A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing a school radon testing and mitigation grant
- 2 program and making an appropriation.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

H.F. 2412

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **256.25 School** radon testing and 2 mitigation grant program.
- A school radon testing and mitigation grant program
- 4 is established in the department to award grants to school
- 5 districts for purposes of radon testing and mitigation
- 6 at attendance centers. The department of education shall
- 7 administer the program in collaboration with the department of
- 8 public health.
- 9 2. A school district awarded a grant in accordance with this
- 10 section for purposes of radon testing shall retain a person
- 11 certified pursuant to section 136B.1 to conduct the testing.
- 12 A school district awarded a grant in accordance with this
- 13 section for purposes of radon mitigation shall retain a person
- 14 credentialed to perform radon abatement measures pursuant to
- 15 section 136B.1 to conduct the mitigation. Radon testing and
- 16 radon mitigation funded by a grant from the program shall be
- 17 conducted as prescribed by the department of public health.
- 18 3. The department of education shall develop grant
- 19 application, selection, and evaluation criteria. Such criteria
- 20 shall include but are not limited to the results of any
- 21 previous radon testing and mitigation conducted at attendance
- 22 centers in the school district; the financial need of the
- 23 school district as determined by criteria including but not
- 24 limited to the budget enrollment of a school district and
- 25 the extent to which a school district's adjusted additional
- 26 property tax levy rate exceeds the statewide maximum adjusted
- 27 additional property tax levy rate, as calculated under section
- 28 257.15, subsection 4; and the amount of any commitment of
- 29 matching funds by the school district. A school district
- 30 shall not be eligible for a grant for the purpose of radon
- 31 mitigation at an attendance center unless the results of a
- 32 radon test conducted at the attendance center were at or above
- 33 four picocuries per liter.
- 34 4. The amount of a grant awarded in accordance with this
- 35 section shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars per school

- The department of education and the department of public
- 3 health shall each adopt rules to administer this section.
- 4 Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated from the
- 5 general fund of the state to the department of education
- 6 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June
- 7 30, 2015, the following amount, to be used for the purposes
- 8 designated:
- 9 For the awarding of grants from the school radon testing and
- 10 mitigation grant program established in section 256.25:
- 11 \$ 1,000,000
- 12 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this
- 13 section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of
- 14 the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for
- 15 expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the
- 16 succeeding fiscal year.
- 17 EXPLANATION
- 18 The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with
- 19 the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 20 This bill establishes a school radon testing and mitigation
- 21 grant program in the department of education for purposes
- 22 of radon testing and mitigation at attendance centers. The
- 23 program will be administered by the department of education in
- 24 collaboration with the department of public health.
- 25 A school district that receives a grant for radon testing
- 26 must retain a person certified by the department of public
- 27 health to conduct the testing. A school district that receives
- 28 a grant for radon mitigation must retain a person credentialed
- 29 to perform radon abatement measures by the department of public
- 30 health to conduct the mitigation. Radon testing and radon
- 31 mitigation funded by a grant from the program must be conducted
- 32 as prescribed by the department of public health.
- 33 The department of education must develop grant application,
- 34 selection, and evaluation criteria. Such criteria must include
- 35 but are not limited to the results of any previous radon

- 1 testing and mitigation conducted at attendance centers in the
- 2 school district; the financial need of the school district
- 3 as determined by certain criteria; and the amount of any
- 4 commitment of matching funds by the school district. A school
- 5 district can only be eligible for a grant for the purpose of
- 6 radon mitigation at an attendance center if results of a radon
- 7 test conducted at the attendance center were at or above four
- 8 picocuries per liter.
- 9 The amount of a grant cannot exceed \$50,000 per school
- 10 district.
- 11 The bill appropriates \$1 million to the department of
- 12 education for fiscal year 2014-2015 to be used for school radon
- 13 testing and mitigation grants.
