A BILL FOR

1 An Act creating a spay and neuter fund, and making an
2 appropriation.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 169.21 Spay and neuter fund.

2 1. A spay and neuter fund is created in the state treasury
3 under the control of the Iowa board of veterinary medicine.

4 2. Moneys in the fund shall be used to plan, develop,
5 implement, administer, and evaluate a statewide strategy for
6 the humane control of dog and cat populations, including by
7 supporting the increased use of spaying and neutering.

8 3. The fund consists of moneys appropriated to the fund by
9 the general assembly and other moneys available to and obtained
10 or accepted by the board from public or private sources.

11 4. a. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or earnings
12 on moneys in the fund shall be credited to the fund.

13 b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys credited to the fund
14 that remain unexpended or unobligated at the end of a fiscal
15 year shall not revert to any other fund.

16 5. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the board and
17 shall be used exclusively to carry out the provisions of this
18 section as determined and directed by the board.

19 Sec. 2. SPAY AND NEUTER FUND. There is appropriated from
20 the general fund of the state to the Iowa board of veterinary
21 medicine for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending
22 June 30, 2015, the following amount, or so much thereof as is
23 necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

24 For deposit into the spay and neuter fund as created in this
25 Act:

26 \$ 100,000

27 EXPLANATION

28 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
29 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.

30 This bill creates a spay and neuter fund under the control
31 of the Iowa board of veterinary medicine. Moneys in the fund
32 are to be used to plan, develop, implement, administer, and
33 evaluate a statewide strategy for the humane control of dog and
34 cat populations, including by supporting the increased use of
35 spaying and neutering.

1 The bill appropriates \$100,000 from the general fund for FY
2 2014-2015 to the board for deposit into the spay and neuter
3 fund.
