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1 effective date provision. The bill is organized by divisions. 2 REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This division 3 appropriates project funding from the rebuild Iowa 4 infrastructure fund, including projects for FY 2012-2013 5 for the departments of agriculture and land stewardship, 6 corrections, cultural affairs, economic development authority, 7 human services, natural resources, public defense, and 8 transportation, and for the state fair authority, treasurer of 9 state, and the board of regents, and for FY 2013-2014 for the 10 departments of corrections and natural resources, and for the 11 state fair authority and the board of regents.

12 TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. This division appropriates 13 project funding for FY 2012-2013 from the technology 14 reinvestment fund, including projects for the departments of 15 corrections, education, human rights, and management, and for 16 the Iowa telecommunications and technology commission, and 17 board of regents.

18 FY 2009 PRISON BONDING FUND. This division appropriates 19 project funding for FY 2012-2013 from the FY 2009 prison 20 bonding fund for the department of corrections.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY — CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION. This division appropriates project funding for FY 2013-2014 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the economic development authority for the Des Moines area regional transit suthority if the authority receives local funds as well as a federal grant, by December 31, 2013, in an amount sufficient to complete the project.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION — RADIOS. This division requires all land mobile radio communications equipment purchased by the department of transportation to be compliant with the federal communication commission's narrowbanding mandate and to provide the maximum amount of statewide coverage and interoperability, throughout all phases of migration, to the department of public safety's future statewide digital radio network utilizing P-25 standards.

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This division takes effect upon enactment and applies
retroactively to July 1, 2011.

3 CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This division makes 4 changes to prior appropriations from the state fish and game 5 protection fund for FY 2010-2011 to the department of natural 6 resources.

7 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from 8 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for FY 2011-2012 to the 9 department of veterans affairs and for the board of regents, 10 for FY 2012-2013 to the department of corrections and board of 11 regents, and for FY 2013-2014 and 2013-2014 to the department 12 of corrections and board of regents.

13 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from the 14 technology reinvestment fund for FY 2011-2012 to the department 15 of human rights and public safety and for FY 2012-2013 and FY 16 2013-2014 to the department of human services.

17 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from the 18 revenue bonds capitals fund for FY 2011-2012 to the department 19 of corrections.

20 The division takes effect upon enactment.

21 MISCELLANEOUS CODE CHANGES. This division reduces the 22 standing appropriation from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure 23 fund for FY 2012-2013 to the environment first fund from \$35 24 million to \$33 million.

The division provides a standing general fund appropriation of \$17.5 million to the technology reinvestment fund beginning in FY 2013-2014.

The division appropriates \$15 million from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the technology reinvestment fund for FY 20 2012-2013.

31 IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK — AUDIT. This division 32 requires the Iowa communications network, prior to the sale 33 or lease of the network, to conduct a comprehensive audit 34 to include a complete inventory and estimate of the value 35 of all the components included in the network including all

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1 fiber, switching stations, end user equipment, and individual 2 components the state has purchased since the creation of the 3 network. The audit should be conducted by an independent 4 auditing firm not associated with the vendor selected through a 5 competitive bidding process. The auditing firm selected shall 6 be technology-based, have extensive industry experience in 7 telecommunications, and be associated with a certified public 8 accountant.
