A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act providing for vision screening for school children.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. 135.39D Vision screening.
- The parent or quardian of a child to be enrolled in a
- 3 public or accredited nonpublic elementary school shall ensure
- 4 that the child is screened for vision impairment at least once
- 5 before enrollment in kindergarten and again before enrollment
- 6 in grade three. The parent or guardian of the child shall
- 7 ensure that evidence of the vision screening is provided to the
- 8 school district or accredited nonpublic school in which the
- 9 child is enrolled. Evidence of the vision screening may be
- 10 provided either directly from the parent or guardian or from a
- 11 vision screening provider referred to in subsection 2, and may
- 12 be provided in either written or electronic form.
- 2. The requirement for vision screening may be satisfied by
- 14 any of the following:
- 15 a. A vision screening or comprehensive eye examination by a
- 16 licensed ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist.
- 17 b. A vision screening conducted at a pediatrician's or
- 18 family practice physician's office, a free clinic, a licensed
- 19 child care center, a local public health department, a
- 20 public or accredited nonpublic school, or a community-based
- 21 organization identified by the director, or by an advanced
- 22 registered nurse practitioner or physician assistant.
- 23 c. An online vision screening through a program approved by
- 24 the director. An online vision screening may be conducted by
- 25 a child's parent or guardian.
- 26 d. A photoscreening vision screening through Iowa kidsight
- 27 or another program approved by the director.
- 28 3. A person who performs a vision screening required
- 29 pursuant to this section shall report the results of the vision
- 30 screening to the department. The department may collect and
- 31 maintain such reports through the statewide immunization
- 32 registry or a private contractor.
- 4. Each public and accredited nonpublic elementary school
- 34 shall, in collaboration with the department, do the following:
- 35 a. Ensure the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in

- 1 kindergarten or grade three has complied with this section.
- 2 b. If a student enrolled in kindergarten or grade three
- 3 is found not to have had their vision screened as required
- 4 pursuant to this section, provide the parent or guardian of the
- 5 student with vision screening referral resources.
- 6 c. Provide the department with evidence that each student
- 7 enrolled in kindergarten and grade three has had their vision
- 8 screened as required pursuant to this section.
- 9 5. A child shall not be prohibited from attending school
- 10 based upon the failure of a parent or guardian to ensure that
- 11 the child has received the vision screening required by this
- 12 section.
- 13 6. If a vision screening required pursuant to this section
- 14 identifies potential vision impairment in a child, the person
- 15 who performed the vision screening shall, if the person is not
- 16 a licensed ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist, refer the
- 17 child to a licensed ophthalmologist or licensed optometrist for
- 18 a comprehensive eye examination.
- 19 7. The department shall establish procedures to contact
- 20 parents or guardians of children identified as having potential
- 21 vision impairment based on the results of a vision screening
- 22 required pursuant to subsection 1 or a comprehensive eye
- 23 examination required pursuant to subsection 6 in order to
- 24 provide information on obtaining necessary vision correction.
- 25 8. The department may share information with licensed
- 26 health care providers, agencies, and other persons involved
- 27 with vision screenings, eye examinations, follow-up services,
- 28 and intervention services as necessary to administer this
- 29 section. The department shall adopt rules to protect the
- 30 confidentiality of the individuals involved.
- 31 9. The vision screening requirement shall not apply if
- 32 the vision screening conflicts with a parent's or quardian's
- 33 genuine and sincere religious belief.
- 34 10. A person who acts in good faith in complying with this
- 35 section shall not be civilly or criminally liable for reporting

- 1 the information required to be reported by this section.
- 2 11. The department shall adopt rules necessary to
- 3 administer this section.

4 EXPLANATION

- 5 This bill requires the parent or guardian of a child to be
- 6 enrolled in a public or accredited nonpublic elementary school
- 7 to ensure that the child is screened for vision impairment
- 8 at least once before enrollment in kindergarten and again
- 9 before enrollment in grade three. The bill requires the parent
- 10 or guardian to ensure that evidence of the vision screening
- ll is provided to the child's school and sets out methods for
- 12 providing such evidence. The bill lists various ways the
- 13 vision screening requirement may be satisfied.
- 14 The bill requires a person who performs a required vision
- 15 screening to report the results of the vision screening to
- 16 the department of public health. The bill provides that the
- 17 department may collect and maintain such reports through the
- 18 statewide immunization registry or a private contractor.
- 19 The bill establishes various duties for each public and
- 20 accredited nonpublic elementary school, in collaboration with
- 21 the department of public health, to implement the bill.
- 22 The bill specifies that a child cannot be prohibited from
- 23 attending school based upon the failure of a parent or quardian
- 24 to ensure that the child has received the required vision
- 25 screening.
- 26 The bill requires a person performing a required vision
- 27 screening, if the person is not a licensed ophthalmologist or
- 28 licensed optometrist, to refer children identified as having
- 29 potential vision impairment to a licensed ophthalmologist or
- 30 licensed optometrist for a comprehensive eye examination.
- 31 The bill requires the department of public health to
- 32 establish procedures to contact parents or quardians of
- 33 children in need of vision correction based on the results of a
- 34 required vision screening in order to provide information on
- 35 obtaining necessary vision correction.

- 1 The bill permits the department of public health to share
- 2 information with various entities as necessary to administer
- 3 the bill. The bill requires the department to adopt rules to
- 4 protect the confidentiality of the individuals involved.
- 5 The vision screening requirement does not apply if the
- 6 vision screening conflicts with a parent's or quardian's
- 7 genuine and sincere religious belief.
- 8 A person who acts in good faith in complying with the bill
- 9 shall not be civilly or criminally liable for reporting the
- 10 information required by the bill.
