## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to direct care professionals including the
- 2 establishment of a board of direct care professionals,
- 3 providing for implementation, making penalties applicable,
- 4 and including effective date provisions.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 152F.1 Definitions.
- 2 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 3 requires:
- 4 1. "Board" means the board of direct care professionals
- 5 created under chapter 147.
- 6 2. "Community living professional" means a direct care
- 7 associate who has completed advanced training and is certified
- 8 to provide home and community living, instrumental activities
- 9 of daily living, and personal support services.
- 10 3. "Direct care associate" means a direct care provider who
- 11 has completed core training and is certified to provide direct
- 12 care services in the state.
- 13 4. "Direct care instructor" means an individual approved
- 14 by the board to provide direct care instruction to direct care
- 15 providers and direct care professionals.
- 16 5. "Direct care professional" means a direct care associate,
- 17 a community living professional, a health support professional,
- 18 a personal support professional, or a direct care associate who
- 19 has received a specialty endorsement.
- 20 6. "Direct care provider" means an individual who provides
- 21 direct care services for compensation.
- 22 7. "Direct care services" means services provided to
- 23 individuals who are ill or individuals with disabilities,
- 24 including but not limited to home and community living
- 25 services, instrumental activities of daily living services,
- 26 personal activities of daily living services, personal support
- 27 services, and health monitoring and maintenance services.
- 28 8. "Direct care trainer" means a direct care instructor who
- 29 is approved by the board to train instructors.
- 9. "Health monitoring and maintenance services" means
- 31 medically-oriented services that assist an individual in
- 32 maintaining the individual's health including measuring intake
- 33 and output; providing catheter and ostomy care; collecting
- 34 specimens; checking vital signs, including temperature, pulse,
- 35 respiration, and blood pressure; measuring height and weight;

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1 performing range of motion exercises; providing assistance with

2 urinary care; and application of thrombo embolic deterrent hose

- 3 or hot and cold packs.
- 4 10. "Health support professional" means a direct care
- 5 associate who has completed advanced training and is certified
- 6 to provide personal activities of daily living and health
- 7 monitoring and maintenance services.
- 8 11. "Home and community living services" means services to
- 9 enhance or maintain independence of individuals including such
- 10 activities as helping individuals develop and meet personal
- 11 goals, providing direct physical and emotional support and
- 12 assistance for persons with disabilities, utilizing crisis
- 13 intervention and positive behavior supports, and using and
- 14 following individual support plans.
- 15 12. "Instrumental activities of daily living services" means
- 16 services provided to assist individuals with daily living tasks
- 17 to allow them to function independently in a home or community
- 18 setting, including but not limited to assistance with managing
- 19 money, transportation, light housekeeping, and shopping and
- 20 cooking.
- 21 13. "Personal activities of daily living services" means
- 22 services to assist individuals in meeting basic needs,
- 23 including but not limited to bathing, back rubs, and skin care;
- 24 grooming activities; assistance with dressing and undressing;
- 25 assistance with eating and feeding; assistance with toileting;
- 26 and assistance with mobility, including transfers, walking, and
- 27 turning in bed.
- 28 14. "Personal support professional" means a direct care
- 29 associate who has completed advanced training and is certified
- 30 to provide instrumental activities of daily living, personal
- 31 activities of daily living, and personal support services.
- 32 15. "Personal support services" means support services
- 33 provided to an individual as the individual performs personal
- 34 activities of daily living including but not limited to
- 35 coaching and prompting, and teaching skills and behaviors.

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- 1 16. "Specialty endorsement" means an advanced level of
- 2 certification based on requirements developed by experts in a
- 3 particular discipline or professional area and approved by the 4 board.
- 5 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **152F.2** Certification required 6 exceptions use of title.
- 7 l. Unless otherwise exempt under section 152F.4, beginning
- 8 January 1, 2014, a direct care provider shall not provide
- 9 direct care services in this state without being certified as a
- 10 direct care associate.
- 11 2. A direct care provider who is not certified pursuant
- 12 to this chapter shall not use words or titles which imply
- 13 or represent that the person is certified as a direct care
- 14 professional under this chapter.
- 15 3. A direct care associate shall not act as or represent
- 16 that the person is a direct care professional with advanced
- 17 training certification or a specialty endorsement, unless the
- 18 direct care associate is first certified at the appropriate
- 19 level of certification under this chapter.
- 20 4. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a person
- 21 who completes advanced training or meets the requirements for
- 22 a specialty endorsement is not required to be certified at
- 23 that level if the person does not act as or represent that the
- 24 person is certified at that level. Section 147.83 does not
- 25 apply to a direct care associate who is not certified as a
- 26 direct care professional with advanced training certification
- 27 or a specialty endorsement if the direct care associate does
- 28 not act as or represent that the person is certified at that
- 29 level.
- 30 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 152F.3 Requirements to obtain
- 31 certification renewal continuing education reciprocity.
- 1. An applicant for certification as a direct care associate
- 33 shall present evidence satisfactory to the board that the
- 34 applicant meets all of the following requirements:
- 35 a. The applicant has successfully completed the required

- 1 education for the certification from a board-approved direct
- 2 care instructor or direct care trainer.
- 3 b. The applicant has paid all fees required by the board.
- 4 c. The applicant certifies that the applicant will conduct
- 5 all professional activities in accordance with standards for
- 6 professional conduct established by the board.
- 7 2. An applicant for certification as a direct care
- 8 professional with advanced training or a specialty endorsement
- 9 shall present evidence satisfactory to the board that the
- 10 applicant meets all of the following requirements:
- 11 a. The applicant has successfully completed the required
- 12 education for the certification from a board-approved direct
- 13 care instructor or direct care trainer.
- 14 b. The applicant has paid all fees required by the board.
- 15 c. The applicant has passed a state examination approved by
- 16 the board.
- 17 d. The applicant certifies that the applicant will conduct
- 18 all professional activities in accordance with standards for
- 19 professional conduct established by the board.
- 3. A person shall renew the person's certification
- 21 biennially. Prior to such renewal, the person shall present
- 22 evidence that the person has satisfied continuing education
- 23 requirements and shall pay a renewal fee as determined by the
- 24 board.
- 25 4. The board shall issue the appropriate certification to an
- 26 applicant who demonstrates experience in direct care services
- 27 in another state and meets the requirements established by the
- 28 board for the specific certification.
- 29 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 152F.4 Scope of chapter.
- 30 The provisions of this chapter do not apply to any of the
- 31 following:
- 32 l. A person who is providing direct care services to a
- 33 family member with or without compensation or through the
- 34 medical assistance consumer choice option program.
- 35 2. A person otherwise licensed who is operating within the

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- 1 scope of that license and does not represent to the public that
- 2 the person is a direct care professional.
- 3 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 152F.5 Duties of the board.
- 4 The board shall do all of the following:
- 5 l. Adopt rules consistent with this chapter, chapter 147,
- 6 and chapter 272C which are necessary for the performance of its 7 duties.
- 8 2. Adopt rules to provide a transition process that allows
- 9 direct care providers providing direct care services on or
- 10 before July 1, 2014, to continue providing direct care services
- 11 while completing certification under this chapter. A direct
- 12 care provider subject to the transition process shall complete
- 13 the requirements for direct care associate certification no
- 14 later than June 30, 2015.
- 15 3. Establish standards and guidelines for certification
- 16 reciprocity.
- 17 4. Establish standards and guidelines for direct care
- 18 associates, including minimum curriculum requirements.
- 19 5. Prepare and conduct, or prescribe, an examination for
- 20 applicants for certification.
- 21 6. Establish standards and quidelines for direct care
- 22 instructors and direct care trainers, including minimum
- 23 curriculum requirements and continuing education requirements.
- 7. Define educational activities which fulfill continuing
- 25 education requirements for renewal of certification.
- 26 8. Establish guidelines for inactive certification status
- 27 and inactive certification reentry.
- 28 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 152F.6 Certification suspension and
- 29 revocation.
- 30 A certification issued by the board under this chapter may be
- 31 suspended or revoked, or renewal of certification may be denied
- 32 by the board, for violation of any provision of this chapter,
- 33 section 147.55 or 272C.10, or rules adopted by the board.
- 34 Sec. 7. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 2011, are
- 35 amended to read as follows:

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- 1 3. "Licensed" or "certified", when applied to a physician
- 2 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopathic physician and
- 3 surgeon, physician assistant, psychologist, chiropractor,
- 4 nurse, dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant,
- 5 optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist, pharmacist,
- 6 physical therapist, physical therapist assistant, occupational
- 7 therapist, occupational therapy assistant, respiratory care
- 8 practitioner, practitioner of cosmetology arts and sciences,
- 9 practitioner of barbering, funeral director, dietitian, marital
- 10 and family therapist, mental health counselor, social worker,
- 11 massage therapist, athletic trainer, acupuncturist, nursing
- 12 home administrator, hearing aid dispenser, or sign language
- 13 interpreter or transliterator, or direct care professional
- 14 means a person licensed under this subtitle.
- 6. "Profession" means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
- 16 osteopathic medicine and surgery, practice as a physician
- 17 assistant, psychology, chiropractic, nursing, dentistry,
- 18 dental hygiene, dental assisting, optometry, speech pathology,
- 19 audiology, pharmacy, physical therapy, physical therapist
- 20 assisting, occupational therapy, occupational therapy
- 21 assisting, respiratory care, cosmetology arts and sciences,
- 22 barbering, mortuary science, marital and family therapy, mental
- 23 health counseling, social work, dietetics, massage therapy,
- 24 athletic training, acupuncture, nursing home administration,
- 25 hearing aid dispensing, or sign language interpreting or
- 26 transliterating, or practice as a direct care professional.
- 27 Sec. 8. Section 147.2, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 28 to read as follows:
- 29 1. A person shall not engage in the practice of medicine
- 30 and surgery, podiatry, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 31 psychology, chiropractic, physical therapy, physical therapist
- 32 assisting, nursing, dentistry, dental hygiene, dental
- 33 assisting, optometry, speech pathology, audiology, occupational
- 34 therapy, occupational therapy assisting, respiratory care,
- 35 pharmacy, cosmetology arts and sciences, barbering, social

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- 1 work, dietetics, marital and family therapy or mental health
- 2 counseling, massage therapy, mortuary science, athletic
- 3 training, acupuncture, nursing home administration, hearing aid
- 4 dispensing, or sign language interpreting or transliterating,
- 5 or shall not practice as a physician assistant or as a direct
- 6 care professional, unless the person has obtained a license for
- 7 that purpose from the board for the profession.
- 8 Sec. 9. Section 147.13, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 9 following new subsection:
- 10 NEW SUBSECTION. 24. For direct care professionals, the
- 11 board of direct care professionals.
- 12 Sec. 10. Section 147.14, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 13 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 14 NEW PARAGRAPH. x. For the board of direct care
- 15 professionals, a total of nine members, five of whom are
- 16 direct care professionals who represent diverse settings and
- 17 populations served, two members of the public, one registered
- 18 nurse who serves as a direct care instructor, and one human
- 19 services professional who serves as a direct care instructor.
- Sec. 11. Section 147.74, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 21 following new subsection:
- 22 NEW SUBSECTION. 24. A direct care professional certified
- 23 under chapter 152F and this chapter may use the following:
- 24 a. A direct care professional certified as a direct care
- 25 associate may use the title "direct care associate" or D.C.A.
- 26 after the person's name.
- 27 b. A direct care professional certified as a community
- 28 living professional may use the title "community living
- 29 professional" or the letters C.L.P. after the person's name.
- 30 c. A direct care professional certified as a personal
- 31 support professional may use the title "personal support
- 32 professional" or the letters P.S.P. after the person's name.
- 33 d. A direct care professional certified as a health support
- 34 professional may use the title "health support professional" or
- 35 the letters H.S.P. after the person's name.

- 1 e. A direct care professional certified with a specialty
- 2 endorsement may use the title or letters determined by the
- 3 specialty endorsement entity and approved by the board of
- 4 direct care professionals.
- 5 Sec. 12. Section 272C.1, subsection 6, Code 2011, is amended
- 6 by adding the following new paragraph:
- 7 NEW PARAGRAPH. ag. The board of direct care professionals,
- 8 created pursuant to chapter 147.
- 9 Sec. 13. TRANSITION PROVISIONS.
- 10 l. A direct care provider providing direct care services
- 11 on or before January 1, 2014, may continue providing direct
- 12 care services while completing certification as required under
- 13 this Act. The board of direct care professionals shall adopt
- 14 rules to provide a transition process that allows such direct
- 15 care providers to complete the requirements for direct care
- 16 associate certification no later than June 30, 2015.
- 2. Notwithstanding sections 147.14 and 147.16, for the
- 18 initial board of direct care professionals, the governor may
- 19 appoint, subject to confirmation by the senate, in lieu of the
- 20 five members required to be direct care associates and the two
- 21 members required to be direct care instructors, members with
- 22 experience and expertise that is substantially equivalent to
- 23 the professional requirements for a direct care associate or
- 24 direct care instructor, as applicable.
- 25 Sec. 14. IMPLEMENTATION. The provisions of this Act shall
- 26 be implemented as follows:
- 27 l. The sections of this Act relating to the board of direct
- 28 care professionals including sections 152F.1 and 152F.5, as
- 29 enacted in this Act; sections 147.13, 147.14, and 272C.1,
- 30 as amended in this Act, and as specified in the transition
- 31 provisions; and the section of this Act providing transition
- 32 provisions relating to the board shall be implemented so that a
- 33 board of direct care professionals is appointed no later than
- 34 December 15, 2012.
- 35 2. The sections of this Act relating to requirements for

- 1 certification of direct care professionals including sections
- 2 152F.2, 152F.3, 152F.4, and 152F.6, as enacted in this Act;
- 3 and sections 147.1, 147.2, and 147.74, as amended in this Act,
- 4 shall be implemented so that the requirements are applicable
- 5 beginning no later than January 1, 2014.
- 6 Sec. 15. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed
- 7 of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 8 EXPLANATION
- 9 This bill provides for the certification of direct care
- 10 professionals under new Code chapter 152F. The bill provides
- 11 definitions relating to levels of certification and services
- 12 provided, and defines the "board" as the board of direct care
- 13 professionals.
- 14 The bill requires individuals who provide direct care
- 15 services for compensation (direct care providers) to be
- 16 certified as direct care associates.
- 17 The bill also provides for advanced training and specialty
- 18 endorsements as the bases for higher levels of certification.
- 19 The bill provides requirements for certification, renewal
- 20 of certification, continuing education, and reciprocity
- 21 of certification. The bill provides for exemptions
- 22 from certification and for suspension or revocation of
- 23 certification. The bill specifies the duties of the board of
- 24 direct care professionals.
- 25 The bill makes conforming changes in the Code under
- 26 Code chapter 147 (general provisions for health-related
- 27 professions), and Code chapter 272C (regulation of licensed
- 28 professions and occupations).
- 29 The bill provides transition provisions for the initial
- 30 appointment of the board and for application of requirements
- 31 to direct care providers providing direct care services prior
- 32 to implementation of direct care professional requirements on
- 33 January 1, 2014. The bill takes effect upon enactment, but
- 34 provides for phased-in implementation.
- 35 The provisions of Code chapters 147 and 272C, including

- 1 a provision in Code section 147.86 that a violation of Code
- 2 chapter 147 or 152F is a serious misdemeanor, are applicable to
- 3 new Code chapter 152F.
