A BILL FOR

1 An Act providing for the establishment of an Iowa middle school

2 extended learning time pilot project grant program.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 256.34 Middle school extended
 learning time pilot project grant program.

3 1. Subject to an appropriation by the general assembly 4 for purposes of this section, the department shall establish 5 a pilot project grant program to provide funding to at least 6 two school districts individually or working collaboratively 7 for planning and implementing extended learning time for middle 8 school students in the form of longer school days or a longer 9 school year. The school districts selected to receive grants 10 shall be located in geographically diverse areas of the state 11 and the student populations among the buildings designated 12 for pilot projects shall demonstrate diverse demographic 13 characteristics.

14 2. The department shall develop an application and 15 evaluation process for approval of pilot project grant 16 applications submitted by school districts. In evaluating 17 grant applications, the department shall consider all of the 18 following:

19 a. The percentage of seventh grade students in the school 20 district in a designated middle school building or in a 21 specific student population within such a building who have not 22 demonstrated proficiency in reading.

23 b. Evidence that the school district has included
24 community-based organizations in the submission of the
25 application.

c. The school district's proposed comprehensive restructuring of the school day or year to maximize the use of extra time for learning by middle school students, including a mix of additional time spent on reading and enrichment opportunities.

31 d. Whether the school district's plan for teacher 32 collaboration and professional development of professional 33 staff supports success of the extended learning time pilot 34 project.

1 project grant shall do all of the following:

a. Add up to three hundred hours of additional instruction
or learning activities annually for all students in a
4 designated middle school building or in a specific student
5 population within such a building.

b. Enter into an annual performance agreement with the
7 department that establishes clear academic achievement goals,
8 developed collaboratively with district teachers, for each
9 designated middle school building.

10 4. Extended learning time pilot project grants shall be 11 awarded for a period of three years, subject annually to a 12 successful review of program performance by the department. 13 5. School districts may collaborate with one another to 14 submit a joint grant application.

18 This bill provides for the establishment of an Iowa middle 19 school extended learning time pilot project grant program 20 by the department of education, subject to an appropriation 21 by the general assembly, to provide funding to at least two 22 geographically and demographically diverse school districts for 23 planning and implementing extended learning time for middle 24 school students in the form of longer school days or a longer 25 school year.

In evaluating grant applications, the department shall consider the percentage of seventh grade students in the school district in a designated middle school building or in a specific student population within such a building who have not demonstrated proficiency in reading; evidence that the school district has included community-based organizations in the submission of the application; the district's proposed comprehensive restructuring of the school day or year to amaximize the use of extra time for learning, including a mix of additional time spent on reading and enrichment

5 A school district awarded an extended learning time 6 pilot project grant must add up to 300 hours of additional 7 instruction or learning activities annually for all students in 8 a designated middle school building or in a specific student 9 population within such a building; and enter into an annual 10 performance agreement with the department that establishes 11 clear academic achievement goals, developed collaboratively 12 with district teachers, for each designated building.

13 Grants shall be awarded for a period of three years, subject 14 annually to a successful review of program performance by the 15 department. School districts may collaborate with one another 16 to submit a joint grant application.
