A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act concerning implementation of a statewide program
- 2 for electronic registration and titling of vehicles and
- 3 including effective date provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.20, subsection 2, Code 2011, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- Notwithstanding contrary provisions of this chapter or
- 4 chapter 326 regarding titling and registration by means other
- 5 than electronic means, the department may develop and implement
- 6 do all of the following:
- 7 a. Develop and implement a program for electronic funds
- 8 transfer for transactions involving vehicles subject to
- 9 registration.
- 10 b. Develop a program to allow for electronic applications,
- 11 titling, and registering, and electronic funds transfer for
- 12 vehicles subject to registration in order to improve the
- 13 efficiency and timeliness of the processes and to reduce costs
- 14 for all parties involved. The department may implement a pilot
- 15 project to evaluate the program developed under this paragraph.
- 16 c. On or after July 1, 2012, the department may implement
- 17 the program developed pursuant to paragraph b'' on a statewide
- 18 basis.
- 19 Sec. 2. 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1109, section 1, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 SEC. 1. ELECTRONIC VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND TITLING —
- 22 INTENT. It is the intent of the general assembly to establish
- 23 a uniform statewide system to allow electronic transactions
- 24 for the initial registration and titling of motor vehicles,
- 25 including electronic applications, electronic issuance of
- 26 titles, electronic registration, electronic transfer of funds,
- 27 electronic perfection of liens, and issuance of secure and
- 28 individually identifiable temporary registration cards, by
- 29 January 1, 2012.
- 30 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
- 31 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 Under current law, the department of transportation is
- 34 authorized to develop and implement a program to allow for
- 35 electronic applications, titling, registering, and electronic

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- 1 funds transfer for vehicles subject to registration. This
- 2 bill allows the department to move forward with the electronic
- 3 funds transfer element of the program, but temporarily limits
- 4 the implementation of electronic applications, titling, and
- 5 registration to a pilot project for purposes of evaluating the 6 program.
- 7 The bill authorizes the department to move forward with a
- 8 statewide program for electronic applications, titling, and
- 9 registration on or after July 1, 2012.
- 10 The bill amends language enacted in 2010 which expresses
- 11 the general assembly's intent to establish a uniform statewide
- 12 system for electronic registration and titling by January 1,
- 13 2012, by removing the specified date.
- 14 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
