- 16 EXPLANATION
- 17 GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural
- 18 resources by making appropriations for the 2011-2012 fiscal
- 19 year to support related entities, including the department of
- 20 agriculture and land stewardship, the department of natural
- 21 resources, and Iowa state university.
- The bill appropriates moneys to the department of
- 23 agriculture and land stewardship and the department of natural
- 24 resources. The appropriations are made to support those
- 25 departments for administration, regulation, and programs. The
- 26 bill requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to
- 27 the general assembly and department of management regarding the
- 28 expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
- 29 moneys to support specific programs or projects administered by
- 30 those departments. The bill appropriates moneys from a number
- 31 of sources, including the general fund of the state, the state
- 32 fish and game protection fund, the groundwater protection fund,
- 33 and the environment first fund. The bill is organized into
- 34 divisions.
- 35 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP. For the

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- 1 department of agriculture and land stewardship, moneys are
- 2 appropriated in order to support its divisions.
- 3 The bill appropriates moneys from the general fund of the
- 4 state to support designated programs, including horse and dog
- 5 racing, motor fuel inspection, and agricultural education.
- 6 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES. For the department of
- 7 natural resources, moneys are appropriated from the general
- 8 fund in order to support its divisions.
- 9 The bill makes appropriations from other funds. The bill
- 10 appropriates moneys to the department of natural resources from
- 11 the state fish and game protection fund to support programs
- 12 related to fish and wildlife. The bill appropriates moneys
- 13 from the groundwater protection fund to support groundwater
- 14 quality. The bill appropriates moneys from the snowmobile fund
- 15 to the department for snowmobile programs.
- 16 The bill includes miscellaneous provisions. An
- 17 appropriation is made from the unassigned revenue fund
- 18 administered by the Iowa comprehensive underground storage
- 19 tank fund board to the department of natural resources for
- 20 administration and expenses of the underground storage tank
- 21 section.
- 22 The bill provides that the department of natural
- 23 resources may use additional funds for staffing to reduce the
- 24 department's floodplain permit backlog and implementing the
- 25 federal maximum daily load program.
- 26 ELIMINATION OF POSITIONS AND EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS. The
- 27 bill eliminates the chief and assistant chief of the law
- 28 enforcement bureau of the department of natural resources. It
- 29 authorizes the department of natural resources to use savings
- 30 from the elimination to support two conservation officers.
- 31 IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY. The bill appropriates moneys from
- 32 the general fund of the state for the operation of the Iowa
- 33 state university's veterinary diagnostic laboratory.
- 34 IOWA RESOURCES ENHANCEMENT AND PROTECTION FUND. The
- 35 bill appropriates moneys from the environment first fund to

- 1 support a number of programs administered by the department
- 2 of agriculture and land stewardship and the department of
- 3 natural resources. The bill also appropriates moneys from the
- 4 environment first fund to the Iowa resources enhancement and
- 5 protection fund in lieu of the \$20 million appropriated by Code
- 6 section 455A.18 from the general fund of the state.
- 7 RELATED MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS. The department of
- 8 agriculture and land stewardship must submit a report to
- 9 the governor and general assembly inventorying agricultural
- 10 drainage wells that remain unclosed.
- 11 RELATED STATUTORY CHANGES. The bill amends a provision
- 12 in Code section 455G.3 establishing an Iowa comprehensive
- 13 petroleum underground storage tank fund and provides an annual
- 14 standing limited appropriation from the fund to the department
- 15 of natural resources to support technical reviews of leaking
- 16 underground storage tank assessments. The bill also addresses
- 17 a one-time appropriation for database modifications regarding
- 18 inspections conducted by nongovernmental entities. The bill
- 19 provides that the appropriated moneys do not revert.
