## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to early school starts and including effective 2 date and applicability provisions.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 257.17, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:
257.17 Aid reduction for early school starts.

State aid payments made pursuant to section 257.16 for a fiscal year shall be reduced by one one-hundred-eightieth for each day of that fiscal year for which the school district begins school before the earliest starting date specified in section 279.10, subsection l. However, this section does not apply to a school district that has received approval from the director of the department of education undex for a pilot program for an innovative school year in accordance with section 279.10 , subsection 4, to commence classes for regularly established elementary and secondary schools in advance of the starting date established in section 279.10 , subsection $¥ \underline{3}$.

Sec. 2. Section 279.10, subsection l, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:

1. The school year shall begin on the first day of July and each regularly established elementary and secondary school shall begin no sooner than a day during the calendax week in which the first day of September falls August 25 but no later than the first Monday in December unless the school district has received approval from the department of education for a pilot program in accordance with subsection 3. However, if the firgt day of september fallg on a Sunday, sehool may begin on a day during the calendar week which imflediately precedes the first day of September. School shall continue for at least one hundred eighty days, except as provided in subsection 3, and may be maintained during the entire calendar year. However, if the board of directors of a district extends the school calendar because inclement weather caused the district to temporarily close school during the regular school calendar, the district may excuse a graduating senior who has met district or school requirements for graduation from attendance during the extended school calendar. A school corporation may begin employment of personnel for in-service training and

2 secondary school.

6 any proposal request made pursuant to subsection 3 prior to submitting it to the department of education for approval.

Sec. 4. Section 279.10, subsection 4, Code 2011, is amended by striking the subsection.

Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATES. The section of this Act that
11 amends section 279.10, subsection 2 , being deemed of immediate
12 importance, takes effect upon enactment, and the remainder of
13 this Act takes effect July l, 2012, and is applicable for
14 school years beginning on or after that date.
EXPLANATION
This bill changes, effective for the school year beginning July l, 2012, the earliest school start date to August 25 and eliminates the authority of the director of the department of education to grant a request made by a board of directors of a school district to commence classes prior to the earliest starting date allowed, which currently is no sooner than a day during the calendar week in which the first day of September falls or, if the first day of September falls on a Sunday, a day during the prior week.

The bill makes a conforming change to eliminate an exemption from aid reduction for early school starts, unless the exemption is for a school district approved to implement an innovative school year. Without the waiver, the school district's state aid payments are reduced by $1 / 180$ for each day of that fiscal year for which the school district begins school before the earliest starting date allowed. The bill includes a technical correction that takes effect upon enactment.
