SENATE FILE 110 BY HATCH

## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act prohibiting specified alcoholic beverage licensees or
- 2 permit holders from knowingly permitting or engaging in any
- 3 criminal activity on the premises covered by the license or
- 4 permit, and making penalties applicable.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 123.49, subsection 2, paragraph j, Code 2 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- j. Knowingly permit or engage in any criminal activity
- 4 on the premises covered by the license or permit. However,
- 5 the absence of security personnel on the licensed premises
- 6 is insufficient, without additional evidence, to prove that
- 7 criminal activity occurring on the licensed premises was
- 8 knowingly permitted in violation of this paragraph "j".
- 9 (1) For purposes of this paragraph "j", "premises" includes
- 10 parking lots and areas adjacent to the premises of a liquor
- 11 licensee or permittee authorized to sell alcoholic beverages
- 12 for consumption on the licensed premises and used by patrons of
- 13 the liquor licensee or permittee.
- 14 (2) For purposes of this paragraph "j", "premises" also
- 15 includes parking lots and areas adjacent to the premises of
- 16 a convenience store holding a liquor license or permit and
- 17 authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption off
- 18 the licensed premises and used by patrons of the licensee or
- 19 permittee. For purposes of this subparagraph, "convenience
- 20 store" means a retail store occupying less than three thousand
- 21 five hundred square feet of floor space and providing some
- 22 combination of groceries, general merchandise, alcoholic
- 23 beverages, auto supplies, and prepared foods.
- 24 EXPLANATION
- 25 This bill relates to the prohibition against a liquor
- 26 licensee or beer and wine permittee under Code chapter 123
- 27 knowingly permitting or engaging in any criminal activity on
- 28 the premises covered by the license or permit.
- 29 Currently, for purposes of the prohibition, "premises"
- 30 are defined to include parking lots and areas adjacent to
- 31 the premises of licensees or permittees authorized to sell
- 32 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises
- 33 and used by patrons of the liquor licensee or permittee. The
- 34 bill extends the prohibition to parking lots and areas adjacent
- 35 to the premises of a convenience store holding a liquor

- 1 license or permit and authorized to sell alcoholic beverages
- 2 for consumption off the licensed premises. The bill defines
- 3 a "convenience store" as a retail store occupying less than
- 4 3,500 square feet of floor space and providing some combination
- 5 of groceries, general merchandise, alcoholic beverages, auto
- 6 supplies, and prepared foods.
- 7 A violation of the bill's provisions constitutes a simple
- 8 misdemeanor punishable by confinement for no more than 30 days
- 9 or a fine of at least \$65 but not more than \$625 or by both.
- 10 In addition, a violation is grounds for the suspension or
- 11 revocation of a license or permit by the alcoholic beverages
- 12 division or a local authority.
