## **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION**

- 1 A Joint Resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution
- of the State of Iowa restricting the use of revenues derived
- 3 from an increase in the state sales and use tax rates for
- 4 school infrastructure purposes.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

## S.J.R. 5

- 1 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 2 the State of Iowa is proposed:
- 3 Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is
- 4 amended by adopting the following new section:
- 5 School infrastructure revenues. SEC. 11. All revenue
- 6 derived from an increase in the state sales or use tax rate,
- 7 which was dedicated for school infrastructure or school
- 8 property tax relief purposes, shall be used solely for purposes
- 9 of funding school district infrastructure needs or for
- 10 providing school district property tax relief as provided in
- 11 laws enacted by the general assembly.
- 12 Sec. 2. REFERRAL AND PUBLICATION. The foregoing proposed
- 13 amendment to the Constitution of the State of Iowa is referred
- 14 to the general assembly to be chosen at the next general
- 15 election for members of the general assembly, and the secretary
- 16 of state is directed to cause the proposed amendment to be
- 17 published for three consecutive months previous to the date of
- 18 the election as provided by law.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- 20 This joint resolution proposes an amendment to the
- 21 Constitution of the State of Iowa. The amendment provides that
- 22 the revenues derived from an increase in the state sales and
- 23 use tax rates which were dedicated for school infrastructure
- 24 or school property tax relief purposes shall only be used for
- 25 funding school district infrastructure needs or for providing
- 26 school district property tax relief as provided in laws enacted
- 27 by the general assembly.
- 28 The resolution, if adopted, will be referred to the next
- 29 general assembly. If the next general assembly adopts the
- 30 resolution, the amendment will be submitted to the voters for
- 31 ratification.
