# A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to programs and services under the purview of
- 2 the department of public health.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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1 DIVISION I 2 TRAUMA SYSTEM QUALITY IMPROVEMENT Section 1. Section 147A.25, subsection 1, paragraph h, Code 3 4 2013, is amended to read as follows: 5 Iowa foundation of medical care director A representative of the state's Medicare quality improvement organization. 7 DIVISION II 8 REIMBURSEMENT FOR CERTAIN AUTOPSIES 9 Section 331.802, subsection 2, paragraph c, Code 10 2013, is amended to read as follows: The fee and expenses of the county medical examiner who 12 performs an autopsy or conducts an investigation of a person 13 who dies after being brought into this state for emergency 14 medical treatment by or at the direction of an out-of-state 15 law enforcement officer or public authority shall be paid by 16 the state. A claim for payment shall be filed with the Iowa 17 department of public health. If moneys are not appropriated 18 to the Iowa department of public health for the payment of 19 autopsies under this paragraph, claims for payment shall be 20 forwarded to the state appeal board and, if authorized by the 21 board, shall be paid out of moneys in the general fund of the 22 state not otherwise appropriated. 23 Section 331.802, subsection 4, Code 2013, is amended Sec. 3. 24 to read as follows: The county medical examiner shall conduct the 26 investigation in the manner required by the state medical 27 examiner and shall determine whether the public interest 28 requires an autopsy or other special investigation. However, 29 if the death occurred in the manner specified in subsection 30 3, paragraph j'', the county medical examiner shall order 31 an autopsy, claims for the expense payment of which shall 32 be reimbursed by the Iowa department of public health filed 33 with the state appeal board and, if authorized by the board, 34 shall be paid out of moneys in the general fund of the state 35 not otherwise appropriated. In determining the need for an

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- 1 autopsy, the county medical examiner may consider the request
- 2 for an autopsy from a public official or private person, but
- 3 the state medical examiner or the county attorney of the county
- 4 where the death occurred may require an autopsy.
- 5 DIVISION III
- 6 HIV HOME TEST KITS
- 7 Sec. 4. REPEAL. Section 126.25, Code 2013, is repealed.
- 8 DIVISION IV
- 9 TOBACCO CESSATION SERVICES MINORS
- 10 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **142A.11** Application for services —
- 11 minors.
- 12 A minor shall have the legal capacity to act and give
- 13 consent to the provision of tobacco cessation services by
- 14 a hospital, clinic, health care provider, or other tobacco
- 15 cessation services provider. Consent shall not be subject to
- 16 later disaffirmance by reason of such minority. The consent of
- 17 another person, including but not limited to the consent of a
- 18 spouse, parent, custodian, or quardian, shall not be necessary.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- 20 This bill includes provisions that relate to programs and
- 21 services under the purview of the department of public health
- 22 (DPH). The bill is organized in divisions.
- 23 Division I relates to the membership of the system
- 24 evaluation and quality improvement committee for the trauma
- 25 system in the state. The bill changes the membership by
- 26 replacing the specific name of the one membership entity
- 27 with a general reference to the Medicare quality improvement
- 28 organization in the state.
- 29 Division II relates to county reimbursement for
- 30 investigations and autopsies that are for persons who die after
- 31 being brought into the state for emergency medical treatment
- 32 by or at the direction of an out-of-state law enforcement
- 33 officer or public authority; or for autopsies relating to the
- 34 death of a child under the age of two years if death results
- 35 from an unknown cause or if the circumstances surrounding the

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- 1 death indicate that sudden infant death syndrome may be the
- 2 cause of death. Current law directs that claims for these
- 3 investigations and autopsies are to be filed by counties
- 4 initially with DPH, and, if moneys are not appropriated to
- 5 DPH for this purpose, the claims are to then be forwarded to
- 6 the state appeal board. Under the bill, claims would not be
- 7 initially filed with DPH, but would instead be filed directly
- 8 with the state appeal board for authorization of payment
- 9 from the general fund of the state from funds not otherwise
- 10 appropriated.
- 11 Division III relates to human immunodeficiency virus
- 12 (HIV) home test kits. Current law prohibits a person from
- 13 advertising for sale, offering for sale, or selling an HIV
- 14 home testing kit for antibody or antigen testing, and provides
- 15 civil and criminal penalties as well as injunctive relief for
- 16 violation of the prohibition. The United States food and drug
- 17 administration approved the use of such kits in July 2012, and
- 18 the bill repeals the Code provision prohibiting the HIV home
- 19 test kits in the state.
- 20 Division IV of the bill provides that a minor shall have
- 21 the legal capacity to act and give consent to the provision
- 22 of tobacco cessation services by a hospital, clinic, health
- 23 care provider, or other tobacco cessation services provider.
- 24 Consent is not subject to later disaffirmance by reason of such
- 25 minority, and the consent of another person is not necessary.
