A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act to prohibit state departments, agencies, and political
- 2 subdivisions of this state and members of the Iowa national
- 3 guard from assisting the armed forces of the United States
- 4 in the investigation, prosecution, or detainment of any
- 5 citizen of the United States under certain circumstances and
- 6 providing penalties.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. PROHIBITED ENFORCEMENT NATIONAL DEFENSE
 2 AUTHORIZATION ACT.
- Except as provided in subsection 2, and notwithstanding
- 4 any provision of law to the contrary, a state department,
- 5 agency, or political subdivision of this state or employee
- 6 thereof acting in the employee's official capacity, or a member
- 7 of the Iowa national guard on official state duty shall not
- 8 aid an agency of the armed forces of the United States in any
- 9 investigation, prosecution, or detention of any person pursuant
- 10 to section 1021 of the federal National Defense Authorization
- 11 Act for Fiscal Year 2012, if such aid would place that state
- 12 agency, political subdivision, employee, or member of the Iowa
- 13 national guard in violation of the Constitution of the United
- 14 States, the Constitution of the State of Iowa, or any law of
- 15 this state.
- 2. An official, agent, or employee of any state department,
- 17 agency, or political subdivision of this state or a member of
- 18 the Iowa national guard who acts in violation of this section
- 19 is guilty of a class "D" felony.
- 20 3. This section shall not apply to participation by state
- 21 or local law enforcement or the Iowa national guard in a
- 22 joint task force, partnership, or other similar cooperative
- 23 agreement with federal law enforcement if that joint task
- 24 force, partnership, or similar cooperative agreement is not for
- 25 the purpose of investigating, prosecuting, or detaining any
- 26 person pursuant to section 1021 of the federal National Defense
- 27 Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2012.
- 28 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 31 This bill provides that except as otherwise provided in the
- 32 bill and notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,
- 33 a state department, agency, or political subdivision of this
- 34 state or employee thereof acting in the employee's official
- 35 capacity, or a member of the Iowa national guard on official

- 1 state duty shall not aid an agency of the armed forces of the
- 2 United States in any investigation, prosecution, or detention
- 3 of any person pursuant to section 1021 of the federal National
- 4 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2012, if such aid
- 5 would place that state agency, political subdivision, employee,
- 6 or member of the Iowa national guard in violation of the
- 7 United States constitution, the Iowa constitution, or any Iowa
- 8 law. That section of the federal law pertains to detention
- 9 of persons the federal government suspects are involved in
- 10 terrorism.
- 11 An official, agent, or employee of any state department,
- 12 agency, or political subdivision of this state or a member
- 13 of the Iowa national quard who acts in violation of this
- 14 section is guilty of a class "D" felony. A class "D" felony
- 15 is punishable by confinement for no more than five years and a
- 16 fine of at least \$750 but not more than \$7,500.
- 17 The bill does not apply to participation by state or local
- 18 law enforcement or the Iowa national quard in a joint task
- 19 force, partnership, or other similar cooperative agreement with
- 20 federal law enforcement if that joint task force, partnership,
- 21 or similar cooperative agreement is not for the purpose of
- 22 investigating, prosecuting, or detaining any person pursuant to
- 23 section 1021 of the federal National Defense Authorization Act
- 24 for Fiscal Year 2012.
