A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the board of parole.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

H.F. 538

- 1 Section 1. Section 904A.1, Code 2013, is amended to read as 2 follows:
- 3 904A.1 Board of parole panels.
- The board of parole is created to consist of five seven
- 5 members. Each member, except the chairperson and the vice
- 6 chairperson, shall be compensated on a day-to-day basis. Each
- 7 member shall serve a term of four years beginning and ending
- 8 as provided by section 69.19, except for members appointed to
- 9 fill vacancies who shall serve for the balance of the unexpired
- 10 term. The terms shall be staggered. The chairperson and vice
- 11 chairperson of the board shall be full-time, salaried members
- 12 of the board.
- 2. The board of parole shall be divided into panels of
- 14 three or five members for the purpose of transacting business
- 15 and considering inmates for parole and work release. The
- 16 chairperson shall designate the members and assign the duties
- 17 of each panel and shall provide that at least one member of
- 18 each panel shall be the chairperson or vice chairperson of
- 19 the board. A majority of the members of a panel of the board
- 20 constitutes a quorum for that panel to transact business.
- 21 Sec. 2. Section 904A.4, subsection 1, Code 2013, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- 23 1. The board of parole shall interview and consider inmates
- 24 for parole and work release and a majority vote of the members
- 25 of a panel of the board is required to grant a parole or work
- 26 release.
- 27 Sec. 3. Section 904A.4A, Code 2013, is amended by adding the
- 28 following new subsection:
- 29 NEW SUBSECTION. 2A. Designate the members and assign the
- 30 duties of each panel of the board of parole.
- 31 EXPLANATION
- 32 This bill increases the number of members of the board
- 33 of parole from five to seven and directs the board to be
- 34 divided into panels of three or five members for the purpose
- 35 of transacting business and considering inmates for parole and

- 1 work release. The bill provides that the chairperson designate
- 2 the members and assign the duties of each panel. The bill
- 3 also provides that at least one member of a panel shall be
- 4 the chairperson or vice chairperson of the board. The bill
- 5 provides that a majority of the members of a panel of the board
- 6 constitutes a quorum to transact business and to grant a parole
- 7 or work release.
