A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to eliminating the requirement of an annual
- 2 permit to acquire a pistol or revolver and providing a
- 3 penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 724.11A, Code 2011, is amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 724.11A Recognition.
- 4 A valid permit or license issued by another state to any
- 5 nonresident of this state shall be considered to be a valid
- 6 permit or license to carry weapons issued pursuant to this
- 7 chapter, except that such permit or license shall not be
- 8 considered to be a substitute for an annual permit to acquire
- 9 pistols or revolvers issued pursuant to section 724.15.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 724.16, Code 2011, is amended to read as 11 follows:
- 12 724.16 Annual permit to acquire required Pistol or revolver
- 13 transfer prohibited.
- 14 1. Except as otherwise provided in section 724.15,
- 15 subsection 2, a person who acquires ownership of a pistol or
- 16 revolver without a valid annual permit to acquire pistols or
- 17 revolvers or a person who transfers ownership of a pistol
- 18 or revolver to a person who does not have in the person's
- 19 possession a valid annual permit to acquire pistols or
- 20 revolvers is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor.
- 21 2. A person who transfers ownership of a pistol or revolver
- 22 to a person that the transferor knows is prohibited by
- 23 section 724.15 724.26 from acquiring ownership of possessing,
- 24 receiving, or transporting a pistol or revolver commits a class
- 25 "D" felony.
- Sec. 3. Section 724.21A, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 27 follows:
- 28 724.21A Denial, suspension, or revocation of permit to carry
- 29 weapons or permit to acquire pistols or revolvers.
- 30 l. In any case where the sheriff or the commissioner of
- 31 public safety denies an application for or suspends or revokes
- 32 a permit to carry weapons, or an annual permit to acquire
- 33 pistols or revolvers, the sheriff or commissioner shall provide
- 34 a written statement of the reasons for the denial, suspension,
- 35 or revocation and the applicant or permit holder shall have the

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1 right to appeal the denial, suspension, or revocation to an

- 2 administrative law judge in the department of inspections and
- 3 appeals within thirty days of receiving written notice of the
- 4 denial, suspension, or revocation.
- 5 2. The applicant or permit holder may file an appeal with
- 6 an administrative law judge by filing a copy of the denial,
- 7 suspension, or revocation notice with a written statement that
- 8 clearly states the applicant's reasons rebutting the denial,
- 9 suspension, or revocation along with a fee of ten dollars.
- 10 Additional supporting information relevant to the proceedings
- 11 may also be included.
- 12 3. The administrative law judge shall, within forty-five
- 13 days of receipt of the request for an appeal, set a hearing
- 14 date. The hearing may be held by telephone or video conference
- 15 at the discretion of the administrative law judge. The
- 16 administrative law judge shall receive witness testimony and
- 17 other evidence relevant to the proceedings at the hearing. The
- 18 hearing shall be conducted pursuant to chapter 17A.
- 19 4. Upon conclusion of the hearing, the administrative law
- 20 judge shall order that the denial, suspension, or revocation
- 21 of the permit be either rescinded or sustained. An applicant,
- 22 permit holder, or issuing officer aggrieved by the final
- 23 judgment of the administrative law judge shall have the right
- 24 to judicial review in accordance with the terms of the Iowa
- 25 administrative procedure Act, chapter 17A.
- 26 5. The standard of review under this section shall be
- 27 clear and convincing evidence that the issuing officer's
- 28 written statement of the reasons for the denial, suspension, or
- 29 revocation constituted probable cause to deny an application or
- 30 to suspend or revoke a permit.
- 31 6. The department of inspections and appeals shall adopt
- 32 rules pursuant to chapter 17A as necessary to carry out the
- 33 provisions of this section.
- 34 7. In any case where the issuing officer denies an
- 35 application for, or suspends or revokes a permit to carry

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- 1 weapons, or an annual permit to acquire pistols or revolvers
- 2 solely because of an adverse determination by the national
- 3 instant criminal background check system, the applicant or
- 4 permit holder shall not seek relief under this section but
- 5 may pursue relief of the national instant criminal background
- 6 check system determination pursuant to Pub. L. No. 103-159,
- 7 sections 103(f) and (g) and 104 and 28 C.F.R. § 25.10, or other
- 8 applicable law. The outcome of such proceedings shall be
- 9 binding on the issuing officer.
- 10 Sec. 4. Section 724.27, subsection 1, unnumbered paragraph
- 11 1, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 The provisions of section sections 724.8, section 724.15,
- 13 subsection 1, and section 724.26 shall not apply to a person
- 14 who is eligible to have the person's civil rights regarding
- 15 firearms restored under section 914.7 if any of the following
- 16 occur:
- 17 Sec. 5. REPEAL. Sections 724.15, 724.17, 724.18, 724.19,
- 18 724.20, and 724.21, Code 2011, are repealed.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- 20 This bill eliminates the requirement, pursuant to Code
- 21 section 724.15, that a person who acquires ownership of a
- 22 pistol or revolver must apply for and be issued an annual
- 23 permit to acquire a pistol or revolver unless certain
- 24 exceptions apply.
- 25 The bill amends Code section 724.16 relating to penalties
- 26 for acquiring or transferring ownership of a pistol or revolver
- 27 without a valid permit and provides that a person who transfers
- 28 ownership of a pistol or revolver to a person the transferor
- 29 knows is prohibited from possessing, receiving, or transporting
- 30 a pistol or revolver under Code section 724.26 is guilty of a
- 31 class "D" felony punishable by confinement for no more than
- 32 five years and a fine of between \$750 and \$7,500.
- 33 The bill repeals related Code sections relating to
- 34 permit-to-acquire applications (Code sections 724.17 and
- 35 724.18) and issuance requirements and procedures (Code sections

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- 1 724.19, 724.20, and 724.21). The bill makes conforming changes
- 2 to Code sections 724.11A (recognition of out-of-state permits),
- 3 724.21A (provisions relating to the denial, suspension, or
- 4 revocation of permits to acquire), and 724.27 (restoration of
- 5 citizenship rights to a person convicted of a felony).
- 6 Current law provides that a person who acquires ownership of
- 7 a pistol or revolver without a valid annual permit to acquire
- 8 pistols or revolvers or a person who transfers ownership of
- 9 a pistol or revolver to a person who does not have in the
- 10 person's possession a valid annual permit to acquire pistols
- ll or revolvers is guilty of an aggravated misdemeanor, and a
- 12 person who transfers ownership of a pistol or revolver to a
- 13 person that the transferor knows is prohibited from acquiring
- 14 ownership of a pistol or revolver commits a class "D" felony.
- 15 In addition, current law provides that a person who gives a
- 16 false name or presents false identification, or otherwise
- 17 knowingly gives false material information to one from whom the
- 18 person seeks to acquire a pistol or revolver commits a class
- 19 "D" felony.
