

Senate Study Bill 1026 - Introduced

A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the grounds for which the board of
2 educational examiners is required to disqualify an applicant
3 for licensure or revoke a license.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 272.2, subsection 14, paragraph b,
2 subparagraph (1), unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 2011, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 The person entered a plea of guilty to, or has been found
5 guilty of, any of the following offenses ~~established pursuant~~
6 ~~to Iowa law or offenses of a similar nature established under~~
7 ~~the laws of any other state or of the United States, or any~~
8 ~~other country~~, whether or not a sentence is imposed:

9 Sec. 2. Section 272.2, subsection 14, paragraph b,
10 subparagraph (1), Code 2011, is amended by adding the following
11 new subparagraph divisions:

12 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH DIVISION. (0c) Enticing a minor under
13 section 710.10.

14 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH DIVISION. (00c) Human trafficking under
15 section 710A.2.

16 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH DIVISION. (f) Any offense specified in
17 the laws of another jurisdiction, or any offense that may be
18 prosecuted in federal, military, or foreign court, that is
19 comparable to an offense listed in this subparagraph (1).

20 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH DIVISION. (g) Any offense under prior
21 laws of this state or another jurisdiction, or any offense
22 under prior law that was prosecuted in a federal, military, or
23 foreign court, that is comparable to an offense listed in this
24 subparagraph (1).

25 EXPLANATION

26 This bill adds to the grounds for which the board of
27 educational examiners is required to disqualify an applicant
28 for a license or to revoke the license of a person. The new
29 grounds include enticing a minor; human trafficking; or any
30 offense specified in the laws of another jurisdiction, any
31 offense under prior laws of this state or another jurisdiction,
32 or any offense, or prior offense, that may be or was prosecuted
33 in federal, military, or foreign court, that is comparable
34 to an offense listed as grounds for disqualification or
35 revocation.

1 Other grounds for disqualification or revocation currently
2 in Code include the following: forcible felonies including
3 child endangerment, assault, murder, sexual abuse, or
4 kidnapping; sexual abuse offenses involving a child; sexual
5 exploitation by a school employee; incest involving a child;
6 dissemination and exhibition of obscene material to minors; and
7 telephone dissemination of obscene material to minors.
