 educational planning grant fund.

1 Section 1. Section 21.2, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended 2 by adding the following new paragraph:

3 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. *k*. A nonprofit foundation authorized by 4 the college student aid commission pursuant to section 261.2, 5 subsection 12.

6 Sec. 2. Section 22.1, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended 7 to read as follows:

The term "government body" means this state, or 1. 8 9 any county, city, township, school corporation, political 10 subdivision, tax-supported district, nonprofit corporation ll other than a fair conducting a fair event as provided in 12 chapter 174, whose facilities or indebtedness are supported 13 in whole or in part with property tax revenue and which is 14 licensed to conduct pari-mutuel wagering pursuant to chapter 15 99D; the governing body of a drainage or levee district as 16 provided in chapter 468, including a board as defined in 17 section 468.3, regardless of how the district is organized; 18 or other entity of this state, or any branch, department, 19 board, bureau, commission, council, committee, official, or 20 officer of any of the foregoing or any employee delegated 21 the responsibility for implementing the requirements of this 22 chapter. For purposes of this chapter, a nonprofit foundation 23 authorized by the college student aid commission pursuant to 24 section 261.2, subsection 12, shall be considered a government 25 body.

26 Sec. 3. Section 261.2, subsection 3, Code 2011, is amended 27 to read as follows:

3. <u>a.</u> Develop and implement, in cooperation with the state board of regents <u>and the department of education</u>, an deducational <u>program programs</u> and marketing strategies designed to inform <u>students and</u> parents about the options available for <u>financing planning</u>, preparing, and paying for a college ducation and the need to accumulate the financial resources hecessary to pay for a college education. The educational program programs shall include but not be limited to

5 b. Administer the educational planning grant fund. 6 The educational planning grant fund is created in the 7 state treasury as a separate fund under the control of the 8 commission. Moneys in the educational planning grant fund 9 shall be used for educational programs and marketing strategies 10 developed and implemented in accordance with paragraph "a". 11 The fund shall consist of moneys appropriated by the general 12 assembly and any other moneys available to and obtained 13 or accepted by the commission from the federal government 14 or private sources for placement in the fund. The moneys 15 credited to the fund are not subject to section 8.33, and 16 moneys in the fund shall not be transferred, used, obligated, 17 appropriated, or otherwise encumbered except as provided by 18 law. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, subsection 2, interest or 19 earnings on moneys deposited in the educational planning grant 20 fund shall be credited to the fund.

21 Sec. 4. Section 261.2, Code 2011, is amended by adding the 22 following new subsections:

NEW SUBSECTION. 11. Accept and administer trusts deemed by the commission to be beneficial for Iowa students and families. NEW SUBSECTION. 12. Authorize, at its discretion, a nonprofit foundation acting solely for the support of commission activities authorized or required pursuant to this chapter. The nonprofit foundation may accept and administer trusts, gifts, grants, and other bequests, contributions, or donations deemed by the commission to be beneficial to Iowa students and families. Notwithstanding section 633.63, the commission and the nonprofit foundation may act as trustees in such instances. The commission shall require that moneys belonging to the nonprofit foundation be audited annually. The foundation is not a state agency, shall not exercise any

1 sovereign power of the state, and the state shall not be
2 liable for any of the foundation's debts. The foundation is
3 a governmental body solely for purposes of chapter 21 and a
4 government body solely for purposes of chapter 22.

EXPLANATION

6 This bill requires the college student aid commission 7 to administer a career planning internet-based tool and an 8 educational planning grant fund and to accept and administer 9 trusts, and allows the commission to authorize a nonprofit 10 foundation that acts solely for the support of commission 11 activities.

12 The nonprofit foundation is authorized to accept and 13 administer trusts, gifts, grants, and other bequests, 14 contributions, or donations. The commission and the nonprofit 15 foundation may act as trustees in those instances. Moneys 16 belonging to the nonprofit foundation must be audited annually. 17 For purposes of the open meetings law, the nonprofit foundation 18 is a governmental body. For purposes of the open records 19 law, the nonprofit foundation is a government body. The bill 20 provides that the foundation is not a state agency, nor shall 21 it exercise any sovereign power of the state, and the state 22 shall not be liable for any of the foundation's debts.

The educational planning grant fund is created in the state treasury under the control of the commission. The fund must be used for educational programs and marketing strategies developed and implemented by the commission. The fund consists of moneys appropriated by the general assembly and any other moneys available to and obtained or accepted by the commission from the federal government or private sources.

The bill requires the commission to cooperate with the department of education in developing and implementing educational programs and marketing strategies designed to inform students and parents about planning, preparing, and paying for a college education.
