A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the Iowa military code and military service
- 2 by making changes related to the use and support of certain
- 3 facilities, operations support, employment and rank of
- 4 active and retired military personnel, the definition of
- 5 performing military duty, tort claims protections, and an
- 6 exemption from state income tax for military pensions and
- 7 including effective date and retroactive applicability
- 8 provisions.
- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 29A.14, Code 2011, is amended to read as 2 follows:

- 3 29A.14 Leasing Support and facilities improvement fund.
- 4 l. The adjutant general may operate or lease any of the
- 5 national guard facilities at Camp Dodge. Any income or revenue
- 6 derived from the operation or leasing shall be deposited with
- 7 the treasurer of state and credited to the national guard
- 8 support and facilities improvement fund. The balance in
- 9 the national guard support and facilities improvement fund
- 10 is limited to a maximum of two million dollars. Any amount
- 11 exceeding the limit shall be credited to the general fund of
- 12 the state.
- 2. A national guard support and facilities improvement fund
- 14 is created in the state treasury. The proceeds of the fund are
- 15 appropriated, and shall be used only to support national guard
- 16 operations and for the construction, improvement, modification,
- 17 maintenance or repair of national guard facilities. However,
- 18 proceeds of the fund shall not be used for the construction of
- 19 a new facility without the approval of the general assembly.
- Sec. 2. Section 29A.14A, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 21 follows:
- 22 29A.14A Use of government facilities.
- 23 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the
- 24 state or any political subdivision of the state, shall permit
- 25 the rental of facilities under its control, for a fee not
- 26 in excess of any expenses incurred by the state or political
- 27 subdivision, for designated military events. For purposes
- 28 of this section, "designated military event" means an event,
- 29 authorized by the adjutant general, for military family
- 30 readiness groups, departing units, or for returning veterans
- 31 of the national guard, reserves, or regular components of the
- 32 armed forces of the United States for a period of up to one year
- 33 from the date of return from active duty.
- 34 Sec. 3. Section 29A.19, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 35 follows:

1 29A.19 Quartermaster.

- 2 A present or retired commissioned officer member of the
- 3 national guard who has ten years' service in the Iowa army
- 4 national guard or the Iowa air national guard and has attained
- 5 the grade of a field officer shall be detailed to be the
- 6 quartermaster and property officer of the state, who shall have
- 7 charge of and be accountable for, under the adjutant general,
- 8 all state military property. The quartermaster shall keep
- 9 property returns and reports and give bond to the state of Iowa
- 10 as the governor may direct.
- 11 Sec. 4. Section 29A.23, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 12 follows:
- 29A.23 Roll of retired officers and enlisted personnel.
- 14 An officer or enlisted person who is a member of the Iowa
- 15 national guard who has completed twenty years of military
- 16 service under 10 U.S.C. § 1331(d), as evidenced by a letter of
- 17 notification of retired pay at age sixty, shall upon retirement
- 18 from the Iowa national guard and written request to the
- 19 adjutant general be placed by order of the commander in chief
- 20 on a roll in the office of the adjutant general to be known as
- 21 the "roll of retired national guard military personnel." A
- 22 member registered on the roll is entitled to wear the uniform
- 23 of the rank last held on state or other occasions of ceremony,
- 24 when the wearing of such uniform is not in conflict with
- 25 federal law.
- Sec. 5. Section 29A.57, subsection 2, Code 2011, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:
- 28 2. The board may acquire land or real estate by purchase,
- 29 contract for purchase, gift, or bequest and acquire, own,
- 30 contract for the construction of, erect, purchase, maintain,
- 31 alter, operate, and repair installations and facilities of the
- 32 Iowa army national guard and the Iowa air national guard when
- 33 funds for the installations and facilities are made available
- 34 by the federal government, the state of Iowa, municipalities,
- 35 corporations, or individuals. The title to the property so

1 acquired shall be taken in the name of the state of Iowa and the

- 2 real estate may be sold or exchanged by the executive council,
- 3 upon recommendation of the board, when it is no longer needed
- 4 for the purpose for which it was acquired. Income or revenue
- 5 derived from the sale of the real estate shall be credited to
- 6 the national guard support and facilities improvement fund and
- 7 used for the purposes specified in section 29A.14, subsection 8 2.
- 9 Sec. 6. Section 29A.78, Code 2011, is amended to read as 10 follows:
- 11 29A.78 Brevet rank.
- 12 The commander in chief, on the recommendation of the
- 13 adjutant general, may commission by brevet general and field
- 14 grade officers of in the national guard whose names appear on
- 15 the roll of retired military personnel as defined in section
- 16 29A.23 in the next higher grade than that held at retirement or
- 17 resignation. Brevet rank is only honorary and does not confer
- 18 any privilege, precedence or command or pay any emoluments.
- 19 Brevet officers may wear the uniform of their brevet rank on
- 20 occasions of ceremonies related to state functions only.
- 21 Sec. 7. Section 144.13B, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 22 follows:
- 23 144.13B Waiver of fees military service.
- 24 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the
- 25 contrary, the certified copy fees for a birth certificate or
- 26 death certificate of a service member, as defined in section
- 27 29A.90, who died while on active duty performing military duty,
- 28 as defined in section 29A.1, subsection 3, 11, or 12, shall be
- 29 waived for a period of one year from the date of death for a
- 30 family member of the deceased service member.
- 31 Sec. 8. Section 144C.6, subsection 4, Code 2011, is amended
- 32 to read as follows:
- 33 4. A declaration for disposition of remains made by
- 34 a service member, as defined in section 29A.90, who died
- 35 while performing military duty as defined in section 29A.1,

- 1 subsection 3, 11, or 12, on forms provided and authorized by
- 2 the department of defense for service members for this purpose
- 3 shall constitute a valid declaration of designee for purposes
- 4 of this chapter.
- 5 Sec. 9. Section 422.7, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 6 following new subsection:
- 7 NEW SUBSECTION. 41. Subtract, to the extent included,
- 8 retirement pay received from the federal government for
- 9 military service performed in the armed forces, armed forces
- 10 military reserve, or national guard.
- 11 Sec. 10. Section 476.20, subsection 3, unnumbered paragraph
- 12 3, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 The rules established by the board shall provide that
- 14 a public utility furnishing gas or electricity shall not
- 15 disconnect service to a residence in which one of the heads of
- 16 household is a service member deployed for military service, as
- 17 defined in section 29A.90 29A.1, subsection 3, prior to a date
- 18 ninety days after the end of the service member's deployment,
- 19 if the public utility is informed of the deployment.
- Sec. 11. Section 483A.24A, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 21 follows:
- 22 483A.24A License refunds military service.
- 23 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the
- 24 contrary, a service member deployed for military service, both
- 25 as defined in section 29A.90 29A.1, subsection 3, shall receive
- 26 a refund of that portion of any license fee paid by the service
- 27 member representing the service member's period of military
- 28 service.
- Sec. 12. Section 669.2, subsection 4, unnumbered paragraph
- 30 1, Code 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- "Employee of the state" includes any one or more officers,
- 32 agents, or employees of the state or any state agency,
- 33 including members of the general assembly, and persons acting
- 34 on behalf of the state or any state agency in any official
- 35 capacity, temporarily or permanently in the service of the

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- 1 state of Iowa, whether with or without compensation, but
- 2 does not include a contractor doing business with the state.
- 3 Professional personnel, including physicians, osteopathic
- 4 physicians and surgeons, osteopathic physicians, optometrists,
- 5 dentists, nurses, physician assistants, and other medical
- 6 personnel, who render services to patients or inmates of state
- 7 institutions under the jurisdiction of the department of human
- 8 services or the Iowa department of corrections, and employees
- 9 of the department of veterans affairs, are to be considered
- 10 employees of the state, whether the personnel are employed on a
- 11 full-time basis or render services on a part-time basis on a
- 12 fee schedule or other arrangement. Criminal defendants while
- 13 performing unpaid community service ordered by the district
- 14 court, board of parole, or judicial district department of
- 15 correctional services, or an inmate providing services pursuant
- 16 to a chapter 28E agreement entered into pursuant to section
- 17 904.703, and persons supervising those inmates under and
- 18 according to the terms of the chapter 28E agreement, are to
- 19 be considered employees of the state. Members of the Iowa
- 20 national guard performing duties in a requesting state pursuant
- 21 to section 29C.21 are to be considered employees of the state
- 22 solely for the purpose of claims arising out of those duties
- 23 in the event that the requesting state's tort claims coverage
- 24 does not extend to such members of the Iowa national guard or
- 25 is less than that provided under Iowa law.
- Sec. 13. Section 724.7, subsection 2, Code 2011, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:
- 28 2. The commissioner of public safety shall develop a process
- 29 to allow service members deployed for military service to
- 30 submit a renewal of a nonprofessional permit to carry weapons
- 31 early and by mail. In addition, a permit issued to a service
- 32 member who is deployed for military service, as defined in
- 33 section 29A.90 29A.1, subsection 3, 11, or 12, that would
- 34 otherwise expire during the period of deployment shall remain
- 35 valid for ninety days after the end of the service member's

- 1 deployment.
- 2 Sec. 14. RETROACTIVE APPLICABILITY. The section of
- 3 this Act enacting new section 422.7, subsection 41, applies
- 4 retroactively to January 1, 2011, for tax years beginning on
- 5 or after that date.
- 6 Sec. 15. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. The section of this Act
- 7 amending section 29A.14, being deemed of immediate importance,
- 8 takes effect upon enactment.
- 9 EXPLANATION
- 10 This bill relates to the Iowa military code and military ll service.
- 12 The bill amends Code section 29A.14 to change the name of
- 13 the national guard facilities improvement fund to the national
- 14 guard support and facilities improvement fund. The bill allows
- 15 for these funds to be used for both national guard operations
- 16 and facilities improvements. This provision of the bill takes
- 17 effect upon enactment.
- 18 The bill amends Code section 29A.14A, regarding leasing of
- 19 governmental facilities for designated military events, to
- 20 eliminate the requirement that the adjutant general approve
- 21 the events and to expand the definition of events to include
- 22 departure-related events.
- 23 The bill eliminates the requirement that the state
- 24 quartermaster be a current or former commissioned officer. The
- 25 change allows current or former noncommissioned officers to
- 26 serve in the position.
- 27 The bill amends Code section 29A.23 to specify who may
- 28 be placed on the role of retired military personnel from the
- 29 Iowa national guard. Code section 29A.78, relating to brevet
- 30 commissions, is amended to link the brevet to membership in the
- 31 Iowa national quard.
- 32 The bill provides definitions for "performing military duty"
- 33 as it relates to the waiver of fees for certain birth and death
- 34 certificates, the designation for the dispositions of remains
- 35 made on forms provided and authorized by the department of

- 1 public defense, the disconnection of public utility services,
- 2 the refund of fishing and hunting license fees, and the renewal
- 3 of weapon permits.
- 4 The bill exempts retirement pay received from the federal
- 5 government for certain military service from state income
- 6 taxation. This provision of the bill applies retroactively to
- 7 January 1, 2011, for tax years beginning on or after that date.
- 8 The bill also amends the Iowa tort claims Act to provide that
- 9 members of the Iowa national guard performing military duty
- 10 in a state that has requested assistance from Iowa under the
- 11 emergency management assistance compact are to be considered
- 12 employees of the state of Iowa for the purpose of tort claims
- 13 arising from those duties where the tort claims coverage of the
- 14 requesting state does not extend to such Iowa national guard
- 15 members or is less than that of Iowa.
