A BILL FOR

An Act relating to the production or manufacture of goods
 retained within the state of Iowa and federal authority
 in relation thereto, providing penalties, and including
 effective date and applicability provisions.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 554E.1 Short title.

2 This chapter may be cited as the "Intrastate Commerce Act".

- 3 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 554E.2 Legislative intent.
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4 The general assembly finds the following:

5 1. The tenth amendment to the Constitution of the United 6 States codifies in law that the only powers which the federal 7 government may exercise are those that have been delegated to 8 it in the Constitution.

9 2. The ninth amendment to the Constitution of the United 10 States guarantees to the people rights not enumerated in the 11 Constitution and reserves to the people those rights.

12 3. Under Article I, section 8, clause 3, of the Constitution 13 of the United States, the federal government is empowered to 14 regulate commerce among the several states.

15 4. The power to regulate intrastate commerce is reserved to16 the states or the people under the ninth and tenth amendments17 to the Constitution of the United States.

18 5. During the constitutional convention, the founders 19 considered and rejected a plan which would have authorized the 20 federal government to not only regulate commerce among the 21 several states, but also any activity having spillover effects 22 across state lines.

23 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 554E.3 Iowa goods retained in-state — 24 federal regulation — inapplicability.

25 1. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 26 requires:

a. "Basic materials or parts" means raw materials physically
and directly associated with the finished product in the
manufacturing process.

30 *b. "Goods"* means all real or personal, tangible or 31 intangible property.

32 c. "Produced" means grown, mined, extracted, or created. 33 2. All goods produced or manufactured, whether commercially 34 or privately, within the boundaries of this state that are 35 held, maintained, or retained within the boundaries of this

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1 state shall not be deemed to have traveled in interstate 2 commerce and shall not be subject to federal law, federal 3 regulation, or the authority of the Congress of the United 4 States under its constitutional power to regulate commerce. 5 This chapter shall apply to goods that are manufactured within 6 this state from basic materials or parts. The authority of the 7 Congress of the United States to regulate interstate commerce 8 in basic materials or parts shall not include the authority 9 to regulate goods manufactured within this state from such 10 materials or parts.

11 3. This chapter shall not apply to the following:
12 a. Goods manufactured within this state unless the words
13 "made in Iowa" are clearly stamped or marked on an integral
14 part of the good.

b. Goods produced within this state unless the words"product of Iowa" are clearly stamped or marked on thecontainer or packaging.

18 c. Goods ordered, procured, or purchased by the United 19 States government or by any contractor pursuant to an agreement 20 with the United States government.

21 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 554E.4 Penalties.

1. Any official, agent, or employee of the United States government or any employee of a corporation providing services to the United States government that enforces or attempts to enforce an Act, order, law, statute, rule, or regulation of the government of the United States in violation of this Act shall be guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor.

Any public officer or employee of this state that 29 enforces or attempts to enforce an Act, order, law, statute, 30 rule, or regulation of the government of the United States in 31 violation of this Act shall be guilty of a serious misdemeanor. 32 Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT AND APPLICABILITY. This 33 Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon 34 enactment and applies to goods held, maintained, or retained 35 within the boundaries of the state that have been produced or

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1 manufactured within this state on or after that date.
2 EXPLANATION
3 This bill relates to the production or manufacture of goods
4 retained within the state of Iowa and federal regulatory
5 authority.
6 The bill provides legislative intent regarding the retention

7 and delegation of powers in the United States Constitution, 8 and states that the power to regulate intrastate commerce is 9 reserved to the states or the people under the ninth and tenth 10 amendments to the Constitution. The bill also states that 11 during the constitutional convention, the founders considered 12 and rejected a plan which would have authorized the federal 13 government to not only regulate commerce among the several 14 states, but also any activity having spillover effects across 15 state lines.

16 The bill provides several definitions. The bill defines 17 "basic materials or parts" to mean raw materials physically 18 and directly associated with the finished product in the 19 manufacturing process. The bill defines "goods" to mean all 20 real or personal, tangible or intangible property. The bill 21 defines "produced" to mean grown, mined, extracted, or created. 22 The bill states that all goods produced or manufactured 23 either commercially or privately within Iowa that are held, 24 maintained, or retained within Iowa shall not be deemed to 25 have traveled in interstate commerce and therefore shall 26 not be subject to federal law, federal regulation, or the 27 constitutional authority of the Congress of the United States 28 to regulate interstate commerce. The bill provides that 29 this only applies to goods that are manufactured within Iowa 30 from basic materials or parts. The bill further provides 31 that protection from federal regulation shall be confined 32 to goods manufactured within Iowa which have "made in Iowa" 33 clearly stamped or marked on an integral part, or produced in 34 Iowa unless the words "product of Iowa" are clearly stamped 35 or marked on the container or packaging. The bill further

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1 provides that goods ordered, procured, or purchased by the 2 United States government or by any contractor pursuant to an 3 agreement with the United States government are not included in 4 the protection from federal regulation.

The bill specifies that any official, agent, or employee of 5 6 the United States government or any employee of a corporation 7 providing services to the United States government that 8 enforces or attempts to enforce an Act, order, law, statute, 9 rule, or regulation of the government of the United States 10 in violation of the bill's provisions shall be guilty of 11 an aggravated misdemeanor. An aggravated misdemeanor is 12 punishable by confinement for no more than two years and a 13 fine of at least \$625 but not more than \$6,250. The bill 14 additionally specifies that any public officer or employee of 15 this state that enforces or attempts to enforce an Act, order, 16 law, statute, rule, or regulation of the government of the 17 United States in violation of the bill shall be guilty of a 18 serious misdemeanor. A serious misdemeanor is punishable by 19 confinement for no more than one year and a fine of at least 20 \$315 but not more than \$1,875.

The bill takes effect upon enactment and applies to goods held, maintained, or retained within the boundaries of the state that have been produced or manufactured within this state on or after that date.

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
