A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the renewal period for foster care
- 2 licensing.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 237.5, subsection 1, Code 2011, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- An individual or an agency shall apply for a license
- 4 by completing an application to the administrator upon forms
- 5 furnished by the administrator. The administrator shall issue
- 6 or reissue a license if the administrator determines that
- 7 the applicant or licensee is or upon commencing operation
- 8 will provide child foster care in compliance with this
- 9 chapter. A license for an individual is valid for one year
- 10 two years from the date of issuance. A license for an agency
- ll is valid for up to three years from the date of issuance
- 12 for the period determined by the administrator in accordance
- 13 with administrative rules providing criteria for making the
- 14 determination. The license shall state on its face the name of
- 15 the licensee, the type of facility, the particular premises for
- 16 which the license is issued, and the number of children who may
- 17 be cared for by the facility on the premises at one time. The
- 18 license shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the physical
- 19 plant of the facility, except that if the facility is in a
- 20 single-family home the license may be kept where it is readily
- 21 available for examination upon request.
- Sec. 2. Section 237.5A, Code 2011, is amended to read as
- 23 follows:
- 24 237.5A Foster parent training.
- 25 l. As a condition for initial licensure, each individual
- 26 licensee shall complete thirty hours of foster parent
- 27 training offered or approved by the department. However,
- 28 if the licensee has completed relevant training or has a
- 29 combination of completed relevant training and experience,
- 30 and the department deems such training or combination to
- 31 be an acceptable equivalent to all or a portion of the
- 32 initial licensure training requirement, or based upon the
- 33 circumstances of the child and the licensee the department
- 34 finds there is other good cause, the department may waive all
- 35 or a portion of the training requirement. Prior to annual

- 1 renewal of licensure, each individual licensee shall also
- 2 complete six hours of foster parent training. The training
- 3 shall include but is not limited to physical care, education,
- 4 learning disabilities, referral to and receipt of necessary
- 5 professional services, behavioral assessment and modification,
- 6 self-assessment, self-living skills, and biological parent
- 7 contact. An individual licensee may complete the training as
- 8 part of an approved training program offered by a public or
- 9 private agency with expertise in the provision of child foster
- 10 care or in related subject areas. The department shall adopt
- 11 rules to implement and enforce this training requirement.
- 12 2. A licensee who is unable to complete six hours of foster
- 13 parent training prior to annual licensure renewal because the
- 14 licensee is engaged in active duty in the military service
- 15 shall be considered to be in compliance with the training
- 16 requirement for annual licensure renewal.
- 17 EXPLANATION
- 18 This bill relates to the renewal period for foster care
- 19 licensing. The bill amends Code section 237.5 to increase
- 20 the time period a foster care license for an individual is
- 21 valid from one year to two years. The bill provides that an
- 22 individual licensee shall complete six hours of foster parent
- 23 training prior to licensure renewal rather than completing six
- 24 hours of training prior to the annual licensure renewal.
