A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the use of automated traffic enforcement
- 2 systems.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 321.1, Code 2011, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:
- NEW SUBSECTION. 95. "Automated traffic enforcement system"
- 4 means a device with one or more sensors working in conjunction
- 5 with at least one of the following:
- 6 a. An official traffic-control signal, to produce recorded
- 7 images of motor vehicles entering an intersection against a
- 8 flashing red or steady circular red light.
- 9 b. An official traffic-control signal at a railroad grade
- 10 crossing, as described in section 321.342, to produce recorded
- 11 images of vehicles violating a flashing red or steady circular
- 12 red light.
- 13 c. A speed measuring device, to produce recorded images of
- 14 motor vehicles travelling at a prohibited rate of speed.
- 15 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 321.5A Automated traffic enforcement
- 16 systems.
- 17 The state or a local authority shall not use an automated
- 18 traffic enforcement system except as provided in this section.
- 19 1. A local authority may by ordinance authorize the use of
- 20 automated traffic enforcement systems to detect violations of
- 21 posted speed limits or official traffic-control signals which
- 22 constitute municipal or county infractions.
- 23 2. A local authority using one or more automated traffic
- 24 enforcement systems shall erect a sign providing notice of the
- 25 use of automated traffic enforcement at that point on every
- 26 highway that intersects the jurisdictional limits of the local
- 27 authority. A sign shall also be posted by the local authority
- 28 on each road on the approach to the next speed limit zone or
- 29 official traffic-control signal on that road where an automated
- 30 traffic enforcement system is in use.
- 31 3. Recorded images produced by an automated traffic
- 32 enforcement system evidencing a violation of a posted speed
- 33 limit or an official traffic-control signal shall be verified
- 34 by a peace officer of the law enforcement agency and certified
- 35 by the chief officer of the law enforcement agency or the

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- 1 chief officer's designee. A citation or simple notice of
- 2 a fine mailed or delivered to the registered owner of the
- 3 vehicle involved in the violation shall be accompanied by such
- 4 certification.
- 5 4. A local authority shall not establish a penalty in excess
- 6 of fifty dollars for a violation detected by an automated
- 7 traffic enforcement system.
- 8 Sec. 3. EXISTING AUTOMATED TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT SYSTEMS -
- 9 VALIDITY OF PRIOR NOTICES AND CITATIONS. Notices mailed or
- 10 citations issued of violations committed prior to the effective
- 11 date of this Act, pursuant to a local ordinance authorizing the
- 12 use of an automated traffic enforcement system, shall not be
- 13 invalidated by the enactment of this Act and shall be processed
- 14 according to the provisions of the law under which they were
- 15 authorized.
- 16 EXPLANATION
- 17 This bill authorizes and restricts the use of automated
- 18 traffic enforcement (ATE) systems by state and local highway
- 19 authorities.
- 20 The bill defines "automated traffic enforcement system" as
- 21 a device with one or more sensors working in conjunction with
- 22 at least one of the following: an official traffic-control
- 23 signal at an intersection, an official traffic-control signal
- 24 at a railroad grade crossing, or a speed measuring device. An
- 25 ATE system records images of vehicles violating an associated
- 26 traffic-control signal or a speed limit. The definition
- 27 includes within its scope devices known as "red light cameras"
- 28 and "speed cameras".
- 29 The bill authorizes the use of ATE systems in conjunction
- 30 with official traffic-control signals or for the enforcement
- 31 of speed limits pursuant to municipal or county ordinance. A
- 32 local authority using one or more ATE systems is required to
- 33 provide notice of the use of ATE by posting signs on highways
- 34 intersecting the jurisdictional limits of the local authority.
- 35 In addition, signs must be posted on each road on the approach

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- 1 to the next speed limit zone or traffic-control signal on that
- 2 road where an ATE system is in use.
- 3 Before a notice of a fine or a citation is mailed or
- 4 delivered to the owner of a motor vehicle, the recorded
- 5 image evidencing the violation must be verified by a peace
- 6 officer of the law enforcement agency and certified by the
- 7 chief law enforcement officer or the officer's designee. The
- 8 bill provides that a fine imposed by a local authority for a
- 9 violation detected by an ATE system shall not exceed \$50.
- 10 The bill provides that notices mailed or citations issued of
- 11 violations committed prior to the effective date of the bill,
- 12 pursuant to a local ordinance, are not invalidated by the bill
- 13 and remain enforceable.
