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1 The bill increases moneys appropriated to the department for 2 the blind for its administration.

The bill increases appropriations to the college student 3 4 aid commission for general administrative purposes, student 5 aid programs, loan forgiveness for health care professionals, 6 the national guard educational assistance program, the teacher 7 shortage loan forgiveness program, the all Iowa opportunity 8 foster care grant and scholarship programs, the registered 9 nurse loan and nurse educator forgiveness program, and the 10 barber and cosmetology arts and sciences tuition grant program. The bill increases moneys appropriated to the department 11 12 of education for purposes of the midwestern higher education 13 compact, the department's general administration, vocational 14 education administration, division of vocational rehabilitation 15 services including independent living and the entrepreneurs 16 with disabilities program and independent living centers, state 17 library for general administration and the enrich Iowa program, 18 library service area system, public broadcasting division, 19 vocational education to secondary schools, school food service, 20 early childhood Iowa fund, expansion of the federal Individuals 21 with Disabilities Education Improvement Act birth through age 22 three services, textbooks for nonpublic school pupils, the core 23 curriculum and career information and decision-making system, 24 the student achievement and teacher quality program, jobs for 25 America's graduates, and community colleges. The bill adds 26 a new line item for purposes of education reform. The bill 27 eliminates funding for regional telecommunications councils. 28 The bill amends statute to increase the reduction in state aid 29 payments to area education agencies from \$10 million to \$20 30 million.

The bill increases moneys appropriated to the state board of regents for the board office, the southwest Iowa graduate studies center; the siouxland interstate metropolitan planning council; the quad-cities graduate studies center; Iowa public stadio; the state university of Iowa; Iowa state university

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1 of science and technology; the university of northern Iowa; 2 and for the Iowa school for the deaf and the Iowa braille and 3 sight saving school, including tuition and transportation costs 4 for students residing in the schools and licensed classroom 5 teachers. The bill adds a new line item for purposes of 6 priorities identified by the board.

7 The bill increases the standing appropriation for Iowa
8 tuition grants for students attending nonprofit accredited
9 postsecondary institutions.
