HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 106

l A Resolution requesting the legislative council to establish a legislative interim committee on racial disparity in incarceration rates. WHEREAS, minorities make up a disproportionate share of persons incarcerated in county jails and prisons in this state; and

WHEREAS, this disparity has existed for many years and has negatively impacted many minority communities throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, a review of the incarceration practices in this state and in particular the impact of incarceration on minority populations should be conducted; and

WHEREAS, the review of racial disparity in incarceration rates should include a review of the entire criminal justice system that potentially impacts incarceration rates including but not limited to arrests, prosecutions, sentences, and offenses with the greatest impact on minority communities; and

WHEREAS, the interim committee should include legislators, the attorney general, a county attorney, a peace officer from a city with a population greater than 100,000 , a peace officer from a city with a population between 10,000 and 100,000 , a peace officer from a city with a population of 10,000 or less, a representative of the department of human rights, a representative of the Iowa civil rights commission, a representative of the American civil liberties

1 union of Iowa, and three representatives of nonprofit 2 organizations in this state that represent minority 3 interests; NOW THEREFORE, 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, That 5 the legislative council is requested to establish a 6 legislative interim study committee on racial disparity 7 in incarceration rates for the 2014 legislative interim 8 to review the reasons for such a disparity and to make 9 recommendations and to file a final report with the 10 general assembly by January $15,2015$.
