A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to abortions, including prohibiting abortions
- 2 beyond a certain postfertilization age, providing an
- 3 exception, and providing a penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 146A.1 Definitions.
- 2 As used in this chapter unless the context otherwise
- 3 requires:
- 4 1. "Abortion" means abortion as defined in section 146.1.
- 5 2. "Attempt to perform or induce an abortion" means an act,
- 6 or an omission of a statutorily required act, that, under the
- 7 circumstances as the actor believes them to be, constitutes a
- 8 substantial step in a course of conduct planned to culminate in
- 9 the performance or inducing of an abortion.
- 3. "Fertilization" means the fusion of a human spermatozoon
- ll with a human ovum.
- 12 4. "Human pregnancy" means an individual organism of the
- 13 species homo sapiens from fertilization until live birth.
- 14 5. "Medical emergency" means a condition which, in
- 15 reasonable medical judgment, so complicates the medical
- 16 condition of a pregnant woman as to necessitate the immediate
- 17 abortion of the human pregnancy to avert the woman's death or
- 18 for which a delay will create a serious risk of substantial and
- 19 irreversible physical impairment of a major bodily function.
- 20 "Medical emergency" does not include a condition which is based
- 21 on a claim or diagnosis that the pregnant woman will engage in
- 22 conduct which would result in the pregnant woman's death or in
- 23 substantial and irreversible physical impairment of a major
- 24 bodily function.
- 25 6. "Physician" means a person licensed under chapter 148.
- 7. "Postfertilization age" means the age of the human
- 27 pregnancy as calculated from the fertilization of the human
- 28 ovum.
- 29 8. "Probable postfertilization age" means what, in
- 30 reasonable medical judgment, will with reasonable probability
- 31 be the postfertilization age of the human pregnancy at the time
- 32 the abortion is to be performed.
- 33 9. "Reasonable medical judgment" means a medical judgment
- 34 made by a reasonably prudent physician who is knowledgeable
- 35 about the case and the treatment possibilities with respect to

- 1 the medical conditions involved.
- 2 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **146A.2** Abortion prohibited at twelve
- 3 or more weeks postfertilization age exception penalty.
- 4 l. A physician shall not perform or induce, or attempt to
- 5 perform or induce, an abortion upon a pregnant woman when it
- 6 has been determined, by the physician performing or inducing
- 7 the abortion or by another physician upon whose determination
- 8 that physician relies, that the probable postfertilization age
- 9 of the human pregnancy is twelve or more weeks unless, in the
- 10 physician's reasonable medical judgment, the pregnant woman has
- 11 a condition which the physician deems a medical emergency.
- 12 2. A physician who intentionally or recklessly performs or
- 13 attempts to perform an abortion in violation of this section is
- 14 guilty of a class "C" felony.
- 15 3. A woman upon whom an abortion was performed or was
- 16 attempted to be performed shall not be subject to prosecution
- 17 for a violation of this section.
- 18 EXPLANATION
- 19 This bill relates to abortions. The bill provides
- 20 definitions used in the bill. The bill provides that, except
- 21 in the case of a medical emergency, a physician shall not
- 22 perform or induce, or attempt to perform or induce, an abortion
- 23 upon a pregnant woman when it has been determined that the
- 24 probable postfertilization age is 12 or more weeks unless, in
- 25 the physician's reasonable medical judgment, the pregnant woman
- 26 has a condition which the physician deems a medical emergency.
- 27 The bill provides that a physician who intentionally or
- 28 recklessly performs or attempts to perform an abortion in
- 29 violation of the bill is guilty of a class "C" felony, which is
- 30 punishable by confinement for no more than 10 years and a fine
- 31 of at least \$1,000 but not more than \$10,000. However, the
- 32 woman upon whom the abortion was performed or was attempted to
- 33 be performed is not subject to prosecution for a violation of
- 34 the bill.
