A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for the licensing of polysomnographic
- 2 technologists and providing for a penalty.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. Section 147.1, subsections 3 and 6, Code 2011,
- 2 are amended to read as follows:
- 3 3. "Licensed" or "certified", when applied to a physician
- 4 and surgeon, podiatric physician, osteopathic physician and
- 5 surgeon, physician assistant, psychologist, chiropractor,
- 6 nurse, dentist, dental hygienist, dental assistant,
- 7 optometrist, speech pathologist, audiologist, pharmacist,
- 8 physical therapist, physical therapist assistant, occupational
- 9 therapist, occupational therapy assistant, respiratory care
- 10 practitioner, practitioner of cosmetology arts and sciences,
- 11 practitioner of barbering, funeral director, dietitian, marital
- 12 and family therapist, mental health counselor, polysomnographic
- 13 technologist, social worker, massage therapist, athletic
- 14 trainer, acupuncturist, nursing home administrator, hearing aid
- 15 dispenser, or sign language interpreter or transliterator means
- 16 a person licensed under this subtitle.
- 17 6. "Profession" means medicine and surgery, podiatry,
- 18 osteopathic medicine and surgery, practice as a physician
- 19 assistant, psychology, chiropractic, nursing, dentistry,
- 20 dental hygiene, dental assisting, optometry, speech pathology,
- 21 audiology, pharmacy, physical therapy, physical therapist
- 22 assisting, occupational therapy, occupational therapy
- 23 assisting, respiratory care, cosmetology arts and sciences,
- 24 barbering, mortuary science, marital and family therapy, mental
- 25 health counseling, polysomnography, social work, dietetics,
- 26 massage therapy, athletic training, acupuncture, nursing home
- 27 administration, hearing aid dispensing, or sign language
- 28 interpreting or transliterating.
- 29 Sec. 2. Section 147.2, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 30 to read as follows:
- 31 1. A person shall not engage in the practice of medicine
- 32 and surgery, podiatry, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 33 psychology, chiropractic, physical therapy, physical therapist
- 34 assisting, nursing, dentistry, dental hygiene, dental
- 35 assisting, optometry, speech pathology, audiology, occupational

- 1 therapy, occupational therapy assisting, respiratory care,
- 2 pharmacy, cosmetology arts and sciences, barbering, social
- 3 work, dietetics, marital and family therapy or mental health
- 4 counseling, massage therapy, mortuary science, polysomnography,
- 5 athletic training, acupuncture, nursing home administration,
- 6 hearing aid dispensing, or sign language interpreting
- 7 or transliterating, or shall not practice as a physician
- 8 assistant, unless the person has obtained a license for that
- 9 purpose from the board for the profession.
- 10 Sec. 3. Section 147.13, subsection 1, Code 2011, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 1. For medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and
- 13 surgery, and acupuncture, and polysomnography, the board of
- 14 medicine.
- 15 Sec. 4. Section 147.74, Code 2011, is amended by adding the
- 16 following new subsection:
- 17 NEW SUBSECTION. 22A. A person who is licensed to engage
- 18 in the practice of polysomnography shall have the right to use
- 19 the title "polysomnographic technologist" or the abbreviation
- 20 "P.S.G.T.".
- 21 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 148F.1 Definitions.
- 22 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
- 23 requires:
- 24 1. "Board" means the board of medicine established in
- 25 chapter 147.
- 26 2. "Committee" means the polysomnography professional
- 27 standards committee established in section 148F.5.
- 28 3. "Direct supervision" means that the polysomnographic
- 29 technologist providing supervision must be present in the
- 30 area where the polysomnographic procedure is being performed
- 31 and immediately available to furnish assistance and direction
- 32 throughout the performance of the procedure.
- 33 4. "General supervision" means that the polysomnographic
- 34 procedure is provided under a physician's overall direction and
- 35 control, but the physician's presence is not required during

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- 1 the performance of the procedure.
- 2 5. "Physician" means a person who is currently licensed in
- 3 Iowa to practice medicine and surgery or osteopathic medicine
- 4 and surgery.
- 5 6. "Polysomnographic student" means a person who is enrolled
- 6 in a commission on accreditation of allied health education
- 7 program or an equivalent program as determined by the board,
- 8 and who may provide sleep-related services under the direct
- 9 supervision of a polysomnographic technologist as a part of the
- 10 person's educational program.
- 11 7. "Polysomnographic technician" means a person who has
- 12 graduated from a commission on accreditation of allied health
- 13 education program or an equivalent program as determined by the
- 14 board but has not yet passed an accepted national credentialing
- 15 examination given by an approved certifying agency, who has
- 16 obtained a temporary permit from the board, and who may provide
- 17 sleep-related services under the general supervision of a
- 18 licensed physician.
- 19 8. "Polysomnographic technologist" means a person who is
- 20 credentialed by an approved certifying agency and is licensed
- 21 by the board to engage in the practice of polysomnography under
- 22 the general supervision of a physician.
- 9. "Polysomnographic trainee" means a person who is enrolled
- 24 in an accredited sleep technologist educational program that is
- 25 accredited by the American academy of sleep medicine and who
- 26 may provide sleep-related services under the direct supervision
- 27 of a polysomnographic technologist as a part of the person's
- 28 educational program.
- 29 10. "Practice of polysomnography" means as described in
- 30 section 148F.2.
- 31 11. "Sleep-related services" means acts performed by
- 32 polysomnographic technicians, polysomnographic trainees,
- 33 polysomnographic students, and other persons permitted to
- 34 perform those services under this chapter, in a setting
- 35 described in this chapter that would be considered the

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- 1 practice of polysomnography if performed by a polysomnographic
 2 technologist.
- 3 Sec. 6. NEW SECTION. 148F.2 Practice of polysomnography.
- 4 The practice of polysomnography consists of the following
- 5 tasks, under the general supervision of a licensed physician:
- 6 l. Monitoring, recording, and evaluating physiologic data
- 7 during the evaluation of sleep-related disorders, including
- 8 sleep-related respiratory disturbances, by applying any of the
- 9 following techniques, equipment, or procedures:
- 10 a. Noninvasive continuous, bilevel positive airway pressure,
- 11 or adaptive servo-ventilation titration on spontaneously
- 12 breathing patients using a mask or oral appliance; provided,
- 13 that the mask or oral appliance does not extend into the
- 14 trachea or attach to an artificial airway.
- 15 b. Supplemental low-flow oxygen therapy of less than six
- 16 liters per minute, utilizing a nasal cannula or incorporated
- 17 into a positive airway pressure device during a polysomnogram.
- 18 c. Capnography during a polysomnogram.
- 19 d. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
- 20 e. Pulse oximetry.
- 21 f. Gastroesophageal pH monitoring.
- 22 g. Esophageal pressure monitoring.
- 23 h. Sleep stage recording using surface
- 24 electroencephalography, surface electrooculography, and surface
- 25 submental electromyography.
- 26 i. Surface electromyography.
- j. Electrocardiography.
- 28 k. Respiratory effort monitoring, including thoracic and
- 29 abdominal movement.
- 30 1. Plethysmography blood flow monitoring.
- 31 *m.* Snore monitoring.
- 32 n. Audio and video monitoring.
- 33 o. Body movement monitoring.
- 34 p. Nocturnal penile tumescence monitoring.
- 35 q. Nasal and oral airflow monitoring.

- 1 r. Body temperature monitoring.
- Monitoring the effects that a mask or oral appliance
- 3 used to treat sleep disorders has on sleep patterns; provided,
- 4 however, that the mask or oral appliance shall not extend into
- 5 the trachea or attach to an artificial airway.
- 6 3. Observing and monitoring physical signs and symptoms,
- 7 general behavior, and general physical response to
- 8 polysomnographic evaluation and determining whether initiation,
- 9 modification, or discontinuation of a treatment regimen is
- 10 warranted.
- 11 4. Analyzing and scoring data collected during the
- 12 monitoring described in this section for the purpose of
- 13 assisting a physician in the diagnosis and treatment of sleep
- 14 and wake disorders that result from developmental defects,
- 15 the aging process, physical injury, disease, or actual or
- 16 anticipated somatic dysfunction.
- 17 5. Implementation of a written or verbal order from a
- 18 licensed physician to perform polysomnography.
- 19 6. Education of a patient regarding the treatment regimen
- 20 that assists the patient in improving the patient's sleep.
- 7. Use of any oral appliance used to treat sleep-disordered
- 22 breathing while under the care of a licensed polysomnographic
- 23 technologist during the performance of a sleep study, as
- 24 directed by a licensed dentist.
- 25 Sec. 7. NEW SECTION. 148F.3 Location of services.
- 26 The practice of polysomnography shall take place only in a
- 27 hospital, a stand-alone sleep laboratory or sleep center, or
- 28 in the patient's residence in accordance with a physician's
- 29 order; provided, however, that the scoring of data and the
- 30 education of patients may take place in settings other than in
- 31 a hospital, sleep laboratory, sleep center, or the patient's
- 32 residence.
- 33 Sec. 8. NEW SECTION. 148F.4 Scope of chapter.
- 34 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit or
- 35 restrict a health care practitioner licensed in this state from

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- 1 engaging in the full scope of practice of the individual's
- 2 profession.
- 3 Sec. 9. NEW SECTION. 148F.5 Polysomnography professional
- 4 standards committee.
- 5 l. A polysomnography professional standards committee is
- 6 established to advise the board in the performance of its
- 7 duties under this chapter. The committee consists of the
- 8 following members, appointed by the governor:
- 9 a. Two licensed polysomnographic technologists.
- 10 b. One physician who is certified in sleep medicine by a
- ll national certifying body recognized by the American academy of
- 12 sleep medicine.
- 13 c. One respiratory therapist who is also a licensed
- 14 polysomnographic technologist.
- 15 d. One electroneurodiagnostic technologist who is also a
- 16 licensed polysomnographic technologist.
- 17 e. One consumer member who is not commercially or
- 18 professionally associated with the health care field.
- 19 2. Members shall receive expense payments and per diem as
- 20 provided in section 147.24.
- 3. Members shall serve four-year terms, and shall serve
- 22 until their successors have been appointed.
- 23 4. The committee shall select a chairperson from its
- 24 membership.
- 25 5. A majority of the committee shall constitute a quorum.
- 26 6. The board shall provide administrative, investigatory,
- 27 and clerical services to the committee as necessary to
- 28 implement and enforce this chapter.
- 7. Any vacant term shall be filled by the governor for the
- 30 balance of the four-year term.
- 31 Sec. 10. NEW SECTION. 148F.6 Duties of the committee.
- 32 The polysomnography professional standards committee shall

- 33 do all of the following:
- 34 1. Advise the board regarding standards for licensed
- 35 polysomnographic technologists.

- Provide for distribution of information regarding
- 2 licensed polysomnographic technologist standards.
- 3. Advise the board on enforcement issues.
- 4 4. Review applications for licensure and license renewal
- 5 and recommend the granting or denial thereof.
- 6 5. Advise the board on issues related to receiving and
- 7 investigating complaints, conducting hearings, and imposing
- 8 disciplinary action in relation to complaints against licensed
- 9 polysomnographic technologists.
- 10 6. Review polysomnographic technology education and
- ll training for and make specific recommendations to the board
- 12 regarding the qualifications to practice.
- 7. Advise the board regarding approval of continuing
- 14 education programs.
- 15 Sec. 11. NEW SECTION. 148F.7 Powers of the board.
- 16 The board, with the advice of the polysomnography
- 17 professional standards committee, may do any of the following:
- 18 1. Promulgate rules necessary for the implementation and
- 19 administration of this chapter and the applicable provisions
- 20 of chapter 147.
- 21 2. Establish fees as provided in section 147.80.
- 22 3. Review and approve or reject the application of each
- 23 person who applies for licensure as a polysomnographic
- 24 technologist.
- 25 4. Issue all temporary permits and all approved licenses and
- 26 renewals of licenses.
- 27 5. Deny, suspend, revoke, restrict, or impose conditions
- 28 on a license, as the board deems necessary or appropriate at
- 29 the time a license is issued, renewed, or reinstated, or as a
- 30 sanction imposed at the conclusion of a disciplinary hearing.
- 31 6. Issue private advisory letter rulings to any person
- 32 licensed under this chapter who makes a request for a ruling
- 33 regarding any matter within the committee's jurisdiction;
- 34 provided, however, that the ruling shall affect only the
- 35 licensee making the inquiry and shall have no precedential

1 value for any other contested case or inquiry before the board
2 or the committee.

- 3 7. Develop a code of ethics for the practice of
- 4 polysomnography.
- 8. Develop standards of care for the practice of
- 6 polysomnography.
- 7 9. Develop standards for the educational and clinical
- 8 training of polysomnographic technologists, including the
- 9 evaluation of the accreditation status of educational programs
- 10 in polysomnography.
- 11 10. Develop criteria for the evaluation of applications for
- 12 licensure submitted by polysomnographic technologists who are
- 13 licensed in other states.
- 14 ll. Develop continuing education requirements for licensed
- 15 polysomnographic technologists.
- 16 Sec. 12. NEW SECTION. 148F.8 Licensing requirement.
- 17 l. a. Commencing January 1, 2013, a person who is engaged
- 18 in the practice of polysomnography shall be licensed as
- 19 provided in this chapter and it shall be unlawful for any
- 20 person to engage in the practice of polysomnography without
- 21 such license.
- 22 b. (1) Prior to January 1, 2013, a person who is engaged in
- 23 the practice of polysomnography without being licensed under
- 24 this chapter shall not be deemed to be in violation of this
- 25 chapter.
- 26 (2) A person who is engaged in the practice of
- 27 polysomnography on January 1, 2013, shall be eligible for
- 28 licensure under this chapter without meeting the educational
- 29 requirements of this section provided that the person meets the
- 30 requirements of subsection 2, paragraphs "b", "c", and "d".
- 31 2. A person seeking licensure as a polysomnographic
- 32 technologist shall be of good moral character, shall be at
- 33 least eighteen years of age, shall pay the fees established
- 34 by the board for licensure, and shall present proof that the
- 35 person meets all of the following requirements:

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- 1 a. Meet one of the following educational requirements:
- 2 (1) Graduation from a polysomnographic educational program
- 3 that is accredited by the committee on accreditation of
- 4 polysomnographic technologist education or by a committee
- 5 on accreditation for the commission on accreditation of
- 6 allied health education programs, or an equivalent program as
- 7 determined by the board.
- 8 (2) Graduation from a respiratory care educational
- 9 program that is accredited by the committee on accreditation
- 10 for respiratory care or by a committee on accreditation
- 11 for the commission on accreditation of allied health
- 12 education programs, and completion of the curriculum for a
- 13 polysomnographic certificate established and accredited by the
- 14 commission on accreditation of allied health education programs
- 15 as an extension of the respiratory care program.
- 16 (3) Graduation from an electroneurodiagnostic technologist
- 17 educational program that is accredited by the committee
- 18 on accreditation for education in electroneurodiagnostic
- 19 technology or by a committee on accreditation for the
- 20 commission on accreditation of allied health education
- 21 programs, and completion of the curriculum for a
- 22 polysomnography certificate established and accredited by the
- 23 commission on accreditation of allied health education programs
- 24 as an extension of the electroneurodiagnostic education
- 25 program.
- 26 (4) Successful completion of an accredited sleep
- 27 technologist educational program that is accredited by the
- 28 American academy of sleep medicine.
- 29 b. Pass the national certifying examination given by
- 30 the board of registered polysomnographic technologists or a
- 31 nationally recognized accredited certifying agency.
- c. Be credentialed by the board of registered
- 33 polysomnographic technologists or a nationally recognized
- 34 accredited certifying agency.
- 35 d. Meet any additional educational or clinical requirements

1 established by the board, as recommended by the committee.

- 2 3. To be eligible for renewal of a license to engage in the
- 3 practice of polysomnography, a polysomnographic technologist
- 4 shall maintain that person's credential in compliance with
- 5 rules set forth by a national accredited certifying agency, as
- 6 adopted by the board in rule.
- 7 Sec. 13. NEW SECTION. 148F.9 Persons exempt from licensing
- 8 requirement temporary permit.
- 9 1. The following persons may provide sleep-related services
- 10 without being licensed as a polysomnographic technologist under
- 11 this chapter:
- 12 a. A polysomnographic technician may provide sleep-related
- 13 services under the general supervision of a physician for
- 14 a period of up to six months from the date of the person's
- 15 graduation from one of the accredited programs described in
- 16 section 148F.8. The board may in its sole discretion grant a
- 17 one-time extension of up to three months beyond this one-year
- 18 period.
- 19 b. A polysomnographic trainee may provide sleep-related
- 20 services under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic
- 21 technologist as a part of the person's educational program
- 22 while actively enrolled in an accredited sleep technologist
- 23 educational program.
- 24 c. A polysomnographic student may provide sleep-related
- 25 services under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic
- 26 technologist as a part of the person's educational program
- 27 while actively enrolled in a polysomnographic educational
- 28 program that is accredited by the commission on accreditation
- 29 of allied health education programs or an equivalent program as
- 30 determined by the board.
- d. A person, other than a respiratory care practitioner
- 32 licensed under this chapter, credentialed in one of the
- 33 health-related fields accepted by the board of registered
- 34 polysomnographic technologists or another nationally recognized
- 35 certifying agency, may provide sleep-related services under

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- 1 the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist
- 2 for a period of up to one year while obtaining the clinical
- 3 experience necessary to be eligible to take the examination.
- 4 2. Before providing any sleep-related services, a
- 5 polysomnographic technician shall obtain a temporary permit
- 6 from the board. While providing sleep-related services, the
- 7 technician shall wear a badge that appropriately identifies the
- 8 person as a polysomnographic technician.
- 9 3. Before providing any sleep-related services, a
- 10 polysomnographic trainee shall give notice to the board that
- 11 the trainee is enrolled in an approved educational program.
- 12 Trainees shall wear a badge that appropriately identifies the
- 13 trainee as a polysomnographic trainee while providing such
- 14 services.
- 15 4. Before providing any sleep-related services, a person
- 16 who is obtaining clinical experience shall give notice to the
- 17 board that the person is working under the direct supervision
- 18 of a polysomnographic technologist in order to gain the
- 19 experience to be eligible to sit for a national certification
- 20 examination. The person shall wear a badge that appropriately
- 21 identifies the person while providing such services.
- 22 5. Polysomnographic students shall not receive compensation
- 23 for the sleep-related services they provide and shall wear
- 24 badges that appropriately identify them as students.
- 25 Sec. 14. NEW SECTION. 148F.10 Issuance, retirement, and
- 26 renewal of licenses.
- 27 1. The board shall issue and renew licenses under this
- 28 chapter as provided by the board in rule.
- 29 2. A person who has been issued a license to practice under
- 30 this chapter who wishes to retire that license shall file with
- 31 the committee an affidavit on a form to be furnished by the
- 32 committee stating the date on which the person retired from
- 33 practice and other facts that verify the retirement as the
- 34 board deems necessary. Any such person who thereafter wishes
- 35 to reenter practice shall request reinstatement of licensure.

- 3. A license issued by the board under this chapter
- 2 shall contain the name and address of the person to whom it
- 3 is issued, the date and number of the license, and other
- 4 information that the board deems necessary.
- 5 a. The address contained on the license shall be the address
- 6 where all correspondence and renewal forms from the board shall
- 7 be sent.
- 8 b. Any person whose address changes shall, within thirty
- 9 days after the change in address, notify the board of the
- 10 address change. The most recent address contained in the
- 11 board's records for each license holder shall be the address
- 12 deemed sufficient for purposes of service of process.
- 13 4. A license shall either be prominently displayed in the
- 14 office or place in which the person practices or be stored in a
- 15 place from which it can be immediately produced upon request of
- 16 a patient or representative of the board.
- 17 5. A person whose license has been lost may make application
- 18 to the committee for a replacement. The application shall be
- 19 accompanied by an affidavit setting out the facts concerning
- 20 the loss of the original license.
- 21 Sec. 15. NEW SECTION. 148F.11 Licensing sanctions.
- 22 The board may impose sanctions for violations of this
- 23 chapter as provided in chapters 147 and 272C.
- 24 Sec. 16. INITIAL APPOINTMENTS.
- 25 l. Initial appointments to the polysomnography professional
- 26 standards committee shall be made as follows: two members
- 27 shall be appointed to terms of four years, two members shall
- 28 be appointed to terms of three years, and two members shall be
- 29 appointed to a term of two years. Each regular appointment
- 30 thereafter shall be for a term of four years.
- 31 2. The governor may consider for appointment to the
- 32 committee the names of persons recommended by the professional
- 33 organizations for each profession represented on the committee.
- 34 The Iowa sleep society may submit a list of three names for
- 35 each position to be filled by a polysomnographic technologist.

- 1 The Iowa respiratory care society may submit a list of three
- 2 names for the position to be filled by a respiratory therapist.
- 3 The Iowa state medical association may submit a list of three
- 4 names for the position to be filled by a physician.
- 5 EXPLANATION
- 6 This bill requires the licensing of polysomnographic
- 7 technologists and makes the provisions of Code chapters 147
- 8 and 272C, including penalty and other regulatory provisions,
- 9 applicable to other health professions applicable to the
- 10 practice of polysomnography. Code section 147.86 provides
- 11 that it is a serious misdemeanor to violate a provision of
- 12 the licensing laws. The licensing program is administered
- 13 and regulated by the board of medicine, with the advice of a
- 14 polysomnography professional standards committee.
- 15 A licensed polysomnographic technologist practices under
- 16 the general supervision of a licensed physician, providing
- 17 specifically enumerated services related to sleep disorders.
- 18 A polysomnographic student or trainee enrolled in an approved
- 19 educational program provides services under the direct
- 20 supervision of a polysomnographic technologist.
- 21 The bill sets out educational standards and testing
- 22 requirements, and provides for disciplinary actions.
