A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the planning, approval, supplementary
- 2 weighting, and operation of regional academies and including
- 3 effective date and applicability provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 257.11, subsection 5, Code 2011, is 1 2 amended by striking the subsection. Sec. 2. Section 261E.9, subsections 1 through 3, Code 2011, 3 4 are amended to read as follows: 5 1. a. A regional academy is a program established by 6 a school district to which multiple school districts send 7 students in grades nine seven through twelve, and which may 8 include internet-based coursework and courses delivered via the 9 Iowa communications network. A regional academy shall include 10 in its curriculum advanced level courses and may include in its 11 curriculum career and technical courses. A school district 12 establishing a regional academy may collaborate and partner 13 with, enter into an agreement pursuant to chapter 28E with, 14 or enter into a contract with, one or more school districts, 15 community colleges, accredited public and private postsecondary 16 institutions, accredited nonpublic schools, businesses, and 17 private agencies located within or outside of the state. 18 b. The purpose of a regional academy established pursuant 19 to this section shall be to build a culture of innovation for 20 students and community, to diversify rural educational and 21 economic opportunities by engaging in learning experiences 22 that involve students in complex, real-world projects, and to 23 develop regional or global innovation networks. 24 If a school district establishing a regional academy in с, 25 accordance with this section submits a plan to the department 26 for approval that demonstrates how the regional academy will 27 increase and assess student achievement or increase and assess 28 competency-based learning opportunities for students, the 29 department may waive or modify any statutory or regulatory 30 provision applicable to school districts in order to provide 31 the regional academy additional flexibility if the department 32 finds that the waiver or modification is likely to result in 33 increased student achievement or increased competency-based 34 learning opportunities for students.

35 2. <u>a.</u> A regional academy course shall not qualify as a

or internet-based coursework and courses delivered via the Iowa
<u>communications network</u>, career and technical courses, core
<u>curriculum coursework</u>, courses required pursuant to section

and asynchronous learning networks.

9 3. School districts participating in regional academies are 10 eligible for supplementary weighting as provided in section 11 257.11, subsection 2. The school districts participating in 12 the regional academy shall enter into an agreement on how the 13 supplementary weighting received shall be used and shall submit 14 the agreement to the department for approval.

15 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICABILITY. This Act 16 takes effect July 1, 2012, and is applicable to school years 17 beginning on or after July 1, 2012.

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EXPLANATION

19 This bill makes changes relating to regional academies. 20 Currently, a regional academy is a program established 21 by a school district to which multiple school districts 22 send students in grades 9 through 12, and which may include 23 internet-based coursework and courses delivered via the Iowa 24 communications network. The bill lowers the grade level 25 limit to grades 7 through 12, and adds that a school district 26 establishing a regional academy may collaborate and partner 27 with, enter into an agreement pursuant to Code chapter 28E 28 with, or enter into a contract with, two or more school 29 districts, community colleges, accredited public and private 30 postsecondary institutions, accredited nonpublic schools, 31 businesses, and private agencies located within or outside of 32 the state.

33 The bill provides that the purpose of a regional academy 34 shall be to build a culture of innovation for students and 35 community, to diversify rural educational and economic

4 If a school district submits a plan to the department for 5 approval that demonstrates how the regional academy will 6 increase and assess student achievement or increase and assess 7 competency-based learning opportunities for students, the 8 department may waive or modify any statutory or regulatory 9 provision applicable to school districts in order to provide 10 the regional academy additional flexibility.

11 The bill strikes language that prohibits a regional academy 12 course from qualifying as a concurrent enrollment course.

13 A regional academy may include in its curriculum virtual or 14 internet-based coursework and courses delivered via the Iowa 15 communications network, career and technical courses, core 16 curriculum coursework, courses required for graduation or under 17 the educational standards, and asynchronous learning networks. 18 Currently, regional academies may receive supplementary

19 weighting. The bill provides that the school districts 20 participating in the regional academy must enter into an 21 agreement on how the supplementary weighting received shall 22 be used and must submit the agreement to the department for 23 approval.

The bill eliminates an outdated provision relating to supplementary weighting for regional academies.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2012, and is applicable to 27 school years beginning on or after that date.

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
