A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act allowing the department of transportation to accept
- 2 reports from advanced registered nurse practitioners
- disclosing a physical or mental condition that renders a
- 4 person incompetent to operate a motor vehicle.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 321.186, subsection 4, Code 2011, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 4. A physician licensed under chapter 148, an advanced
- 4 registered nurse practitioner licensed under chapter 152
- 5 and registered with the board of nursing, or an optometrist
- 6 licensed under chapter 154 may report to the department
- 7 the identity of a person who has been diagnosed as having a
- 8 physical or mental condition which would render the person
- 9 physically or mentally incompetent to operate a motor vehicle
- 10 in a safe manner. The physician, advanced registered nurse
- 11 practitioner, or optometrist shall make reasonable efforts
- 12 to notify the person who is the subject of the report, in
- 13 writing. The written notification shall state the nature of
- 14 the disclosure and the reason for the disclosure. A physician,
- 15 advanced registered nurse practitioner, or optometrist making a
- 16 report under this section shall be immune from any liability,
- 17 civil or criminal, which might otherwise be incurred or imposed
- 18 as a result of the report. A physician, advanced registered
- 19 nurse practitioner, or optometrist has no duty to make a
- 20 report or to warn third parties with regard to any knowledge
- 21 concerning a person's mental or physical competency to operate
- 22 a motor vehicle in a safe manner. Any report received by
- 23 the department from a physician, advanced registered nurse
- 24 practitioner, or optometrist under this section shall be kept
- 25 confidential. Information regulated by chapter 141A shall be
- 26 subject to the confidentiality provisions and remedies of that
- 27 chapter.
- 28 EXPLANATION
- 29 Under current law, the department of transportation has the
- 30 authority to determine if an applicant for a driver's license
- 31 or a person who holds a valid driver's license is physically
- 32 or mentally incompetent to drive. The department may order an
- 33 examination or may act on the confidential report of a licensed
- 34 physician or optometrist disclosing the identity of a person
- 35 who has been diagnosed with a physical or mental condition

- 1 which would render the person incompetent to operate a motor
- 2 vehicle in a safe manner. A physician or optometrist who makes
- 3 such a report is required to attempt to notify the person who
- 4 is the subject of the report in writing, stating the nature
- 5 of the disclosure and the reason for the disclosure. The
- 6 reporting physician or optometrist is immune from civil or
- 7 criminal liability that might otherwise be incurred or imposed
- 8 as a result of the report.
- 9 This bill allows a licensed advanced registered nurse
- 10 practitioner who is registered with the board of nursing to
- 11 make the same kind of report to the department regarding a
- 12 diagnosis affecting a person's ability to operate a motor
- 13 vehicle. An advanced registered nurse practitioner who makes
- 14 a report to the department has the same responsibilities and
- 15 protections that currently apply to a physician or optometrist
- 16 in connection with a report.
