A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to requirements for motorists approaching
- 2 certain stationary vehicles on the highway, and providing
- 3 penalties.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321.323A, Code 2011, is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 321.323A Approaching certain stationary vehicles.

The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stationary
 authorized emergency vehicle that is displaying flashing
 yellow, amber, white, red, or red and blue lights shall
 approach the authorized emergency vehicle with due caution and
 shall proceed in one of the following manners, absent any other
 direction by a peace officer:

10 a. Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the 11 authorized emergency vehicle if possible in the existing safety 12 and traffic conditions.

13 b. If a lane change under paragraph "a" would be impossible, 14 prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor 15 vehicle to a speed that is less than the posted speed limit 16 and is reasonable and proper speed for the existing road and 17 traffic conditions, which speed shall be less than the posted 18 speed limit, and be prepared to stop.

19 2. The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stationary 20 towing or recovery vehicle, a stationary utility maintenance 21 vehicle, a stationary municipal maintenance vehicle, or a 22 stationary highway maintenance vehicle, that is displaying 23 flashing yellow, amber, or red lights, shall approach the 24 vehicle with due caution and shall proceed in one of the 25 following manners, absent any other direction by a peace 26 officer:

a. Make a lane change into a lane not adjacent to the
towing, recovery, utility maintenance, municipal maintenance,
or highway maintenance vehicle if possible in the existing
safety and traffic conditions.

b. If a lane change under paragraph "*a*" would be impossible, prohibited by law, or unsafe, reduce the speed of the motor whicle to a <u>speed that is less than the posted speed limit</u> <u>and is</u> reasonable and proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, which speed shall be less than the posted

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1 speed limit, and be prepared to stop. 3. A person convicted of a violation of this section commits 2 3 a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled violation under 4 section 805.8A, subsection 11. A person convicted of operating 5 a motor vehicle in violation of this section causing damage to 6 the property of another person or bodily injury to or death of 7 another person shall be subject to the following penalties in 8 addition to the penalty provided in section 805.8A or any other 9 penalty provided by law: a. For a violation causing damage to the property of another 10 ll person, but not resulting in bodily injury to or death of 12 another person, suspension of the violator's driver's license 13 or operating privileges for a period of not less than ninety 14 days and not more than one year. b. For a violation causing bodily injury to another person, 15 16 suspension of the violator's driver's license or operating 17 privileges for a period of not less than one hundred eighty 18 days and not more than one year. c. For a violation causing death, suspension of the 19 20 violator's driver's license or operating privileges for one 21 year. Sec. 2. Section 321.482A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 22 23 2011, is amended to read as follows: 24 Notwithstanding section 321.482, a person who is convicted 25 of operating a motor vehicle in violation of section 321.178, 26 subsection 2, paragraph a^{\prime} , subparagraph (2), section 27 321.180B, subsection 6, section 321.194, subsection 1, 28 paragraph "c", section 321.256, section 321.257, section 29 321.275, subsection 4, section 321.276, 321.297, 321.298, 30 321.299, 321.302, 321.303, 321.304, 321.305, 321.306, 321.307, 31 321.308, section 321.309, subsection 2, or section 321.311, 32 321.319, 321.320, 321.321, 321.322, 321.323, 321.323A, 321.324, 33 321.324A, 321.327, 321.329, or 321.333 causing serious injury 34 to or the death of another person may be subject to the 35 following penalties in addition to the penalty provided for

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2 provided by law:

3 Sec. 3. PUBLIC AWARENESS AND COMPLIANCE PROGRAMS. The 4 department of transportation, in conjunction with the 5 department of public safety, shall establish programs to foster 6 public awareness of and compliance with the requirements of 7 section 321.323A.

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EXPLANATION

9 Under current law, when the driver of a motor vehicle is 10 approaching a stationary authorized emergency vehicle that is 11 displaying flashing yellow, amber, white, red, or red and blue 12 lights, or a stationary towing or recovery vehicle, utility 13 maintenance vehicle, municipal maintenance vehicle, or highway 14 maintenance vehicle that is displaying flashing yellow, amber, 15 or red lights, the driver is required to move into a lane not 16 adjacent to the stationary vehicle if possible in the existing 17 safety and traffic conditions. If changing lanes would be 18 impossible, unlawful, or unsafe, the driver is required to 19 reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a reasonable and 20 proper speed for the existing road and traffic conditions, 21 which speed shall be less than the posted speed limit, and be 22 prepared to stop. This bill amends the provision relating to 23 reduced speed by specifying that if making a lane change would 24 be impossible, prohibited by law, or unsafe, the driver shall 25 reduce the speed of the motor vehicle to a speed that is both 26 less than the posted speed limit and reasonable and proper for 27 the existing road and traffic conditions and the driver shall 28 be prepared to stop.

Under current law, a violation of the requirements to move over or slow down when approaching certain stationary vehicles is a simple misdemeanor punishable by a scheduled fine of \$100. However, if the violation causes a serious personal injury, a court could impose an additional fine of \$500 or suspend the person's driver's license for not more than 90 days, or both. If the violation causes a death, a court could impose

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2 license for not more than 180 days, or both.

Under the bill, a violation is still a simple misdemeanor 3 4 punishable by a scheduled fine of \$100, but the bill 5 establishes a new penalty for violations causing damage to 6 property and revises the penalties for violations causing 7 injury or death of another person. Under the bill, if the 8 violation causes damage to the property of another person but 9 does not result in bodily injury to or death of another person, 10 the person's driver's license or operating privileges are 11 suspended for not less than 90 days and not more than one year. 12 If the violation causes bodily injury to another person, the 13 person's driver's license or operating privileges are suspended 14 for not less than 180 days and not more than one year. If 15 the violation causes death, the person's driver's license or 16 operating privileges are suspended for one year. The periods 17 of suspension are in addition to any other penalties applicable 18 under law.

19 The bill requires the department of transportation and the 20 department of public safety to establish educational programs 21 to promote public awareness and compliance with requirements 22 for motorists approaching certain stationary vehicles.

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
