# A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act creating a program for state procurement from work
- 2 centers for individuals with disabilities.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **8A.531 Disability work center** 2 procurement program.
- 3 l. Definitions. For the purposes of this section, unless 4 the context otherwise requires:
- 5 a. "Agency" means a department, board, bureau, or commission 6 of this state.
- 7 b. "Direct labor" means all labor or work involved in
- 8 producing or supplying materials, supplies, or equipment
- 9 or performing contractual services including preparation,
- 10 processing, and packing, but excluding supervision,
- 11 administration, inspection, and shipping.
- 12 c. "Disabled individual" means an individual who has
- 13 a physical, mental, or emotional disability which is a
- 14 substantial handicap to employment and prevents the individual
- 15 from engaging in normal competitive employment.
- 16 d. "Work center" means a nonprofit corporation organized
- 17 under chapter 504 or a political subdivision, which is licensed
- 18 under section 84A.12, and which is operated for the purpose
- 19 of carrying out a program of rehabilitation for disabled
- 20 individuals and for providing the individuals with remunerative
- 21 employment or other occupational rehabilitating activity of
- 22 an educational or therapeutic nature, and which is engaged in
- 23 the production of materials, supplies, or equipment or the
- 24 performance of contractual services in connection with which
- 25 not less than seventy-five percent of the total hours of direct
- 26 labor are performed by disabled individuals.
- 27 2. Duties of the department. The department shall do all
- 28 of the following:
- 29 a. Aid in the identification of materials, supplies,
- 30 equipment, and contractual services which agencies can procure
- 31 from work centers.
- 32 b. Establish eligibility criteria for work centers
- 33 participating in the program established under this section.
- 34 c. Annually establish and review fair market prices for
- 35 materials, supplies, equipment, and contractual services which

- 1 can be purchased from work centers.
- d. By October 1 each year, prepare and submit to the
- 3 director an annual report concerning the activities of the
- 4 program, including all of the following:
- 5 (1) A summary of materials, supplies, equipment, and
- 6 contractual services purchased by agencies from work centers.
- 7 (2) The name of each work center participating in the
- 8 program established under this section.
- 9 (3) The impact of the program established under this
- 10 section upon production, work stabilization, and program
- 11 development of, and the number of disabled individuals served
- 12 by, participating work centers.
- e. Annually conduct a review of the prices paid by agencies
- 14 for the materials, supplies, equipment, and contractual
- 15 services provided by work centers and make any adjustments
- 16 necessary to establish a fair market price for all such
- 17 materials, supplies, equipment, and contractual services.
- 18 f. Adopt procedures regarding specifications, time of
- 19 delivery, and designation of materials, supplies, equipment,
- 20 and contractual services to be supplied by work centers. The
- 21 department shall maintain a list of each material, supply,
- 22 piece of equipment, or contractual service to be supplied
- 23 by work centers, and shall assign a number to each item
- 24 on the list. Specifications of the department shall be
- 25 consistent with specifications prescribed by agencies for which
- 26 procurements are made.
- 27 (1) The department may change specifications contained
- 28 in the list maintained under this paragraph "f". Each list
- 29 shall contain a basic specification and the date of the latest
- 30 revision.
- 31 (2) If an agency makes a substantial change in a
- 32 specification on the list maintained under this paragraph
- 33 "f", the department shall assign a new item number. The
- 34 agency shall notify the department of the change prior to the
- 35 effective date of the change.

- 1 q. Review each order and contract for the impact that
- 2 the requirements of subsection 3 have on each supplier or
- 3 contractor, and assure that the requirements do not affect more
- 4 than fifteen percent of the supplier's or contractor's current
- 5 yearly sales or production.
- 6 h. Prescribe a surcharge to be paid by each ordering agency,
- 7 which shall be payable to the department within a time and in
- 8 accordance with a procedure specified by the department.
- 9 i. Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A to administer the
- 10 provisions of this section.
- 11 3. Qualification of work centers. To qualify for
- 12 participation under the program established under this section,
- 13 a work center must submit to the department a copy of its
- 14 license issued under section 84A.12 together with the following
- 15 documents, transmitted by a letter signed by an officer of the
- 16 work center:
- 17 a. In the case of a nonprofit corporation organized under
- 18 chapter 504, all of the following:
- 19 (1) A legible copy of the articles of incorporation of the
- 20 organization showing the date of filing with the secretary of
- 21 state.
- 22 (2) A copy of the bylaws of the organization certified by
- 23 an officer.
- 24 (3) A copy of a letter from the federal internal revenue
- 25 service indicating that the organization qualifies as a
- 26 tax-exempt organization.
- 27 b. In the case of a political subdivision, a copy of the
- 28 ordinance, resolution, or motion authorizing or directing the
- 29 establishment of the work center.
- 30 4. Responsibilities of work centers. Each work center
- 31 participating in the program established under this section
- 32 shall do all of the following:
- 33 a. Furnish materials, supplies, equipment, and services in
- 34 accordance with orders issued by agencies.
- 35 b. Make its records available for public inspection at any

- 1 reasonable time.
- 2 c. Maintain records of direct labor hours performed in the 3 work center by each worker.
- 4 d. Annually submit to the department a certification that
- 5 the work center is qualified to participate in the program
- 6 established under this section.
- 7 e. Comply with applicable occupational health and safety
- 8 standards prescribed by the United States secretary of
- 9 labor, the United States occupational health and safety
- 10 administration, or the department of workforce development.
- 11 f. Maintain an ongoing placement program for disabled
- 12 individuals that includes staff assigned to perform personal
- 13 evaluations and to maintain liaisons with appropriate community
- 14 service organizations.
- 15 g. Maintain a record for each disabled individual employed
- 16 by the work center which includes a written report prepared
- 17 by a licensed physician or psychiatrist, or a qualified
- 18 psychologist, reflecting the nature and extent of the
- 19 disability that causes the individual to qualify as disabled.
- 20 5. Purchase of raw materials. A work center shall seek
- 21 broad competition in the purchase of raw materials and
- 22 components used in the materials, supplies, equipment, or
- 23 services provided to agencies under this section. A work
- 24 center shall inform the department before entering into a
- 25 multiyear contract for raw materials and components.
- 26 6. Violations. An alleged violation of this section by
- 27 a work center shall be investigated by the department. The
- 28 department shall determine whether a violation has occurred.
- 29 If the department determines that a violation has occurred,
- 30 the department may terminate an assignment to the work center
- 31 or suspend an assignment until the department determines the
- 32 violation has been corrected.
- 7. Procurement requirements and procedures.
- 34 a. Except as provided this subsection and subsection 8, an
- 35 agency purchasing a material, supply, piece of equipment, or

- 1 services which is on the list maintained under subsection 2,
- 2 paragraph "f", shall purchase the material, supply, piece of
- 3 equipment, or service from a work center.
- 4 b. Purchase orders shall contain the following:
- 5 (1) The name, material, supply, or equipment number
- 6 assigned by the department, most recent specification,
- 7 quantity, unit price, and place and time of delivery.
- 8 (2) The type of work and location of service required, most
- 9 recent specification, work to be performed, estimated volume,
- 10 and time for completion.
- 11 c. An agency shall issue purchase orders with sufficient
- 12 time for the appropriate work center to produce the materials,
- 13 supplies, or equipment, or provide the services required.
- 14 d. If any commodity on the list maintained under subsection
- 15 2, paragraph "f", is also produced at an institution of the
- 16 state and the commodity conforms to the specifications on the
- 17 list, the ordering agency shall purchase the commodity from the
- 18 institution.
- 19 e. If a specific material, supply, or piece of equipment
- 20 on the list maintained under subsection 2, paragraph "f", also
- 21 appears in the price lists prepared pursuant to section 904.807
- 22 for products supplied by Iowa state industries, the ordering
- 23 agency shall notify and provide Iowa state industries with the
- 24 opportunity to fill the order prior to placing an order.
- 25 f. (1) Paragraph "a" does not apply to purchases of
- 26 printing or stationery.
- 27 (2) Paragraph "a" does not apply to procurements by
- 28 the department relating to information technology or
- 29 telecommunications.
- 30 8. Exceptions. The department shall do all of the
- 31 following:
- 32 a. Grant written authorization to an ordering agency to
- 33 procure materials, supplies, equipment, or services on the list
- 34 maintained under subsection 2, paragraph "f", from commercial
- 35 sources when all of the following conditions are met:

- 1 (1) The work center to which the order is assigned cannot
- 2 furnish a material, supply, piece of equipment, or service
- 3 within the period specified in the order.
- 4 (2) The material, supply, equipment, or service is
- 5 available from commercial sources in the same quantity and at
- 6 an earlier time than it is available from the work center to
- 7 which the order is assigned.
- 8 b. Issue an authorization to an ordering agency to procure
- 9 materials, supplies, equipment, or services from commercial
- 10 sources when the quantity involved is not sufficient for the
- ll economical production or provision by the work center to which
- 12 the order is assigned.
- 13 c. Issue an authorization under paragraph "a" or "b"
- 14 promptly upon request by an ordering agency. The authorization
- 15 shall be in the form of a certificate which shall specify the
- 16 quantity and delivery period covered by the authorization.
- 17 9. *Prices*.
- 18 a. All prices included in the list maintained under
- 19 subsection 2, paragraph "f", shall be determined by the
- 20 department on the basis of fair market prices for materials,
- 21 supplies, equipment, or services similar to those supplied by
- 22 work centers.
- 23 b. Prices for materials, supplies, or equipment shall
- 24 include delivery and packaging, packing, and marketing costs.
- c. Price changes for materials, supplies, or equipment shall
- 26 apply to all orders placed on or after the effective date of
- 27 the change.
- 28 d. Delivery of an order shall be deemed accomplished when a
- 29 shipment is received and accepted by the purchasing agency.
- 30 10. Adjustment and cancellation of orders. If a work center
- 31 fails to comply with the terms of an order from an agency,
- 32 the ordering agency shall make every effort to negotiate
- 33 adjustments before canceling the order.
- 34 11. Quality control.
- 35 a. Materials, supplies, and equipment furnished by work

- 1 centers under specifications issued by an agency shall
- 2 be manufactured by work centers in accordance with the
- 3 specifications.
- 4 b. Services provided by work centers under specifications
- 5 issued by an agency shall be performed by work centers in
- 6 accordance with the specifications. If no specifications
- 7 exist, the services shall be performed by work centers in
- 8 accordance with reasonable commercial standards of practice in
- 9 the applicable industry.
- 10 c. If the quality of a material, supply, piece of equipment,
- ll or service received from a work center is not satisfactory to
- 12 the contracting agency, the agency shall advise the department
- 13 and, if the department determines that the quality of the
- 14 material, supply, equipment, or service is unsatisfactory, the
- 15 department shall suspend the eligibility of the work center
- 16 which provided the material, supply, or equipment, or which
- 17 performed the service to participate in the program established
- 18 under this section.
- 19 12. Research and development periods.
- 20 a. No more than once during a two-year period, a work center
- 21 may apply to the department for authorization to begin a period
- 22 of research and development to explore the capability of the
- 23 work center to provide a material, supply, piece of equipment,
- 24 or service to the state that the work center does not currently
- 25 provide. A period shall not last for more than ninety days.
- 26 The department shall not authorize a period for a work center
- 27 for a particular material, supply, piece of equipment, or
- 28 service if such a period has been authorized for another work
- 29 center for the same material, supply, piece of equipment, or
- 30 service, and the period has not yet elapsed. The department
- 31 may approve one additional ninety-day period for a work center
- 32 if the work center reports satisfactory progress for an initial
- 33 period.
- 34 b. At the time of authorization of an initial period for a
- 35 work center, the department shall provide the work center with

- 1 any available data on annual state purchases; the most recent
- 2 contract specifications, terms and conditions; prices; and,
- 3 when available, samples for the particular material, supply,
- 4 piece of equipment, or service which is to be the subject of
- 5 research and development for the period.
- 6 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **84A.12** Licenses for employment of 7 workers with disabilities by work centers.
- 8 The department shall issue a license to a nonprofit
- 9 corporation organized under chapter 504 or to a political
- 10 subdivision to operate a work center for the employment of
- ll workers with a disability who are unable to earn a wage that
- 12 is commensurate with their ability and productivity. The
- 13 department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 17A to
- 14 administer this section.
- 15 EXPLANATION
- 16 This bill provides for a program for state agencies to
- 17 procure products from work centers for disabled individuals.
- 18 Such products would consist of materials, supplies, equipment,
- 19 or contractual services. The bill requires a state agency
- 20 which is making a purchase of a product which is on the list of
- 21 products available pursuant to the bill to purchase the product
- 22 from a work center, with certain exceptions.
- 23 The bill provides that the program will be administered by
- 24 the department of administrative services. The bill provides
- 25 definitions for "disabled individual" and "work center". The
- 26 bill sets out duties of the department, including identifying
- 27 products which agencies can procure from work centers,
- 28 establishing eligibility criteria for participating work
- 29 centers, establishing fair market prices for products purchased
- 30 from work centers, reporting on the activities of the program,
- 31 adopting procedures for ordering products from work centers,
- 32 maintaining a list of products available through the program,
- 33 establishing a surcharge for agencies ordering products, and
- 34 adopting other rules as necessary pursuant to Code chapter 17A.
- 35 The bill specifies that a nonprofit corporation organized

1 under Code chapter 504 or a political subdivision may operate 2 work centers. The bill requires a nonprofit corporation or 3 political subdivision to submit verifying documentation to the 4 department to qualify as a work center, including a license to 5 operate issued by the department of workforce development. The bill sets out responsibilities of work centers, 7 including furnishing products ordered by agencies, maintaining 8 records of hours worked, submitting annual certification 9 of qualification to participate in the program, compliance 10 with applicable health and safety standards, maintaining a 11 placement program for participants, and maintaining records 12 for participants, including a written report by a licensed 13 physician or psychiatrist, or a qualified psychologist. 14 The bill directs work centers to seek broad competition 15 in the purchase of raw materials and components used in the 16 products provided to agencies. The bill provides that a work 17 center must inform the department before entering into a 18 multiyear contract for raw materials and components. The bill directs the department to investigate any alleged 20 violation of the provisions of the bill. The bill provides 21 that the department shall determine if a violation has 22 occurred, and may terminate an assignment to a work center 23 or suspend an assignment until the department determines the 24 violation has been corrected. The bill provides that a state agency which is making 26 a purchase of a product which is on the list of products 27 available pursuant to the bill must purchase the product 28 from a work center. The bill provides exceptions from this 29 requirement, including purchases of printing or information 30 technology, purchases of products also produced by state 31 institutions, purchases of products also produced by the state 32 prison industries program, purchase orders that cannot be 33 satisfied in the necessary time frame, and purchase orders of a 34 quantity which a work center cannot economically produce. The bill sets out requirements for the contents of purchase 35

- 1 orders. The bill requires an ordering agency to issue a
- 2 purchase order with sufficient time for the appropriate work
- 3 center to produce the products required.
- 4 The bill provides that prices for the products offered
- 5 through the program must be based on fair market prices and
- 6 will include delivery and packaging, packing, and marketing
- 7 costs. The bill specifies that delivery of an order is
- 8 accomplished when a shipment is received and accepted by the
- 9 purchasing agency. The bill provides that if a work center
- 10 fails to comply with the terms of an order from an agency, the
- 11 ordering agency must make every effort to negotiate adjustments
- 12 before canceling the order.
- 13 The bill provides that products furnished by work centers
- 14 must meet the specifications of the ordering agency. The
- 15 bill provides that if the quality of a product received from
- 16 a work center is not satisfactory to the contracting agency,
- 17 the agency must advise the department and, if the department
- 18 determines that the quality of the product is unsatisfactory,
- 19 the department must suspend the work center which provided the
- 20 product from the program.
- 21 The bill provides that no more than once during a two-year
- 22 period, a work center may apply to the department for
- 23 authorization to begin a period of research and development
- 24 to explore the capability of the work center to provide a
- 25 product to the state that the work center does not currently
- 26 provide. The bill provides that a period will not last
- 27 more than 90 days. The bill prohibits the department from
- 28 authorizing a period for a work center for a particular product
- 29 if such a period has been authorized for another work center
- 30 for the same product, and the period has not elapsed. The
- 31 bill provides that the department may approve one additional
- 32 90-day period for a work center if the work center reports
- 33 satisfactory progress for an initial period. The bill directs
- 34 the department, at the time of authorization of an initial
- 35 period, to provide the work center with any available data on

- 1 annual state purchases; most recent contract specifications,
- 2 terms and conditions; prices; and, when available, samples for
- 3 the particular product which is to be the subject of research
- 4 and development for the period.
- 5 The bill directs the department of workforce development to
- 6 adopt rules pursuant to Code chapter 17A for issuing a license
- 7 to a nonprofit corporation or political subdivision to operate
- 8 a work center for the employment of workers with a disability
- 9 who are unable to earn a wage that is commensurate with their
- 10 ability and productivity.
- 11 The bill may cause a political subdivision to offer for sale
- 12 to the public a service or product that competes with private
- 13 enterprise.
