- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{1}}$ An Act relating to the licensure of the practice of
- 2 naturopathic medicine.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 2011,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 3. "Licensed" or "certified", when applied to a physician
- 4 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopathic physician
- 5 and surgeon, naturopathic physician, physician assistant,
- 6 psychologist, chiropractor, nurse, dentist, dental hygienist,
- 7 dental assistant, optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist,
- 8 pharmacist, physical therapist, physical therapist assistant,
- 9 occupational therapist, occupational therapy assistant,
- 10 respiratory care practitioner, practitioner of cosmetology
- 11 arts and sciences, practitioner of barbering, funeral
- 12 director, dietitian, marital and family therapist, mental
- 13 health counselor, social worker, massage therapist, athletic
- 14 trainer, acupuncturist, nursing home administrator, hearing aid
- 15 dispenser, or sign language interpreter or transliterator means
- 16 a person licensed under this subtitle.
- 17 6. "Profession" means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
- 18 osteopathic medicine and surgery, naturopathic medicine,
- 19 practice as a physician assistant, psychology, chiropractic,
- 20 nursing, dentistry, dental hygiene, dental assisting,
- 21 optometry, speech pathology, audiology, pharmacy, physical
- 22 therapy, physical therapist assisting, occupational therapy,
- 23 occupational therapy assisting, respiratory care, cosmetology
- 24 arts and sciences, barbering, mortuary science, marital
- 25 and family therapy, mental health counseling, social work,
- 26 dietetics, massage therapy, athletic training, acupuncture,
- 27 nursing home administration, hearing aid dispensing, or sign
- 28 language interpreting or transliterating.
- 29 Sec. 2. Section 147.2, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 30 to read as follows:
- 31 1. A person shall not engage in the practice of medicine
- 32 and surgery, podiatry, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 33 naturopathic medicine, psychology, chiropractic, physical
- 34 therapy, physical therapist assisting, nursing, dentistry,
- 35 dental hygiene, dental assisting, optometry, speech pathology,

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- 1 audiology, occupational therapy, occupational therapy
- 2 assisting, respiratory care, pharmacy, cosmetology arts and
- 3 sciences, barbering, social work, dietetics, marital and
- 4 family therapy or mental health counseling, massage therapy,
- 5 mortuary science, athletic training, acupuncture, nursing
- 6 home administration, hearing aid dispensing, or sign language
- 7 interpreting or transliterating, or shall not practice as a
- 8 physician assistant, unless the person has obtained a license
- 9 for that purpose from the board for the profession.
- 10 Sec. 3. Section 147.13, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- For medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and
- 13 surgery, and acupuncture, and naturopathic medicine, the board
- 14 of medicine.
- 15 Sec. 4. Section 147.74, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 16 following new subsection:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 22A. A naturopathic physician licensed
- 18 under chapter 148F may use the words "naturopathic physician",
- 19 "naturopathic doctor", "doctor of naturopathy", "naturopathic
- 20 medical doctor", "doctor of naturopathic medicine",
- 21 "naturopath" or the initials "N.D." or "N.M.D." after the
- 22 person's name.
- 23 Sec. 5. Section 147.107, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 24 following new subsection:
- 25 NEW SUBSECTION. 8A. Notwithstanding provisions of this
- 26 section to the contrary, a licensed naturopathic physician may
- 27 prescribe all substances and devices consistent within the
- 28 level of training of the naturopathic physician unless added
- 29 to the exclusionary naturopathic formulary by the naturopathic
- 30 advisory council.
- 31 Sec. 6. Section 148E.3, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 32 to read as follows:
- 33 1. A person otherwise licensed to practice medicine and
- 34 surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, naturopathic
- 35 <u>medicine</u>, chiropractic, podiatry, or dentistry who is

1 exclusively engaged in the practice of the person's profession.

- 2 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 148F.1 Definitions.
- 3 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 4 requires:
- 5 1. "Approved naturopathic medical program" means any of the 6 following:
- 7 a. A naturopathic medical education program in the
- 8 United States providing the degree of doctor of naturopathy
- 9 or doctor of naturopathic medicine. Such program shall
- 10 offer graduate-level, full-time didactic and supervised
- ll clinical training and shall be accredited, or shall have
- 12 achieved candidacy status for accreditation by the council
- 13 on naturopathic medical education or by an equivalent
- 14 federally recognized accrediting body for naturopathic medical
- 15 programs also recognized by the board. Additionally, the
- 16 program shall be an institution, or part of an institution of
- 17 higher education that is either accredited or is a candidate
- 18 for accreditation by a regional or national institutional
- 19 accrediting agency recognized by the United States secretary
- 20 of education.
- 21 b. A degree-granting college or university that, prior
- 22 to the existence of the council on naturopathic medicinal
- 23 education, offered a full-time, structured curriculum in
- 24 basic sciences and supervised patient care comprising a
- 25 doctoral naturopathic medical education; such curriculum, as
- 26 a prerequisite to graduation, consisted of not less than one
- 27 hundred thirty-two weeks of study and required completion
- 28 within a period of not less than thirty-five months; such
- 29 college or university of naturopathic medicine shall have been
- 30 reputable and in good standing in the judgment of the board,
- 31 and if still in existence, shall have current programmatic
- 32 accreditation by the council on naturopathic medical education
- 33 or an equivalent federally recognized accrediting agency.
- 34 c. A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent college or
- 35 university in Canada, that prior to accreditation by the

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- 1 council on naturopathic medical education, had provincial
- 2 approval for participation in government-funded student aid
- 3 programs, and that offered a full-time, structured curriculum
- 4 in basic sciences and supervised patient care comprising a
- 5 doctoral naturopathic medical education; such curriculum, as
- 6 a prerequisite to graduation, consisted of not less than one
- 7 hundred thirty-two weeks of study and required completion
- 8 within a period of not less than thirty-five months; such
- 9 college or university of liberal arts and naturopathic medicine
- 10 shall have been reputable and in good standing in the judgment
- 11 of the board and, if still in existence, shall have current
- 12 programmatic accreditation by the council of naturopathic
- 13 medical education or an equivalent federally recognized
- 14 accrediting agency. Additionally, the college or university
- 15 currently shall have provincial approval for participation in
- 16 government-funded student aid programs.
- 17 d. A diploma-granting, degree-equivalent college or
- 18 university in Canada that offers graduate-level, full-time
- 19 didactic and supervised clinical training and is accredited, or
- 20 has achieved candidacy status for accreditation by the council
- 21 on naturopathic medical education or an equivalent federally
- 22 recognized accrediting body for naturopathic medical programs
- 23 also recognized by the board; and the college or university
- 24 has provincial approval for participation in government-funded
- 25 student aid.
- 26 2. "Board" means the board of medicine established in
- 27 section 147.13.
- 28 3. "Director" means the executive director of the board of
- 29 medicine.
- 30 4. "Exclusionary naturopathic formulary" means the
- 31 exclusionary list of medicines, nonprescription and
- 32 prescription, which naturopathic physicians may not use in the
- 33 practice of their profession, as determined by the naturopathic
- 34 advisory council.
- 35 5. "Minor office procedures" means methods for the repair

- 1 and care incidental to superficial lacerations and abrasions,
- 2 superficial lesions, and the removal of foreign bodies located
- 3 in the superficial tissues.
- 4 6. "Naturopathic advisory council" means the naturopathic
- 5 advisory council as established under this chapter.
- 6 7. "Naturopathic childbirth attendance" means the specialty
- 7 practice of natural childbirth by a naturopathic physician that
- 8 includes the management of normal pregnancy, normal labor and
- 9 delivery, and the normal postpartum period, including normal
- 10 newborn care.
- 11 8. "Naturopathic medicine" means a system of primary health
- 12 care for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of human
- 13 health conditions, injury, and disease, and the promotion or
- 14 restoration of health. "Naturopathic medicine" includes the use
- 15 of physiological, psychological, or mechanical methods, and the
- 16 use of natural medicines, prescription or legend drugs, foods,
- 17 herbs, or other natural remedies.
- 9. "Naturopathic physician" means a practitioner of
- 19 naturopathic medicine who has been properly licensed for that
- 20 purpose by the board of medicine under this chapter, who may
- 21 diagnose, treat, and help prevent diseases using a system
- 22 of practice that is based on the natural healing capacity
- 23 of individuals, and may use physiological, psychological,
- 24 or mechanical methods, and may use natural medicines,
- 25 prescription, or legend drugs, foods, herbs, or other natural
- 26 remedies.
- 27 10. "Prescription drug" means any drug described in section
- 28 503(b) of the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. §
- 29 353, if its label is required to bear the symbol "RX only".
- 30 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 148F.2 Licensure naturopathic
- 31 medicine.
- 32 1. Qualifications for licensure. An applicant for a license
- 33 to practice naturopathic medicine shall be granted a license
- 34 by the board if the applicant satisfies all of the following
- 35 requirements:

- a. Submits an application for licensure designed and
 approved by the naturopathic advisory council.
- 3 b. Pays an application fee established by the board.
- 4 c. Has graduated from an approved naturopathic medical 5 program.
- 6 d. Has passed a competency-based national naturopathic
- 7 licensing examination administered by the north American board
- 8 of naturopathic examiners or successor agency, that has been
- 9 nationally recognized to administer a naturopathic examination
- 10 representing federal standards of education and training. For
- 11 applicants who completed an approved naturopathic medical
- 12 program located in Canada, eligibility for licensure may be
- 13 granted with evidence of successful passage of a Canadian
- 14 provincial competency examination.
- 15 e. Provides evidence that the applicant is of good ethical
- 16 and professional reputation. An applicant shall not have had
- 17 a license to practice naturopathic medicine or other health
- 18 care license registration or certificate refused, revoked,
- 19 or suspended by this state or any other jurisdiction for
- 20 reasons that relate to the applicant's ability to skillfully
- 21 and safely practice naturopathic medicine unless that license,
- 22 registration, or certification has been restored to good
- 23 standing.
- 24 f. Provides evidence that the applicant is physically and
- 25 mentally capable of safely practicing naturopathic medicine
- 26 with or without reasonable accommodation.
- 27 2. Term of license. A license granted pursuant to this
- 28 section shall be renewed every two years.
- 29 3. Natural childbirth attendance privileges. An applicant
- 30 seeking privileges to perform natural childbirth attendance
- 31 shall satisfy all of the additional requirements:
- 32 a. Graduation from a naturopathic midwifery or naturopathic
- 33 obstetrics program that is offered by an approved naturopathic
- 34 medical program.
- 35 b. Passage of the north American registry of midwives

- 1 examination or the American college of naturopathic
- 2 obstetricians examination.
- 3 c. The board may adopt other requirements by rule, based on
- 4 recommendations of the naturopathic advisory council.
- 5 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 148F.3 Use of title exceptions.
- 6 l. A person shall not represent that the person is a
- 7 naturopathic physician, a doctor of naturopathic medicine, a
- 8 doctor of naturopathy, a naturopath, or as being otherwise
- 9 authorized to practice naturopathic medicine in this state, or
- 10 use the titles "N.D." or "N.M.D." or any other titles, words,
- 11 letters, abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying that
- 12 the individual is a licensed naturopathic physician unless
- 13 the individual has been licensed as a naturopathic physician
- 14 pursuant to this chapter without first obtaining from the board
- 15 a license to practice naturopathic medicine pursuant to the
- 16 provisions of this chapter.
- 2. The practice of naturopathic medicine by a naturopathic
- 18 physician licensed pursuant to this chapter does not constitute
- 19 the practice of medicine and surgery under chapter 148, the
- 20 practice of osteopathic medicine and surgery under chapter 148,
- 21 or the practice of nursing under chapter 152.
- 22 3. This chapter and chapter 147 do not prevent qualified
- 23 members of other professions including but not limited
- 24 to individuals licensed under chapter 148, 150, 150A, or
- 25 152 from providing services consistent with the nature of
- 26 naturopathic medicine, but these persons shall not use a title
- 27 or description denoting that they are licensed naturopathic
- 28 physicians.
- 29 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 148F.4 Duties of board.
- 30 The board shall adopt rules consistent with this chapter,
- 31 chapter 147, and as recommended by the naturopathic advisory
- 32 council which are necessary for the performance of its duties.
- 33 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 148F.5 Naturopathic advisory council.
- A naturopathic advisory council is established,
- 35 consisting of the following members:

- 1 a. Three members who are naturopathic physicians eligible
- 2 for licensure, appointed by the governor.
- 3 b. One member who is a pharmacist licensed in Iowa,
- 4 appointed by the governor.
- 5 c. One member who is a medical or osteopathic physician
- 6 licensed in Iowa, who has expertise in natural or integrative
- 7 medicine.
- 8 2. Members shall not receive per diem or expense payments.
- 9 3. Members shall serve two-year terms, and shall serve until
- 10 their successors have been appointed.
- 11 4. The council shall select a chairperson from its
- 12 membership.
- 13 Sec. 12. NEW SECTION. 148F.6 Council powers and duties.
- 14 The naturopathic advisory council shall do all of the
- 15 following:
- 16 l. Advise the board regarding standards for licensed
- 17 naturopathic physicians.
- 18 2. Provide for distribution of information regarding
- 19 licensed naturopathic physician standards.
- 3. Advise the board on enforcement issues.
- 21 4. Review applications for licensure and license renewal
- 22 and recommend the granting or denial thereof.
- 23 5. Advise the board on issues related to receiving and
- 24 investigating complaints, conducting hearings, and imposing
- 25 disciplinary action in relation to complaints against licensed
- 26 naturopathic physicians.
- 27 6. Review naturopathic education and training for and
- 28 make specific recommendations to the board regarding the
- 29 qualifications to practice naturopathic childbirth attendance.
- 30 7. Recommend to the board any prescription drugs which
- 31 should be included on the exclusionary naturopathic formulary.
- 32 8. Advise the board regarding approval of continuing
- 33 education programs specific to naturopathic practice.
- 34 Sec. 13. NEW SECTION. 148F.7 Scope of practice.
- 35 A naturopathic physician may do any of the following:

- 1. Order and perform physical and laboratory examinations
- 2 consistent with naturopathic education and training for
- 3 diagnostic purposes, including but not limited to phlebotomy,
- 4 clinical laboratory tests, orificial examinations, and
- 5 physiological function tests.
- 6 2. Order diagnostic imaging studies consistent with
- 7 naturopathic training. All diagnostic tests not consistent
- 8 with naturopathic medical education and training must be
- 9 referred for performance and interpretation to an appropriately
- 10 licensed health care professional.
- 11 3. Dispense, administer, order, and prescribe, provide, or
- 12 perform the following, as applicable:
- 13 a. Food, extracts of food, nutraceuticals, vitamins, amino
- 14 acids, minerals, enzymes, botanicals and their extracts,
- 15 botanical medicines, homeopathic medicines, and all dietary
- 16 supplements and nonprescription drugs as defined by the federal
- 17 Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, 21 U.S.C. § 301 et seq.
- 18 b. Prescription or legend drugs and hormonal replacement.
- 19 c. Hot or cold hydrotherapy, naturopathic physical medicine,
- 20 and therapeutic exercise.
- 21 d. Devices, including but not limited to therapeutic
- 22 devices, barrier contraception, and durable medical equipment.
- 23 e. Health education and health counseling.
- 24 f. Repair and care incidental to superficial lacerations and
- 25 abrasions.
- 26 g. Removal of foreign bodies located in the superficial
- 27 tissues.
- 28 h. Musculoskeletal manipulation consistent with
- 29 naturopathic education and training.
- Utilize routes of administration that include oral,
- 31 nasal, auricular, ocular, rectal, vaginal, transdermal,
- 32 intradermal, subcutaneous, intravenous, and intramuscular
- 33 consistent with the education and training of a naturopathic
- 34 physician.
- 35 5. Perform all therapies as trained and educated, and

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- 1 approved by the naturopathic advisory council.
- 2 Sec. 14. NEW SECTION. 148F.8 Prohibitions.
- 3 A naturopathic physician licensed under this chapter shall
- 4 not do any of the following:
- Perform or induce abortions.
- 6 2. Perform surgical procedures except those minor office
- 7 procedures authorized by this chapter.
- 8 3. Practice or claim to practice as a medical or osteopathic
- 9 physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, psychologist,
- 10 advanced practice registered nurse, physician assistant,
- 11 chiropractor, physical therapist, acupuncturist, or any other
- 12 health care provider not authorized in this chapter unless
- 13 licensed by the state of Iowa as such.
- 14 4. Use general or spinal anesthetics.
- 15 5. Administer ionizing radioactive substances for
- 16 therapeutic purposes.
- 6. Administer or prescribe chemotherapeutic medications for
- 18 the purpose of cancer treatment.
- 7. Perform surgical procedures of the eye, ear, nerves,
- 20 veins, or arteries extending beyond superficial tissue.
- 21 Sec. 15. NEW SECTION. 148F.9 Exemptions.
- Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prohibit or
- 23 restrict:
- 1. The practice of a profession by individuals who are
- 25 licensed, certified, or registered under other laws of this
- 26 state who are performing services within their authorized scope
- 27 of practice.
- 28 2. The practice of naturopathic medicine by an individual
- 29 employed by the government of the United States while the
- 30 individual is engaged in the performance of duties prescribed
- 31 by the laws and regulations of the United States.
- 32 3. The practice of naturopathic medicine by students
- 33 enrolled in an approved naturopathic medical program. The
- 34 performance of services shall be pursuant to a course of
- 35 instruction or assignments from an instructor and under the

- 1 supervision of the instructor. The instructor shall be a
- 2 naturopathic physician licensed pursuant to this chapter or a
- 3 duly licensed professional in the instructed field.
- 4. Persons from treating themselves and family members
- 5 based on religious or health beliefs.
- 6 5. Persons who sell vitamins and herbs from providing
- 7 information about their products.
- 8 6. Persons or practitioners from advising in the use of
- 9 a therapy, including but not limited to: herbal medicine,
- 10 homeopathy, nutrition, or other nondrug or nonsurgical therapy
- 11 that is within the scope of practice of naturopathic physicians
- 12 as outlined in this chapter as long as such therapy is lawful,
- 13 or, if a licensed health care provider, within the scope of
- 14 practice of the profession; and provided that such person is
- 15 not using a title protected pursuant to this chapter or holding
- 16 themselves out to be a naturopathic physician.
- 7. The practice of naturopathic medicine by persons who
- 18 are licensed to practice in any other state as practicing
- 19 naturopathic physicians, who enter this state to consult with
- 20 a licensed naturopathic physician in this state; provided,
- 21 however, that the consultation is to be limited to examination,
- 22 recommendation, or testimony in litigation.
- 23 EXPLANATION
- 24 This bill requires the licensing of naturopathic physicians.
- 25 The bill provides that the practice of naturopathic medicine
- 26 means the provision of naturopathic services defined as a
- 27 system of primary health care for the prevention, diagnosis,
- 28 and treatment of human health conditions, injury, and disease,
- 29 and the promotion or restoration of health. Naturopathic
- 30 medicine includes the use of physiological, psychological,
- 31 or mechanical methods, and the use of natural medicines,
- 32 prescription or legend drugs, foods, herbs, or other natural
- 33 remedies. The bill specifies qualifications for licensure and
- 34 the scope of practice for a naturopathic physician, and details
- 35 functions that a naturopathic physician may not perform.

- 1 The practice of naturopathic medicine is regulated by the
- 2 board of medicine, with the advice of a naturopathic advisory
- 3 council. The council consists of five members, three of
- 4 whom are naturopathic physicians, one medical or osteopathic
- 5 physician, and a pharmacist. The council does not receive per
- 6 diem or expenses.
- 7 The bill provides that qualified members of other
- 8 professions, including physicians and nurses, are not prevented
- 9 from providing services consistent with naturopathic medicine,
- 10 but these persons shall not use a title or description denoting
- 11 that they are naturopathic physicians. The bill sets out these
- 12 titles.
