## A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to driver's license sanctions imposed for a
- 2 first violation of requirements for meeting or overtaking a
- 3 school bus, and including effective date provisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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- 1 Section 1. SCHOOL BUS SAFETY VIOLATIONS DRIVER
- 2 IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM OPTION FOR FIRST OFFENSE. Notwithstanding
- 3 2012 Iowa Acts, chapter 1015, section 5, subsection 2, by
- 4 July 1, 2014, the department of transportation shall initiate
- 5 rulemaking by amending 761 IAC 615.43 to include a person
- 6 who is convicted for a first violation of section 321.372,
- 7 subsection 3, among the persons who may be required, in lieu
- 8 of driver's license suspension, to attend and successfully
- 9 complete, at the person's own expense, a driver improvement
- 10 program approved by the department, subject to all other
- 11 provisions of 761 IAC 615.43.
- 12 Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. This Act, being deemed of
- 13 immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
- 14 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 17 Under Code section 321.372, subsection 3, the driver of a
- 18 vehicle, when meeting a school bus with flashing amber lights,
- 19 must reduce the vehicle's speed, come to a complete stop when
- 20 the school bus stops and the stop signal arm is extended, and
- 21 remain stopped until the signal arm is retracted. A driver
- 22 of a vehicle overtaking a school bus shall not pass the bus
- 23 when red or amber warning lights are flashing. The driver must
- 24 stop no closer than 15 feet from the school bus when the school
- 25 bus is stopped with the stop signal arm extended and remain
- 26 stopped until the signal arm is retracted and the school bus
- 27 resumes motion. The penalty for a person convicted of a first
- 28 violation is a simple misdemeanor punishable by a fine of at
- 29 least \$250 but not more than \$675 or by imprisonment for not
- 30 more than 30 days, or by both. A second or subsequent offense
- 31 is a serious misdemeanor.
- 32 Pursuant to 2012 Iowa Acts, chapter 1015, section 5, the
- 33 department of transportation has established by administrative
- 34 rule that a violation of requirements for meeting or overtaking
- 35 a school bus by the driver of a motor vehicle is a serious

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- 1 violation of motor vehicle laws, subjecting the violator to
- 2 an increasing tier of driver's license suspensions for first,
- 3 second, and subsequent offenses. Under current law, when a
- 4 person's driver's license is suspended, that person is required
- 5 to show and maintain proof of financial liability coverage with
- 6 respect to all motor vehicles registered in the person's name
- 7 for two years.
- 8 This bill directs the department of transportation to
- 9 initiate rulemaking by July 1, 2014, to allow the department
- 10 to require a person convicted of a first violation of
- 11 requirements for meeting or overtaking a school bus to attend
- 12 and successfully complete a driver improvement program in lieu
- 13 of suspending the person's driver's license. The department
- 14 currently may require completion of a driver improvement
- 15 program as an alternative to license suspension for habitual
- 16 violators, persons convicted of certain speeding violations,
- 17 and persons who commit a moving violation during a probationary
- 18 period following a license suspension or revocation. A
- 19 person who completes the program must then complete a one-year
- 20 probationary period without committing a moving violation.
- 21 The bill takes effect upon enactment.
