SENATE FILE 139 BY HAMERLINCK

(COMPANION TO HF 6 BY COWNIE)

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act requiring the development of a searchable budget
- 2 database and internet site for the public to access the
- 3 details of the expenditure of state tax revenues and a
- 4 searchable tax rate database and internet site for the
- 5 public to access the details of each tax rate for all taxing
- 6 districts in the state.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 8.6, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 2 following new subsection:
- 3 NEW SUBSECTION. 9A. Budget and tax rate databases. To
- 4 develop and make available to the public a searchable budget
- 5 database and internet site as required under chapter 8G,
- 6 division I, and to develop and make available to the public
- 7 a searchable tax rate database and internet site as required
- 8 under chapter 8G, division II.
- 9 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 8G.1 Intent findings.
- 10 The general assembly finds that taxpayers should be able to
- 11 easily access the details on how the state is spending their
- 12 tax dollars and the performance results achieved for those
- 13 expenditures. Therefore, it is the intent of the general
- 14 assembly to direct the department of management to create
- 15 and maintain a searchable budget database and internet site
- 16 detailing where tax dollars are expended, the purposes for
- 17 which tax dollars are expended, and the results achieved for
- 18 all taxpayer investments in state government.
- 19 Sec. 3. NEW SECTION. 8G.2 Short title.
- 20 This subchapter shall be known as and may be cited as the
- 21 "Taxpayer Transparency Act".
- 22 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 8G.3 Definitions.
- 23 As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise
- 24 requires:
- 25 1. "Agency" means a state department, office, board,
- 26 commission, bureau, division, institution, or public
- 27 institution of higher education. "Agency" includes individual
- 28 state agencies and programs, as well as those programs and
- 29 activities that are administered by or involve more than one
- 30 agency. "Agency" includes all elective offices in the executive
- 31 branch of government and the general assembly.
- 32 2. "Director" means the director of the department of
- 33 management.
- 34 3. "Entity" or "recipients" means any of the following:
- 35 a. A corporation.

- 1 b. An association.
- 2 c. An employee union.
- 3 d. A limited liability company.
- 4 e. A limited liability partnership.
- 5 f. Any other legal business entity, including nonprofit 6 entities.
- 7 g. A grant recipient.
- 8 h. Contractors.
- 9 i. A county, city, school district, or other local
- 10 government entity.
- ll "Entity" or "recipients" does not include an individual
- 12 recipient of state assistance.
- 13 4. "Funding action or expenditure" includes details on the
- 14 type of spending that is provided including but not limited
- 15 to grants, contracts, and appropriations. "Funding action
- 16 or expenditure" includes tax exemptions or credits. Where
- 17 possible, an electronic link to the actual grants or contracts
- 18 shall be provided. An electronic link shall be in a format
- 19 that is a searchable document.
- 20 5. "Funding source" means the state account or fund from
- 21 which the expenditure is appropriated.
- 22 6. "Searchable internet site" means an internet site
- 23 that allows the public at no cost to search and compile the
- 24 information identified in section 8G.4 and that provides such
- 25 information in a format capable of being downloaded from the
- 26 site to personal computers.
- 27 7. "State audit or report" shall include any audit or report
- 28 issued by the auditor of state, department of management,
- 29 legislative services agency, legislative committee, or
- 30 executive body relating to the entity or recipient of funds,
- 31 the budget program or activity, or agency.
- 32 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 8G.4 Searchable budget database
- 33 internet site created.
- 1. By January 1, 2013, the director shall develop and make
- 35 publicly available a database internet site for searching,

- 1 accessing, and processing data, including the data required in
- 2 this section, for the most recent state budget. The internet
- 3 site shall be developed in such a way that the information can
- 4 be provided to other software applications, including internet
- 5 software applications, in a manner and format that allows such
- 6 software applications to access and interpret the data using
- 7 the internal programming of the software applications.
- 8 2. The searchable internet site developed pursuant to this
- 9 section shall allow the public at no cost to search and compile
- 10 information for all of the following:
- 11 a. Name and principal location or residence of the entity or
- 12 recipient of state funds.
- 13 b. Amount of state funds expended.
- 14 c. Funding or expending agency.
- 15 d. Funding source of the revenue expended.
- 16 e. Budget program or activity of the expenditure.
- 17 f. Descriptive purpose for the funding action or
- 18 expenditure.
- 19 g. Expected performance outcome for the funding action or
- 20 expenditure.
- 21 h. Past performance outcomes achieved for the funding action
- 22 or expenditure.
- 23 i. State audit or report relating to the entity or recipient
- 24 of state funds or the budget program or activity or agency.
- j. Any other relevant information specified by the director.
- 26 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 8G.5 Internet site updates.
- 27 l. Effective July 1, 2013, the internet site shall be
- 28 updated for each fiscal year not later than thirty days
- 29 following the close of the fiscal year. In addition, the
- 30 director may update the internet site as new data becomes
- 31 available. All agencies shall provide to the director data
- 32 that is required to be included on the internet site not later
- 33 than thirty days after the data becomes available to the
- 34 agency. The director shall provide guidance to agency heads
- 35 or the governing body of an agency to ensure compliance with

- 1 this section.
- By January 1, 2014, the director shall add data for
- 3 the previous budgets to the internet site. Data for previous
- 4 fiscal years may be added as it becomes available and as time
- 5 permits. The director shall ensure that all data added to the
- $\boldsymbol{6}$ internet site remain accessible to the public for a minimum of
- 7 ten years.
- 8 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 8G.6 Noncompliance.
- 9 The director shall not be considered in compliance with this
- 10 subchapter if the data required for the internet site is not
- 11 available in a searchable manner and capable of being compiled
- 12 or if the public is redirected to other government internet
- 13 sites unless each of those sites displays information from
- 14 all agencies and each category of information required can be
- 15 searched electronically by field in a single search.
- 16 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 8G.10 Intent findings.
- 17 The general assembly finds that increasing the ease of
- 18 public access to state and local tax rates, particularly
- 19 where the rates are currently available from disparate
- 20 government sources and are difficult for the public to collect
- 21 and efficiently aggregate, significantly contributes to
- 22 governmental accountability, public participation, and the
- 23 understanding of the cost of government services. Therefore,
- 24 it is the intent of the general assembly to direct the
- 25 department of management, in consultation with the department
- 26 of revenue, to create and maintain a searchable database and
- 27 internet site of each tax rate for all taxing districts in the
- 28 state to make citizen access to state and local tax rates as
- 29 open, transparent, and publicly accessible as is feasible.
- 30 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 8G.11 Short title.
- 31 This subchapter shall be known and cited as the "Taxation
- 32 Disclosure Act".
- 33 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 8G.12 Tax rate database.
- 1. Searchable tax rate database. By January 1, 2012, the
- 35 department of management, in consultation with the department

- 1 of revenue, shall make publicly available on an internet site
- 2 a searchable database of all tax rates in the state for each
- 3 taxing jurisdiction. The information shall be aggregated by
- 4 type of tax and accessible by entering a zip code or physical
- 5 address for each residency or business. Individual tax levies
- 6 shall be further specified within each tax rate.
- 7 2. Geographical tax rate map. In addition to searching for
- 8 tax rates by zip code or physical address for each residency or
- 9 business, searches shall be accommodated by a geographical tax
- 10 rate map of the state that is capable of being displayed with a
- 11 level of specificity corresponding to each taxing district.
- 12 3. Individual tax rate calculator. Tax rate calculators
- 13 shall be provided on the searchable database to allow citizens
- 14 and businesses to calculate taxes based on the location of the
- 15 citizen or business. Calculation capability shall be provided
- 16 at a minimum for property, sales, use, income, vehicle, and
- 17 business taxes and shall be specific to the rate for the taxing
- 18 district identified by the citizen or business.
- 19 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 8G.13 Updating database.
- 20 To facilitate the department of management's efforts in
- 21 creating and maintaining a searchable database of the taxes
- 22 identified in section 8G.12, subsection 3, for all taxing
- 23 districts in the state, every taxing district shall report its
- 24 tax rates annually to the department of management and shall
- 25 report any changes to its tax rates within thirty days of the
- 26 change.
- 27 EXPLANATION
- 28 This bill enacts new Code chapter 8G which is divided
- 29 into two separate subchapters. The first subchapter (new
- 30 Code sections 8G.1 through 8G.6), requires the department of
- 31 management to develop and make available to the public by
- 32 January 1, 2013, a single, searchable budget database and
- 33 internet site. This internet site would allow the public at
- 34 no cost to search an aggregated database that would provide
- 35 the names and principal location or residence of recipients of

- 1 state funds, amount of funds expended, the agency that provided
- 2 those funds, the program or activity of the expenditure,
- 3 description of the purpose of the expenditure, expected and
- 4 past outcomes of funding actions or expenditures, state audits
- 5 relating to expenditures, and other relevant information. The
- 6 bill specifies that "recipient" does not include an individual
- 7 recipient of state assistance.
- 8 The bill provides that, effective July 1, 2013, the
- 9 searchable budget database internet site is to be updated
- 10 within 30 days of the end of each fiscal year. By January 1,
- 11 2014, data is to be added for previous fiscal years.
- 12 The second subchapter requires the department of management,
- 13 in consultation with the department of revenue, by January 1,
- 14 2012, to develop and operate on an internet site a searchable
- 15 database of all the tax rates in the state for each taxing
- 16 district. The database shall include the capability to
- 17 calculate tax rates for different taxing districts.
