## Senate Study Bill 3002 - Introduced

## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to mandatory reporting of school employee 2 misconduct to the board of educational examiners. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section l. Section 272.15, subsection 1 , paragraphs a and c, Code Supplement 2011, are amended to read as follows:
a. (l) The board of directors of a school district or area education agency, an administrator of a school district, the chief administrator of an area education agency, and the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school shall report to the board any instance of disciplinary action taken against a licensed school employee by the board of directors of the school district or area education agency, the administrator of the school district, the chief administrator of the area education agency, or the authorities in charge of the accredited nonpublic school.
(2) The board of directors of a school district or area education agency, the superintendent an administrator of a school district $\theta \underset{f}{ }$, the chief administrator of an area education agency, and the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school shall report to the board the nonrenewal or termination, for reasons of alleged or actual misconduct, of a person's contract executed under sections 279.12, 279.13, 279.15 through 279.21, 279.23, and 279.24, and the resignation of a person who holds a license, certificate, or authorization issued by the board as a result of or following an incident or allegation of misconduct that, if proven, would constitute a violation of the xules standards of professional conduct and ethics adopted by the board to implement section 272.2 , subsection 14 , paragraph " $b$ " subparagraph (1) in 282 IAC 25 , when the board or reporting official has a good faith belief that the incident occurred or the allegation is true. The board may deny a license or revoke the license of an administrator if the board finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the administrator failed to report the termination or resignation of a school employee holding a license, certificate, statement of professional recognition, or coaching authorization, for reasons of alleged or actual misconduct, as defined by this section.

Sec. 2. Section 272.15, subsection 2, Code Supplement 2011,
is amended to read as follows:
2. If, in the course of performing official duties, an employee of the department becomes aware of any alleged

13 employee shall report the alleged misconduct to the board
14 of educational examiners under rules adopted purguant to
15 subsection $l$ by the board.
c. For purposes of this section, unless the context otherwise requires, "misconduct" means an action disqualifying an applicant for a license or causing the license of a person to be revoked or suspended in accordance with the fules standards of professional conduct and ethics adopted by the board to implement section 272.2 , gubsection 14 , paragraph " $b$ " subpaxagraph (l) in 282 IAC 25.

## EXPLANATION

This bill requires the board of directors of a school district or area education agency, an administrator of a school district, the chief administrator of an area education agency, and the authorities in charge of an accredited nonpublic school to report any instance of disciplinary action taken against a licensed school employee to the board of educational examiners.

The bill also modifies the definition of misconduct for the purposes of mandatory reporting of school employee misconduct to the board of educational examiners to cite directly to the standards of professional conduct and ethics set out in the board's rules.
