A BILL FOR

An Act relating to funding for highways and other roads by
 providing for the elimination of the road use tax fund
 and establishing a road use tax fund elimination study
 committee, and including effective date provisions.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 4.1, subsection 9, Code 2011, is amended
 by striking the subsection and inserting in lieu thereof the
 following:

9. *"Highway"* means a major thoroughfare between two
5 communities.

6 Sec. 2. REPEAL. Chapter 312, Code and Code Supplement 2011,7 is repealed.

8 Sec. 3. ROAD USE TAX FUND ELIMINATION STUDY COMMITTEE. It 9 is the intent of the general assembly to end the current 10 practice of using moneys which are dedicated for the 11 construction, maintenance, and supervision of the public 12 highways pursuant to Article VII, section 8, of the 13 Constitution of the State of Iowa, for roads that do not meet 14 the definition of "highway" in section 4.1, as amended by this 15 Act.

16 1. The legislative council shall establish a study 17 committee for the 2012 and 2013 legislative interims to 18 identify issues that will need to be addressed upon the repeal 19 of chapter 312, as provided in this Act, and to consider 20 new policies and options for addressing those issues. The 21 membership of the committee shall be as follows:

a. Four members of the senate, two appointed by the majority
leader of the senate and two appointed by the minority leader
of the senate.

25 b. Four members of the house of representatives, two 26 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives 27 and two appointed by the minority leader of the house of 28 representatives.

29 c. One member appointed by the governor.

30 d. The director of transportation or the director's 31 designee.

32 e. The treasurer of state or the treasurer's designee.

33 f. The director of revenue or the director's designee.

34 g. One person selected by the board of directors of the Iowa 35 league of cities.

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h. One person selected by the Iowa state association of 2 counties.

2. In conjunction with identifying issues to be addressed 4 upon elimination of the road use tax fund, the committee shall 5 consider the impact of a new highway and road funding policy 6 on the budgeting practices of the department of transportation 7 and local governments; optional sources of funding for the 8 construction, maintenance, and supervision of roads that do 9 not qualify for highway funds; new policies for the separate 10 management and disbursement of highway funds and funds for 11 other roads; statutory amendments that will be required to 12 conform to the repeal of chapter 312 and to accomplish the 13 transition to separate funding of highways and roads that do 14 not qualify as highways; and any other matters deemed relevant 15 by the committee.

16 3. The committee shall make a written report of its 17 preliminary findings and recommendations to the general 18 assembly by December 31, 2012. The committee shall make a 19 written report of its final recommendations, including a 20 proposal for legislation to implement the recommendations, by 21 December 31, 2013.

22 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. The following provisions of this 23 Act take effect July 1, 2015:

26 2. The section of this Act repealing chapter 312.27 EXPLANATION

This bill strikes the current rule of construction for the terms "highway" and "road" applicable to Iowa law and defines "highway" to mean a major thoroughfare between two communities. The bill also repeals Code chapter 312, which creates the road use tax fund and contains provisions relating to the allocation of funds from the road use tax fund. The definitional change and the Code chapter repeal are effective July 1, 2015. The bill requires the legislative council to establish a

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LSB 5434XS (2) 84 dea/nh 1 study committee for the 2012 and 2013 legislative interims to 2 identify issues relating to the current use of moneys in the 3 road use tax fund and to consider options for addressing those 4 issues. The committee is required to report its preliminary 5 findings and recommendations to the general assembly by 6 December 31, 2012, and make a final report to the general 7 assembly by December 31, 2013. The final report shall include 8 a proposal for legislation to implement the recommendations of 9 the committee.

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
