A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for the adoption and implementation of
- 2 complete streets policies applicable to certain highway
- 3 projects.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 306E.1 Short title.
- 2 This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Iowa
- 3 Complete Streets Act".
- 4 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 306E.2 Definitions.
- 5 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 6 requires:
- 7 l. "Agency" means the department, a regional or metropolitan
- 8 planning commission formed pursuant to chapter 28I, a county,
- 9 or a city.
- 10 2. "Complete street" means a roadway that accommodates all
- 11 users of the road including motorists, public transit users,
- 12 bicyclists, and pedestrians of all ages and abilities.
- 3. "Complete streets policy" means a resolution, ordinance,
- 14 statute, administrative rule, or statement of policy relating
- 15 to roads at the state, regional, or local level that ensures,
- 16 in all phases of highway project planning and development,
- 17 the adequate accommodation of all users of the road including
- 18 motorists, public transit users, bicyclists, and pedestrians of
- 19 all ages and abilities.
- 20 4. "Department" means the state department of
- 21 transportation.
- 22 5. "Director" means the director of transportation.
- 23 6. "Highway project" includes the planning, design, funding,
- 24 construction, reconstruction, resurfacing, maintenance, or
- 25 retrofitting of a highway or roadway.
- 26 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 306E.3 Complete streets policy —
- 27 intent.
- 28 1. It is the intent of the general assembly that on or
- 29 before October 1, 2013, every agency having jurisdiction over
- 30 roads in the state or involved in planning for roads shall
- 31 develop and adopt a complete streets policy.
- 32 a. The policy of the department shall explicitly state
- 33 that all highway projects on primary roads shall ensure, in
- 34 all phases of project planning and development, the adequate
- 35 accommodation, safety, and convenience of all users of the road

- 1 in accordance with complete streets principles.
- 2 b. The policy of an agency other than the state shall
- 3 explicitly state that, beginning on the effective date of
- 4 the policy, all highway projects on roads under the agency's
- 5 jurisdiction in urban areas or within one mile of the corporate
- 6 limits of a city shall ensure, in all phases of project
- 7 planning and development, the adequate accommodation, safety,
- 8 and convenience of all users of the road in accordance with
- 9 complete streets principles.
- 10 2. A complete streets policy shall delineate a clear
- 11 procedure by which an agency may exempt a highway project from
- 12 the requirements of a policy adopted under subsection 1 for any
- 13 of the following reasons:
- 14 a. The project is on a road where nonmotorized travel is
- 15 prohibited by law.
- 16 b. The cost to achieve compliance with complete streets
- 17 policy would be excessively disproportionate to the need for or
- 18 probable use of the particular road as a complete street.
- 19 c. The director or the governing body recognizes that due
- 20 to very low population density or remote location, there is
- 21 an absence of present or future need for the development of a
- 22 complete street.
- 23 d. The purposes of the agency's complete streets policy
- 24 are adequately met by a network of complete streets already in
- 25 place in proximity to the road on which the highway project
- 26 will take place, provided that the existing network includes a
- 27 route for all users of the road that reasonably substitutes for
- 28 the route followed by the exempt road.
- 29 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 306E.4 Research, technical guidance,
- 30 and implementation assistance.
- 31 1. The department shall conduct ongoing research regarding
- 32 complete streets to assist regional and metropolitan planning
- 33 commissions, counties, and cities to develop, adopt, and
- 34 implement complete streets policies. On or before October 1,
- 35 2012, the director shall prepare and make available to all

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- 1 regional and metropolitan planning commissions, counties, and
- 2 cities a report that describes the best practices by which
- 3 transportation agencies throughout the United States have
- 4 implemented complete streets principles. The director shall
- 5 update the report periodically as new, relevant information
- 6 becomes available, as determined by the department.
- 7 2. The department shall provide guidance to regional
- 8 or metropolitan planning commissions, counties, and cities
- 9 requesting assistance with the development or implementation
- 10 of a complete streets policy or the incorporation of complete
- 11 streets principles in community development and transportation
- 12 planning and highway projects.
- 13 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 306E.5 Complete streets fund.
- 14 A complete streets fund is created in the state treasury
- 15 under the control of the department. The fund shall consist of
- 16 any moneys appropriated by the general assembly and any other
- 17 moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the department
- 18 from the federal government or private sources for placement in
- 19 the fund. Section 8.33 does not apply to moneys in the fund.
- 20 Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or earnings on moneys
- 21 in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Moneys deposited
- 22 in the fund are appropriated to the department to be used to
- 23 facilitate complete streets projects on secondary roads and
- 24 municipal streets throughout the state.
- 25 EXPLANATION
- 26 This bill provides a mechanism for the implementation of
- 27 "complete streets" principles in highway projects undertaken
- 28 on Iowa roads.
- 29 The bill defines "complete street" as a roadway that
- 30 accommodates all users of the road including motorists, public
- 31 transit users, bicyclists, and pedestrians of all ages and
- 32 abilities.
- 33 The bill expresses the general assembly's intent that every
- 34 agency having jurisdiction over roads or involved in planning
- 35 for roads shall develop and adopt a complete streets policy

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- 1 on or before October 1, 2013. Affected agencies include
- 2 the department of transportation, regional and metropolitan
- 3 planning commissions, counties, and cities. The complete
- 4 streets policy for the state shall apply to all highway
- 5 projects on primary roads, and the policies of other agencies
- 6 shall focus on roads in urban areas or within one mile of the
- 7 corporate limits of a city. All complete streets policies
- 8 shall contain a procedure by which an agency may exempt a
- 9 highway project from the agency's complete streets policy for
- 10 specific reasons stated in the bill.
- 11 The department of transportation is directed to provide
- 12 guidance to local agencies and conduct ongoing research
- 13 regarding complete streets to assist agencies formulating
- 14 complete streets policies. The director of transportation
- 15 is required to issue by October 1, 2012, and periodically
- 16 update, a report describing best practices of transportation
- 17 agencies in other states that have implemented complete streets
- 18 principles.
- 19 The bill creates a complete streets fund for deposit of
- 20 any federal, state, or private moneys available for purposes
- 21 of complete streets. Moneys deposited in the fund are
- 22 appropriated to the department of transportation to be used to
- 23 facilitate complete streets projects on secondary roads and
- 24 municipal streets.
