HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 14 BY PEARSON

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution
of the State of Iowa prohibiting the courts of this state
from using international law when exercising judicial power.
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

TLSB 1412YH (4) 84 jm/rj Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is proposed:

3 Article V of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is amended 4 by adding the following new section:

5 Use of other laws. SEC. 20. The courts created under 6 the authority of this article, when exercising judicial 7 power, shall uphold and adhere to the law as provided in the 8 Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the 9 State of Iowa, the United States Code, federal regulations, 10 established common law, the Iowa Code, the Iowa administrative 11 code, and if necessary the law of another state of the United 12 States provided the law of the other state does not include 13 Sharia law. The courts shall not use the legal precepts of 14 other nations or cultures. Specifically, the courts shall not 15 consider international law or Sharia law. The provisions of 16 this section shall apply to all cases before the respective 17 courts including but not limited to cases of first impression. Sec. 2. REFERRAL AND PUBLICATION. The foregoing proposed 18 19 amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is referred 20 to the general assembly to be chosen at the next general 21 election for members of the general assembly and the secretary 22 of state is directed to cause it to be published for three 23 consecutive months before the date of the election as provided 24 by law.

EXPLANATION

This joint resolution proposes an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa to require the Iowa courts, when exercising judicial power, to uphold and adhere to the law as provided in the United States and Iowa constitutions, federal and Iowa law, common law, and the laws of other states provided the courts do not follow including Sharia law. The joint resolution prohibits the court from using the legal precepts of other nations or cultures, including international law and Sharia law.
