A BILL FOR

An Act authorizing refusal of vaccinations and immunizations.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 135.141, subsection 2, paragraph f, Code
2 2011, is amended to read as follows:

f. Coordinate the location, procurement, storage, 3 4 transportation, maintenance, and distribution of medical 5 supplies, drugs, antidotes, and vaccines to prepare for or in 6 response to a public health disaster, including receiving, 7 distributing, and administering items from the strategic 8 national stockpile program of the centers for disease control 9 and prevention of the United States department of health and 10 human services. The provisions of this paragraph relating 11 to distribution of vaccines in response to a public health 12 disaster shall not require the vaccination of any person who 13 refuses the vaccination. 14 Section 135.142, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended Sec. 2. 15 to read as follows: 16 The department may purchase and distribute antitoxins, 1. 17 serums, vaccines, immunizing agents, antibiotics, and other 18 pharmaceutical agents or medical supplies as deemed advisable 19 in the interest of preparing for or controlling a public 20 health disaster. The provisions of this subsection relating 21 to distribution of vaccines in response to a public health 22 disaster shall not require the vaccination of any person who 23 refuses the vaccination.

24 Sec. 3. Section 135.144, subsection 6, Code 2011, is amended 25 to read as follows:

6. Vaccinate or order that individuals be vaccinated against an infectious disease and to prevent the spread of communicable or potentially communicable disease. Vaccinations shall be administered by any qualified person authorized to do so by the department. The vaccination shall not be provided or ordered if it is reasonably likely to lead to serious harm to the affected individual <u>or the individual refuses</u> <u>the vaccination</u>. To prevent the spread of communicable or potentially communicable disease, the department may isolate or guarantine, pursuant to chapter 139A and the rules implementing

2 is unable or unwilling to undergo vaccination pursuant to this
3 subsection.

4 Sec. 4. Section 135.146, subsection 2, Code 2011, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 2. Participation in the vaccination program shall be 7 voluntary, except for first responders who are classified 8 as having occupational exposure to blood-borne pathogens as 9 defined by the occupational safety and health administration 10 standard contained in 29 C.F.R. § 1910.1030. First responders 11 who are so classified shall be required to receive the 12 vaccinations as described in subsection 1. A first responder 13 shall be exempt from this requirement, however, when a written 14 statement from a licensed physician is presented indicating 15 that a vaccine is medically contraindicated for that person 16 or the first responder signs a written statement that the 17 administration of a vaccination conflicts with religious tenets 18 or that the vaccination is refused.

19 Sec. 5. Section 139A.8, subsection 4, Code 2011, is amended 20 to read as follows:

4. a. Immunization is not required for a person's enrollment in any elementary or secondary school or licensed child care center if either any of the following applies:
(1) a. The applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, the applicant's parent or legal guardian, submits to the admitting official a statement signed by a physician, advanced registered runse practitioner, or physician assistant who is licensed by the board of medicine, board of nursing, or board of physician assistants that the immunizations required would be injurious to the health and well-being of the applicant or any member of the applicant's family.

32 (2) <u>b.</u> The applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, the 33 applicant's parent or legal guardian, submits an affidavit 34 signed by the applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, 35 the applicant's parent or legal guardian, stating that the

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1 immunization conflicts with the tenets and practices of a

2 recognized religious denomination of which the applicant is an 3 adherent or member.

c. The applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, the
applicant's parent or legal guardian, submits an affidavit
signed by the applicant, or if the applicant is a minor,
the applicant's parent or legal guardian, stating that the
immunization is refused.

9 b. The exemptions under this subsection do not apply in 10 times of emergency or epidemic as determined by the state board 11 of health and as declared by the director of public health. 12 EXPLANATION

13 This bill authorizes persons to refuse vaccinations 14 and immunizations by amending Code provisions containing 15 vaccination requirements.

16 The portion of Code section 135.141, relating to the duties 17 of the department of public health concerning the division of 18 acute disease prevention and emergency response and requiring 19 the department to coordinate distribution of vaccines during 20 a public health disaster, is amended to prohibit required 21 vaccination of any person who refuses the vaccination. Code 22 section 135.142, relating to purchase of health care supplies 23 relating to a public health disaster, is similarly amended. 24 Code section 135.144, relating to additional duties of the

24 Code section 133.144, relating to additional duties of the 25 department during a public health disaster and specifically 26 authorizing the department to provide or order vaccinations, is 27 amended to prohibit providing or ordering vaccination of any 28 person who refuses the vaccination.

29 Code section 135.146, establishing a first responder 30 vaccination program and requiring first responders who are 31 classified as having occupational exposure to blood-borne 32 pathogens, as defined by federal requirements, to receive 33 vaccinations unless medically contraindicated or in conflict 34 with a religious tenet of the first responder, is amended 35 to allow the first responder to refuse by signing a written

2 Code section 139A.8, listing immunizations required 3 of children enrolling in an elementary school, secondary 4 school, or licensed child care center, is amended to allow 5 enrollment if the applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, 6 the applicant's parent or legal guardian, submits an affidavit 7 signed by the applicant, or if the applicant is a minor, 8 the applicant's parent or legal guardian, stating that the 9 immunization is refused. In addition, the bill repeals 10 authority to eliminate immunization exemptions during times 11 of emergency or epidemic, as determined by the state board of 12 health and as declared by the director of public health.

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
