A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act establishing a school improvement technology program and
- 2 making appropriations.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **295.1 Legislative findings and** 2 intent.
- 3 The general assembly finds that it is in the public interest
- 4 to develop and equitably fund instructional technology within
- 5 the public schools of this state to ensure that students,
- 6 teachers, and administrators are equipped and prepared to
- 7 excel. Toward that goal, it is the intent of this chapter to
- 8 establish and fund a school improvement technology program.
- 9 Sec. 2. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **295.2** School improvement technology 10 appropriation.
- 11 1. a. There is appropriated from the general fund of
- 12 the state to the department of education for the fiscal year
- 13 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, the sum
- 14 of twenty-five million dollars for the school improvement
- 15 technology program.
- 16 b. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state
- 17 to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning
- 18 July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the sum of twenty-five
- 19 million dollars for the school improvement technology program.
- 20 2. a. For each fiscal year in which moneys are appropriated
- 21 for purposes of the program, and after the allocations of
- 22 moneys pursuant to paragraph c and subsection 3, the moneys
- 23 remaining shall be allocated to school districts and the
- 24 schools and institutions specified in paragraph "b" in the
- 25 proportion that the basic enrollment of a district, school, or
- 26 institution bears to the sum of the basic enrollments of all
- 27 school districts in the state for the budget year. However,
- 28 except as provided in paragraph c, a district, school, or
- 29 institution shall not receive less than fifteen thousand
- 30 dollars in a fiscal year.
- 31 b. The Iowa braille and sight saving school and the state
- 32 school for the deaf governed by the state board of regents, and
- 33 the Glenwood and Woodward state resource centers, the mental
- 34 health institutes at Cherokee and Independence, the state
- 35 training school, and the Iowa juvenile home under the control

- 1 of the department of human services as provided in section
- 2 218.1, subsections 1 through 3, 5, 7, and 8, shall receive
- 3 moneys under paragraph a in the same manner and, except
- 4 as provided in paragraph c, to the same extent as if they
- 5 were school districts. The superintendent of each school or
- 6 institution specified in this paragraph "b" shall certify the
- 7 basic enrollments of the school or institution administered by
- 8 the superintendent to the department of education by October 1.
- 9 c. Notwithstanding paragraph b'', the amount of moneys
- 10 allocated to state resource centers and mental health
- ll institutes specified in paragraph "b", shall be a total of
- 12 not more than forty-five thousand dollars for each fiscal
- 13 year. The department of education shall distribute the amount
- 14 allocated proportionately between the four institutions.
- 15 3. From the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, the sum of
- 16 four hundred fifty thousand dollars shall be divided among the
- 17 area education agencies based upon each area education agency's
- 18 percentage of the total full-time equivalent elementary and
- 19 secondary teachers employed in the school districts in this
- 20 state.
- 21 4. For each year in which an appropriation is made
- 22 under subsection 1 for purposes of the school improvement
- 23 technology program, the department of education shall notify
- 24 the department of revenue and finance of the amount to be paid
- 25 to each school district, area education agency, and schools and
- 26 institutions specified in subsection 1, paragraph "b", based
- 27 upon the distribution plan set forth for the appropriation made
- 28 pursuant to this section. The allocation under this section
- 29 to each school district, area education agency, school, and
- 30 institution shall be made in one payment on or about October 15
- 31 of the fiscal year in which the appropriation is made, taking
- 32 into consideration the relative budget and cash position of the
- 33 state resources.
- 34 5. a. Moneys received by a school district or area
- 35 education agency under this section shall not be commingled

- 1 with state aid payments made under sections 257.16 and 257.35
- 2 and shall be accounted for by the local school district or area
- 3 education agency separately from state aid payments.
- 4 b. Payments made to school districts and area education
- 5 agencies under this section are miscellaneous income for
- 6 purposes of chapter 257 or are considered encumbered.
- 7 6. The schools and institutions specified in subsection
- 8 1, paragraph "b", and each school district and area education
- 9 agency shall maintain a separate listing within their budgets
- 10 for payments received and expenditures made pursuant to this
- 11 section.
- 7. Moneys received under this section shall not be used for
- 13 payment of any collective bargaining agreement or arbitrator's
- 14 decision negotiated or awarded under chapter 20.
- 15 Sec. 3. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **295.3 School improvement technology**
- 16 planning.
- 17 l. Prior to receiving funds under this chapter, the board
- 18 of directors of a school district shall adopt a technology
- 19 plan that supports school improvement technology efforts
- 20 and includes an evaluation component. The plan shall be
- 21 developed by licensed professional staff of the district,
- 22 including both teachers and administrators. The plan shall,
- 23 at a minimum, focus on the attainment of student achievement
- 24 goals, recommended pursuant to section 280.12 and set forth in
- 25 the school district's comprehensive school improvement plan
- 26 submitted to the department of education in compliance with
- 27 section 256.7, subsection 21, and shall demonstrate how the
- 28 board will utilize technology to improve student achievement.
- 29 A district needs to develop only one plan while this chapter
- 30 is effective. The technology plan shall be kept on file in the
- 31 district and a copy of the plan, and any subsequent amendments
- 32 to the plan, shall be sent to the appropriate area education
- 33 agency. Progress made under the plan shall be included as part
- 34 of the comprehensive school improvement plan.
- 35 2. Prior to receiving funds under this chapter, each area

- 1 education agency shall provide to the department of education
- 2 adequate assurance that the agency has developed or is
- 3 developing a plan to assist school districts in the development
- 4 of a technology planning process to meet the purposes of this
- 5 chapter. The plan shall describe how the area education
- 6 agency intends to support school districts with instructional
- 7 technology staff development and training. An area education
- 8 agency needs to develop only one plan while this chapter is
- 9 effective. An annual progress report shall be submitted to the
- 10 department of education.
- 11 3. Prior to receiving funds under this chapter, the
- 12 superintendents of the schools and institutions specified
- 13 in section 295.2, subsection 2, paragraph "b", shall each
- 14 develop a technology plan that supports and improves student
- 15 achievement, demonstrates how technology will be utilized
- 16 to improve student achievement, and includes an evaluation
- 17 component. Each school and institution needs to develop only
- 18 one plan while this chapter is effective. The plan shall be
- 19 sent to the state board of regents or the department of human
- 20 services, as appropriate, and to the department of education.
- 21 An annual progress report shall be submitted to the state board
- 22 of regents or the department of human services, as appropriate,
- 23 and to the department of education.
- 24 Sec. 4. NEW SECTION. 295.4 School improvement technology
- 25 expenditures.
- 26 l. Funds received pursuant to section 295.2 shall be used
- 27 for the acquisition, lease, lease-purchase, installation, and
- 28 maintenance of instructional technology equipment, including
- 29 computers, one-to-one laptop computer programs, long-distance
- 30 learning, hardware and software, wiring, and materials and
- 31 supplies related to instructional technology.
- Funds received by an area education agency pursuant
- 33 to section 295.2 shall be expended for the costs related
- 34 to supporting school districts, schools, and institutions
- 35 within the area served with technology planning and equipment,

- 1 including computers, one-to-one laptop computer programs,
- 2 long-distance learning, hardware and software, wiring, and
- 3 materials and supplies related to instructional technology.
- 4 An area education agency may contract with an appropriate
- 5 accredited institution of higher education in Iowa to provide
- 6 staff development and training to implement the purposes of
- 7 this chapter.
- 8 3. Funds received pursuant to section 295.2 shall not be
- 9 expended to add a full-time equivalent position or otherwise
- 10 increase staffing.
- 11 Sec. 5. NEW SECTION. 295.5 Future repeal.
- 12 This chapter is repealed July 1, 2018.
- 13 EXPLANATION
- 14 This bill enacts new Code chapter 295, establishing a
- 15 school improvement technology program, and appropriates \$25
- 16 million from the general fund of the state to the department
- 17 of education for FY 2013-2014 and FY 2014-2015 for purposes
- 18 of disbursing funds to public schools, area education
- 19 agencies (AEAs), and other public educational institutions
- 20 for the acquisition, lease, lease-purchase, installation, and
- 21 maintenance of instructional technology equipment, including
- 22 computers, one-to-one laptop computer programs, long-distance
- 23 learning, hardware and software, wiring, and materials and
- 24 supplies related to instructional technology. Funds received
- 25 shall not be used to increase staffing.
- The moneys allocated to the AEAs, \$450,000, shall be
- 27 distributed to the AEAs based upon each AEA's percentage of the
- 28 total full-time equivalent elementary and secondary teachers
- 29 employed in the school districts in this state. An AEA may
- 30 contract with an appropriate accredited institution of higher
- 31 education in Iowa to provide staff development and training to
- 32 assist school districts in implementing the Code chapter.
- 33 Moneys remaining after the disbursement to the AEAs shall
- 34 be allocated to school districts in the proportion that the
- 35 basic enrollment of a district bears to the sum of the basic

- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{l}}$ enrollments of all school districts in the state for the budget
- 2 year. However, a district shall not receive less than \$15,000
- 3 per year.
- 4 The Iowa braille and sight saving school, the state school
- 5 for the deaf, the Glenwood state resource center, Woodward
- 6 state resource center, the mental health institute at Cherokee,
- 7 the mental health institute at Independence, the state training
- 8 school, and the Iowa juvenile home shall also receive moneys
- 9 under the program in the same manner and to the same extent as
- 10 if they were school districts, except that the Glenwood state
- 11 resource center, Woodward state resource center, the mental
- 12 health institute at Cherokee, and the mental health institute
- 13 at Independence shall divide a total of \$45,000 proportionately
- 14 amongst the four institutions. The superintendents of those
- 15 schools and institutions must certify the basic enrollments of
- 16 their institutions to the department of education by October 1.
- 17 Moneys received under new Code chapter 295 shall not be
- 18 used for payment of any collective bargaining agreement or
- 19 arbitrator's decision negotiated or awarded under Code chapter 20 20.
- 21 Prior to receiving funds, the board of directors of a school
- 22 district shall adopt a technology plan. The plan shall be
- 23 developed by licensed professional staff of the district,
- 24 including both teachers and administrators. The plan shall, at
- 25 a minimum, focus on the attainment of student achievement goals
- 26 and shall demonstrate how the board will utilize technology
- 27 to improve student achievement. Progress made under the
- 28 plan shall be included as part of the comprehensive school
- 29 improvement plan submitted to the department of education
- 30 annually.
- 31 Prior to receiving funds under new Code chapter 295, each AEA
- 32 must provide to the department of education adequate assurance
- 33 that they have developed or are developing a plan to assist
- 34 school districts in the development of a technology planning
- 35 process. The plan shall describe how the AEA intends to

- 1 support school districts with instructional technology staff
- 2 development and training. An annual progress report shall be
- 3 submitted to the department.
- 4 Prior to receiving funds under this Code chapter, the Iowa
- 5 braille and sight saving school, the state school for the
- 6 deaf, and the institutions receiving funds that are under the
- 7 control of the department of human services must also develop
- 8 and submit to the state board of regents or to the department
- 9 of human services, as appropriate, and to the department of
- 10 education, a technology plan that supports and improves student
- 11 achievement, demonstrates the manner in which technology will
- 12 be utilized to improve student achievement and includes an
- 13 evaluation component. Each school and institution must also
- 14 submit an annual progress report to the state board of regents
- 15 or the department of human services, as appropriate, and to the
- 16 department of education.
- 17 Code chapter 295 is repealed July 1, 2018.
