A BILL FOR

An Act relating to medication therapy management, providing an
 appropriation, and including effective date provisions.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 8A.440 Medication therapy
2 management.

3 l. As used in this section unless the context otherwise 4 requires:

5 a. "Eligible employee" means an employee of the state, with 6 the exception of an employee of the state board of regents or 7 institutions under the state board of regents, for whom group 8 health plans are established pursuant to chapter 509A providing 9 for third-party payment or prepayment for health or medical 10 expenses.

11 b. "Medication therapy management" means a systematic 12 process performed by a licensed pharmacist, designed to 13 optimize therapeutic outcomes through improved medication use 14 and reduced risk of adverse drug events, including all of the 15 following services:

16 (1) A medication therapy review and in-person consultation 17 relating to all medications, vitamins, and herbal supplements 18 currently being taken by an eligible individual.

19 (2) A medication action plan, subject to the limitations 20 specified in this section, communicated to the individual and 21 the individual's primary care physician or other appropriate 22 prescriber to address safety issues, inconsistencies,

23 duplicative therapy, omissions, and medication costs. The 24 medication action plan may include recommendations to the 25 prescriber for changes in drug therapy.

26 (3) Documentation and follow-up to ensure consistent levels27 of pharmacy services and positive outcomes.

28 2. *a.* The department shall amend the contract for the 29 provision of medication therapy management services as 30 initially required pursuant to 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, 31 section 166, to provide for the continuation of medication 32 therapy management services for eligible employees who meet any 33 of the following criteria:

34 (1) An individual who takes four or more prescription drugs35 to treat or prevent two or more chronic medical conditions.

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(2) An individual with a prescription drug therapy problem
 who is identified by the prescribing physician or other
 appropriate prescriber, and referred to a pharmacist for
 medication therapy management services.

5 (3) An individual who meets other criteria established by 6 the third-party payment provider contract, policy, or plan.

The contract shall require the entity to provide annual 7 *b*. 8 reports to the general assembly detailing the costs, savings, 9 estimated cost avoidance and return on investment, and patient 10 outcomes related to the medication therapy management services The entity shall guarantee demonstrated annual ll provided. 12 savings, including any savings associated with cost avoidance 13 at least equal to the program's costs with any shortfall amount 14 refunded to the state. The contract shall include terms, 15 conditions, and applicable measurement standards associated 16 with the demonstration of savings. The department shall verify 17 the demonstrated savings reported by the entity was achieved 18 in accordance with the agreed upon measurement standards. The 19 entity shall be prohibited from using the entity's employees to 20 provide the medication therapy management services and shall 21 instead be required to contract with licensed pharmacies, 22 pharmacists, or physicians.

23 c. The department may establish an advisory committee
24 comprised of an equal number of physicians and pharmacists
25 to provide advice and oversight in evaluating the results of
26 the program. The department shall appoint the members of the
27 advisory committee based upon designees of the Iowa pharmacy
28 association, the Iowa medical society, and the Iowa osteopathic
29 medical association.

30 *d*. The fees for pharmacist-delivered medication therapy 31 management services shall be separate from the reimbursement 32 for prescription drug product or dispensing services; shall 33 be determined by each third-party payment provider contract, 34 policy, or plan; and must be reasonable based on the resources 35 and time required to provide the service.

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e. A fee shall be established for physician reimbursement
 for services delivered for medication therapy management as
 determined by each third-party payment provider contract,
 policy, or plan, and must be reasonable based on the resources
 and time required to provide the service.

6 f. If any part of the medication therapy management 7 plan developed by a pharmacist incorporates services which 8 are outside the pharmacist's independent scope of practice 9 including the initiation of therapy, modification of dosages, 10 therapeutic interchange, or changes in drug therapy, the 11 express authorization of the individual's physician or other 12 appropriate prescriber is required.

13 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION — DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE 14 SERVICES. There is appropriated from the general fund of the 15 state to the department of administrative services for the 16 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, 17 the following amount or so much thereof as is necessary, to be 18 used for the purpose specified:

22 Sec. 3. REPEAL. 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, section 166,
23 is repealed.

24 Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of 25 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.

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EXPLANATION

This bill relates to medication therapy management. The bill codifies the pilot program for medication therapy management implemented on July 1, 2010, for eligible state employees, making the program an ongoing program and directing the department of administrative services to amend the existing contract to continue the program beyond the original pilot program repeal date of December 31, 2011. The bill appropriates funds to the department of administrative services for the purpose of the program. The bill takes effect upon

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1 enactment.

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
