## House Study Bill 37 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the authorized possession of certain
- 2 offensive weapons.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 724.1, subsections 1, 2, and 8, Code
2 2011, are amended to read as follows:

1. A machine gun. A machine gun is a firearm which shoots 4 or is designed to shoot more than one shot <u>automatically</u>, 5 without manual reloading, by a single function of the trigger. 6 2. A short-barreled rifle or short-barreled shotgun. A 7 short-barreled rifle or short-barreled shotgun is a rifle with 8 a barrel or barrels less than sixteen inches in length or a 9 shotgun with a barrel or barrels less than eighteen inches 10 in length, as measured from the face of the closed bolt or 11 standing breech to the muzzle, or any <u>weapon made from a</u> rifle 12 or shotgun with <u>if such weapon as modified has</u> an overall 13 length less than twenty-six inches.

14 8. Any mechanical device specifically constructed and 15 designed so that when attached to a firearm silences, muffles, 16 or suppresses the sound when fired. However, this subsection 17 does not apply to a mechanical device possessed and used by 18 a person solely for the purpose of shooting a deer pursuant 19 to an approved city special deer population control plan if 20 the person has a valid federal permit to possess and use the 21 mechanical device.

22 Sec. 2. Section 724.2, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2011, 23 is amended to read as follows:

Any of the <u>The</u> following is <u>persons are</u> authorized to possess an offensive weapon <del>when</del> <u>in</u> the <u>performance of the</u> person's <u>official</u> duties <del>or lawful activities require or permit such</del> <del>possession</del> <u>as prescribed by the person's employing agency</u>: <u>Sec. 3.</u> Section 724.2, subsections 8 and 9, Code 2011, are amended to read as follows:

30 8. A resident of this state who possesses an offensive 31 weapon which is a curio or relic firearm under the federal 32 Firearms <u>Gun Control</u> Act <u>of 1968</u>, 18 U.S.C. ch. 44 <u>or the</u> 33 <u>federal National Firearms Act of 1934, 26 U.S.C. ch. 53</u>, <del>solely</del> 34 for use in the official functions of a historical reenactment 35 <del>organization of which the person is a member,</del> if the offensive

 live ammunition. The offensive weapon may, however, be adapted
 for the firing of blank ammunition.

9. A nonresident who possesses an offensive weapon which
5 is a curio or relic firearm under the federal Firearms Gun
6 Control Act of 1968, 18 U.S.C. ch. 44 or the federal National
7 Firearms Act of 1934, 26 U.S.C. ch. 53, solely for use in
8 official functions in this state of a historical reenactment
9 organization of which the person is a member, if the offensive
10 weapon is legally possessed by the person in the person's state
11 of residence and the offensive weapon is at all times while
12 in this state rendered incapable of firing live ammunition.
13 A nonresident who possesses an offensive weapon under this
14 subsection while in this state shall not have in the person's
15 possession live ammunition. The offensive weapon may, however,
16 be adapted for the firing of blank ammunition.

17 Sec. 4. Section 724.2, Code 2011, is amended by adding the 18 following new subsection:

19 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 10. A person who possesses a device 20 described in section 724.1, subsection 8, or a machine gun, 21 short-barreled rifle, or short-barreled shotgun as defined in 22 section 724.1, in compliance with the federal Gun Control Act 23 of 1968, 18 U.S.C. ch. 44 or the federal National Firearms Act 24 of 1934, 26 U.S.C. ch. 53.

25 Sec. 5. Section 724.3, Code 2011, is amended to read as 26 follows:

27 724.3 Unauthorized possession of offensive weapons.

31

Any person, other than a person authorized herein in section 29 <u>724.2</u>, who knowingly possesses an offensive weapon commits a 30 class "D" felony.

EXPLANATION

32 This bill relates to the authorized possession of offensive 33 weapons.

The bill modifies the definition of a machine gun, a short-barreled rifle, a short-barreled shotgun, and a

1 mechanical device that silences, muffles, or suppresses the 2 sound of a firearm when fired, defined as offensive weapons 3 under Code section 724.1. A person who is not authorized under 4 Code section 724.3 to possess an offensive weapon is guilty of 5 a class "D" felony.

6 The bill amends provisions in Code section 724.2 authorizing 7 the possession of certain offensive weapons in certain 8 circumstances, including an offensive weapon that is a curio 9 or relic firearm, a machine gun, a short-barreled rifle, a 10 short-barreled shotgun, and a mechanical device that silences, 11 muffles, or suppresses the sound of a firearm when fired, as 12 amended in the bill, in compliance with the provisions of 13 the federal Gun Control Act of 1968 and the federal National 14 Firearms Act of 1934.
