HOUSE FILE 412 BY THEDE, HANSON, and HUNTER

A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act concerning the use of a mobile telephone while driving
- 2 and providing penalties.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 321.1, Code 2013, is amended by adding 2 the following new subsection:

3 <u>NEW SUBSECTION</u>. 39. "*Mobile telephone*" means as defined in 4 49 C.F.R. § 383.5.

5 Sec. 2. Section 321.210, subsection 2, paragraph e, Code 6 2013, is amended to read as follows:

7 e. Violations of section sections 321.276 and 321.276A.
8 Sec. 3. Section 321.276, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code
9 2013, is amended by striking the paragraph and inserting in
10 lieu thereof the following:

11 a. "Fixed unit global positioning system or navigation
12 system" means an electronic device that is mounted inside a
13 motor vehicle and is capable of providing navigation directions
14 to a driver based on data entered into the device prior to
15 operating the motor vehicle.

16 Sec. 4. Section 321.276, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code
17 2013, is amended to read as follows:

a. A person does not violate this section by using a <u>fixed</u>
<u>unit</u> global positioning system or navigation system or when,
for the purpose of engaging in a call, the person selects
or enters a telephone number or name in a hand-held mobile
telephone or activates, deactivates, or initiates a function of
<u>a hand-held mobile telephone</u> to receive navigation directions,
provided that the person does not manually enter data into the

25 fixed unit global positioning system or navigation system while 26 operating the motor vehicle.

27 Sec. 5. <u>NEW SECTION</u>. 321.276A Use of mobile telephone while 28 driving.

29 1. A person shall not drive a motor vehicle while using a 30 mobile telephone unless the mobile telephone is specifically 31 designed and configured to allow hands-free listening and 32 talking and is used in that manner while driving.

2. This section does not apply to the following persons:
34 a. A member of a public safety agency, as defined in section
35 34.1, performing official duties.

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3 c. A person receiving safety-related information including 4 emergency, traffic, or weather alerts.

5 *d.* The driver of a motor vehicle when the motor vehicle is 6 at a complete stop off the traveled portion of the roadway.

3. Nothing in this section shall be construed to authorize a
8 peace officer to confiscate a mobile telephone from the driver
9 or occupant of a motor vehicle.

4. a. A person convicted of a violation of this section
11 is guilty of a simple misdemeanor punishable as a scheduled
12 violation under section 805.8A, subsection 14, paragraph "m".
13 b. A violation of this section shall not be considered a
14 moving violation for purposes of this chapter or rules adopted
15 pursuant to this chapter.

16 5. A peace officer shall not stop or detain a person solely 17 for a suspected violation of this section. This section is 18 enforceable by a peace officer only as a secondary action when 19 the driver of a motor vehicle has been stopped or detained for 20 a suspected violation of another provision of this chapter, a 21 local ordinance equivalent to a provision of this chapter, or 22 other law.

23 Sec. 6. Section 321.482A, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 24 2013, is amended to read as follows:

Notwithstanding section 321.482, a person who is convicted
of operating a motor vehicle in violation of section 321.178,
subsection 2, paragraph "a", subparagraph (2), section
321.180B, subsection 6, section 321.194, subsection 1,
paragraph "c", section 321.256, section 321.257, section
321.275, subsection 4, section 321.276, <u>321.276A</u>, 321.297,
321.298, 321.299, 321.302, 321.303, 321.304, 321.305, 321.306,
321.307, 321.308, section 321.309, subsection 2, or section
321.311, 321.319, 321.320, 321.321, 321.322, 321.323, 321.324,
321.324A, 321.327, 321.329, 321.333, or 321.372, subsection 3,

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1 subject to the following penalties in addition to the penalty
2 provided for a scheduled violation in section 805.8A or any
3 other penalty provided by law:

4 Sec. 7. Section 321.555, subsection 2, Code 2013, is amended 5 to read as follows:

6 2. Six or more of any separate and distinct offenses within 7 a two-year period in the operation of a motor vehicle, which 8 are required to be reported to the department by section 9 321.491 or chapter 321C, except equipment violations, parking 10 violations as defined in section 321.210, violations of 11 registration laws, violations of sections 321.445 and 321.446, 12 violations of section sections 321.276 and 321.276A, operating 13 a vehicle with an expired license or permit, failure to appear, 14 weights and measures violations and speeding violations of less 15 than fifteen miles per hour over the legal speed limit.

16 Sec. 8. Section 805.8A, subsection 14, Code 2013, is amended 17 by adding the following new paragraph:

18 <u>NEW PARAGRAPH</u>. *m. Mobile telephone violations*. For 19 violations under section 321.276A, the scheduled fine is thirty 20 dollars.

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EXPLANATION

This bill prohibits a person from driving a motor vehicle 22 23 while using a mobile telephone unless the mobile telephone 24 is specifically designed and configured to allow hands-free 25 listening and talking and is used in that manner. The bill 26 does not apply to the driver of a motor vehicle when the motor 27 vehicle is at a complete stop off the roadway. In addition, 28 the bill exempts the following persons from the prohibition: а 29 member of a public safety agency performing official duties; 30 a health care professional in the course of an emergency 31 situation; and a person receiving safety-related information 32 including emergency, traffic, or weather alerts. These are the 33 same exemptions that currently apply under Iowa law prohibiting 34 text-messaging while driving.

35 The bill defines "mobile telephone" to mean the same

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1 as defined in federal motor carrier safety administration 2 regulations. Under that definition, "mobile telephone" means 3 a mobile communication device that falls under or uses any 4 commercial mobile radio service, as defined in regulations of 5 the federal communications commission. The federal definition 6 explicitly excludes two-way or citizens band radio services.

7 The bill amends current provisions prohibiting 8 text-messaging while driving to specify that a person does not 9 violate the text-messaging provisions by using a fixed unit 10 global positioning system or navigation system. "Fixed unit 11 global positioning system or navigation system" is defined as 12 an electronic device mounted inside a motor vehicle and capable 13 of providing navigation directions to a driver based on data 14 entered into the device prior to operating the motor vehicle. 15 The bill also strikes a current exception to the prohibition 16 on text-messaging while driving which applies to a person 17 selecting or entering a telephone number or name in a hand-held 18 mobile telephone or activating, deactivating, or initiating a 19 function of a hand-held mobile telephone.

The penalties established in the bill mirror the penalties currently applicable for text-messaging while driving. A person who uses a mobile telephone while driving in violation of the bill commits a simple misdemeanor punishable by a scheduled fine of \$30. The offense is not a moving violation, and therefore cannot be considered for purposes of administrative suspension of a driver's license or to establish habitual offender status. However, if the violation causes a serious injury, a court could impose an additional fine of \$500 or suspend the person's driver's license for not more than 90 days, or both. If the violation causes a death, a court could impose an additional fine of \$1,000 or suspend the person's driver's license for not more than 180 days, or both.

33 The ban on the use of a hand-held mobile telephone while 34 driving is enforceable only as a secondary action when a driver 35 has been stopped or detained for a suspected violation of

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1 another law. The bill does not authorize a peace officer to 2 confiscate a mobile telephone from a driver or occupant of a 3 motor vehicle.

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
