- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 142C.8, subsection 10, Code 2011, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 10. The physician or advanced registered nurse practitioner
- 4 who attends the decedent at death and the physician or advanced
- 5 registered nurse practitioner who determines the time of
- 6 death shall not participate in the procedures for removing or
- 7 transplanting a part from the decedent.
- 8 Sec. 2. Section 144.26, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 l. A death certificate for each death which occurs in this
- ll state shall be filed as directed by the state registrar within
- 12 three days after the death and prior to final disposition,
- 13 and shall be registered by the county registrar if it has
- 14 been completed and filed in accordance with this chapter. A
- 15 death certificate shall include the social security number, if
- 16 provided, of the deceased person. All information including
- 17 the certifying physician's or advanced registered nurse
- 18 practitioner's name shall be typewritten.
- 19 Sec. 3. Section 144.28, subsection 1, paragraphs b and e,
- 20 Code 2011, are amended to read as follows:
- 21 b. Unless there is a nonnatural cause of death, the medical
- 22 certification shall be completed and signed by the physician
- 23 or advanced registered nurse practitioner in charge of the
- 24 patient's care for the illness or condition which resulted
- 25 in death within seventy-two hours after receipt of the death
- 26 certificate from the funeral director or individual who
- 27 initially assumes custody of the body.
- 28 e. If upon inquiry into a death, the county or state medical
- 29 examiner determines that a preexisting natural disease or
- 30 condition was the likely cause of death and that the death does
- 31 not affect the public interest as described in section 331.802,
- 32 subsection 3, the medical examiner may elect to defer to the
- 33 physician or advanced registered nurse practitioner in charge
- 34 of the patient's preexisting condition the certification of the
- 35 cause of death.

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- 1 Sec. 4. Section 144.30, Code 2011, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 144.30 Funeral director's duty fetal death certificate.
- 4 The funeral director who first assumes custody of a fetus
- 5 shall file the fetal death certificate. In the absence
- 6 of such a person, the physician, advanced registered nurse
- 7 practitioner, or other person in attendance at or after the
- 8 delivery shall file the certificate of fetal death. The person
- 9 filing the certificate shall obtain the personal data from the
- 10 next of kin or the best qualified person or source available
- 11 and shall obtain the medical certification of cause of death
- 12 from the person responsible for completing the certification.
- 13 When a person other than a funeral director assumes custody of
- 14 a fetus, the person shall be responsible for carrying out the
- 15 provisions of this section.
- 16 Sec. 5. Section 144.31, Code 2011, is amended to read as 17 follows:
- 18 144.31 Medical certification fetal death.
- 19 1. The medical certification for a fetal death shall be
- 20 completed within seventy-two hours after delivery by the
- 21 physician or advanced registered nurse practitioner in
- 22 attendance at or after delivery except when inquiry is required
- 23 by the county medical examiner.
- 24 2. When a fetal death occurs without medical attendance
- 25 upon the mother at or after delivery or when inquiry is
- 26 required by the county medical examiner, the medical examiner
- 27 shall investigate the cause of fetal death and shall complete
- 28 the medical certification within seventy-two hours after
- 29 taking charge of the case. The person completing the medical
- 30 certification of cause of fetal death shall attest to its
- 31 accuracy either by signature or as authorized by rule.
- 32 EXPLANATION
- 33 This bill allows an advanced registered nurse practitioner
- 34 to sign a death certificate, unless there is a nonnatural cause
- 35 of death.
