 257.6, subsection 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (3).
- 17 Sec. 3. Section 299A.12, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 18 to read as follows:
- 19 1. The board of directors of a school district may shall
- 20 expend moneys received pursuant to section 257.6, subsection
- 21 1, paragraph "a", subparagraph (5), for purposes of providing a
- 22 home school assistance program.
- 23 Sec. 4. Section 299A.12, subsection 2, paragraphs a and b,
- 24 Code 2011, are amended to read as follows:
- 25 a. Assisting Instruction for students and assisting parents
- 26 with instruction.
- 27 b. Student Support services for students and teaching-parent
- 28 support services teaching parents and staff support services.
- 29 Sec. 5. Section 299A.12, subsection 2, paragraph g,
- 30 unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 31 follows:
- 32 Resources, materials, computer software and hardware, and
- 33 supplies, and purchased services that meet the following
- 34 criteria:
- 35 Sec. 6. Section 299A.12, subsection 3, paragraphs b, c, e,

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- 1 and f, Code 2011, are amended to read as follows:
- b. Operational or maintenance costs in addition to the cost
- 3 of maintaining school district facilities other than those
- 4 necessary to operate and maintain the program.
- 5 c. Capital expenditures other than equipment or facility
- 6 acquisition, including the lease or rental of space to
- 7 supplement existing schoolhouse facilities.
- 8 e. Administrative costs other than the costs necessary to
- 9 administer the program.
- 10 f. Concurrent and dual enrollment program costs and
- 11 postsecondary enrollment options program costs.
- 12 EXPLANATION
- 13 This bill permits children to qualify for school district
- 14 home school assistance programs if they are school age, rather
- 15 than of compulsory attendance age. The bill also requires
- 16 school districts to expend moneys received from weighted
- 17 enrollment of children receiving competent private instruction
- 18 at home on home school assistance programs and broadens the
- 19 acceptable uses of the state assistance school districts
- 20 receive from additional weighting for students receiving
- 21 competent private instruction from a licensed practitioner
- 22 provided through a public school district.
- 23 Funds received for purposes of providing a home school
- 24 assistance program under the bill may be used for instructing
- 25 students; for equipment or facility acquisition, including the
- 26 lease or rental of space to supplement existing schoolhouse
- 27 facilities; and for operational, maintenance, or administrative
- 28 costs other than those costs necessary to operate, maintain,
- 29 and administer the program.
