- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 DIVISION I TRAINING ON BLOOD-BORNE PATHOGENS 2 3 Section 1. Section 135.11, subsections 20 and 21, Code 2014, 4 are amended to read as follows: 20. Adopt rules which require personnel of a licensed 5 6 hospice, of a homemaker-home health aide provider agency which 7 receives state homemaker-home health aide funds, or of an 8 agency which provides respite care services and receives funds 9 to complete a minimum of two hours of training concerning 10 acquired immune deficiency syndrome-related conditions through 11 a program approved by the department. The rules shall require 12 that new employees complete the training within six months of 13 initial employment and existing employees complete the training 14 on or before January 1, 1989 blood-borne pathogens, including 15 human immunodeficiency virus and viral hepatitis, consistent 16 with standards from the federal occupational safety and health 17 administration. 21. Adopt rules which require all emergency medical 18 19 services personnel, firefighters, and law enforcement personnel 20 to complete a minimum of two hours of training concerning 21 acquired immune deficiency syndrome-related conditions and 22 the prevention of blood-borne pathogens, including human 23 immunodeficiency virus infection and viral hepatitis, 24 consistent with standards from the federal occupational safety 25 and health administration. 26 DIVISION II 27 HEALTH CARE WORKFORCE SUPPORT INITIATIVE 28 Section 135.153A, Code 2014, is amended to read as Sec. 2. 29 follows: 30 135.153A Safety net provider recruitment and retention 31 initiatives program — repeal. The department, in accordance with efforts pursuant to 32 33 sections 135.163 and 135.164 and in cooperation with the Iowa 34 collaborative safety net provider network governing group as 35 described in section 135.153, shall establish and administer

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1 a safety net provider recruitment and retention initiatives 2 program to address the health care workforce shortage relative 3 to safety net providers. Funding for the program may be 4 provided through the health care workforce shortage fund or 5 the safety net provider network workforce shortage account 6 created in section 135.175. The department, in cooperation 7 with the governing group, shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 8 17A to implement and administer such program. This section is 9 repealed June 30, 2014 2016.

22 Sec. 13. Section 135.175, subsection 1, paragraph a, Code 23 2014, is amended to read as follows:

a. A health care workforce support initiative is established
to provide for the coordination and support of various efforts
to address the health care workforce shortage in this state.
This initiative shall include the medical residency training
state matching grants program created in section 135.1767
the nurse residency state matching grants program created in
section 135.178, the health care professional and Iowa needs
nurses now initiative created in sections 261.128 and 261.1297
the safety net provider recruitment and retention initiatives
program created in section 135.153A7 and health care workforce
shortage national initiatives, and the physician assistant
mental health fellowship program created in section 135.177.

If 26 use of the federal funding is not designated, twenty-five 27 percent of such funding shall be deposited in the safety net 28 provider network workforce shortage account to be used for the 29 purposes of the account and the remainder of the funds shall 30 be used in accordance with the strategic plan developed by the 31 department of public health in accordance with sections 135.163 32 and 135.164, or to address workforce shortages as otherwise 33 designated by the department of public health. Other sources 34 of funding shall be deposited in the fund or account and used 35 as specified by the source of the funding.

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Sec. 16. EFFECTIVE DATE. This division of this Act takes 1 2 effect July 1, 2016. DIVISION IV 3 SALON LICENSES AND INSPECTIONS 4 Section 157.11, Code 2014, is amended to read as 5 Sec. 17. 6 follows: 157.11 Salon licenses. 7 1. A salon shall not operate unless the owner has obtained 8 9 a license issued by the department. The owner shall apply 10 to the department on forms prescribed by the board. The 11 department shall may perform a sanitary inspection of each 12 salon biennially and may perform a sanitary inspection of a 13 salon prior to the issuance of a license. An inspection of a 14 salon shall may also be conducted upon receipt of a complaint 15 by the department. The application shall be accompanied by the biennial 16 2. 17 license fee determined pursuant to section 147.80. The license 18 is valid for two years and may be renewed. 3. A licensed school of cosmetology arts and sciences at 19 20 which students practice cosmetology arts and sciences is exempt 21 from licensing as a salon. 22 DIVISION V 23 MORTUARY SCIENCE INSPECTIONS 24 Sec. 18. Section 156.10, Code 2014, is amended to read as 25 follows: 26 156.10 Inspection. 27 The director of public health shall may inspect all 1. 28 places where dead human bodies are prepared or held for burial, 29 entombment, or cremation, and shall may adopt and enforce 30 such rules and regulations in connection with the inspection 31 as shall may be necessary for the preservation of the public 32 health. 33 2. The Iowa department of public health shall may assess an 34 inspection fee for an inspection of a place where dead human 35 bodies are prepared for burial or cremation. The fee shall may

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1 be determined by the department by rule. 2 DIVISION VI 3 BARBERSHOP LICENSES AND INSPECTIONS Section 158.9, Code 2014, is amended to read as 4 Sec. 19. 5 follows: 6 158.9 Barbershop licenses. 1. A barbershop shall not operate unless the owner has 7 8 obtained a license issued by the department. The owner shall 9 apply to the department on forms prescribed by the board. The 10 department shall may perform a sanitary inspection of each 11 barbershop biennially and may perform a sanitary inspection of 12 a barbershop prior to the issuance of a license. An inspection 13 of a barbershop shall may also be conducted upon receipt of a 14 complaint by the department. 15 2. The application shall be accompanied by the biennial 16 license fee determined pursuant to section 147.80. The license 17 is valid for two years and may be renewed. 3. A licensed barber school at which students practice 18 19 barbering is exempt from licensing as a barbershop. 20 DIVISION VII 21 PLUMBING, MECHANICAL, HVAC-REFRIGERATION, SHEET METAL, AND 22 HYDRONIC LICENSES 23 Sec. 20. Section 105.18, subsection 2, unnumbered paragraph 24 1, Code 2014, is amended to read as follows: 25 The board shall issue master licenses for plumbing, 26 mechanical, HVAC-refrigeration, sheet metal, and hydronic 27 professionals. The board shall issue journeyperson licenses 28 for plumbing, mechanical, HVAC-refrigeration, sheet metal, and 29 hydronic professionals. A plumbing license shall allow an 30 individual to perform work defined as plumbing. A mechanical 31 license shall allow an individual to perform work defined 32 as HVAC, refrigeration, sheet metal, and hydronic. An 33 HVAC-refrigeration license shall allow an individual to perform 34 work defined as HVAC and refrigeration. A hydronic license 35 shall allow an individual to perform work defined as hydronic.

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1 A sheet metal license shall allow an individual to perform work
2 defined as sheet metal. The board shall issue the separate
3 licenses as follows:

7 This bill relates to programs and services of the department 8 of public health (DPH).

9 Division I, regarding training concerning blood-borne 10 pathogens, requires DPH to adopt rules to require personnel of 11 a licensed hospice, personnel of a homemaker-home health aide 12 provider agency, personnel of an agency requiring respite care 13 services, emergency medical services personnel, firefighters, 14 and law enforcement personnel to complete training concerning 15 blood-borne pathogens consistent with federal occupational 16 safety and health administration (OSHA) standards rather than 17 completing the two hours of training concerning acquired-immune 18 deficiency syndrome-related conditions that is currently 19 required.

Divisions II and III relate to the health care workforce support initiative codified in Code section 135.175. This initiative includes many initiatives and programs and the health care workforce shortage fund has separate accounts for each of these initiatives and programs. The initiative, the workforce shortage fund, and all the accounts and programs within the initiative are set to repeal on June 30, 2014.

The bill eliminates the repeal of the health care workforce support initiative and health care workforce shortage fund. The bill retains the medical residency training state matching grants program, the health care workforce shortage national initiatives, and the related accounts. The bill delays the repeal for the nurse residency state matching grants program, the health care professional and Iowa needs nurses now initiative, the safety net provider recruitment and retention initiatives program, and the physician assistant mental health

3 The bill establishes the fulfilling Iowa's need for dentists 4 matching grant program within the health care workforce support 5 initiative and establishes the fulfilling Iowa's need for 6 dentists matching grant program account within the health 7 care workforce shortage fund. The fulfilling Iowa's need for 8 dentists matching grant program is established to establish, 9 expand, or support the placement of dentists in dental or 10 rural shortage areas across the state by providing education 11 loan repayments. The bill requires DPH to contract with a 12 dental nonprofit health service corporation to implement and 13 administer the program.

14 Divisions IV through VI, concerning salon licenses and 15 inspections, mortuary science inspections, and barbershop 16 licenses and inspections, respectively, eliminate mandatory 17 inspections in these establishments and instead institute 18 permissive inspections.

Division VII eliminates language allowing the plumbing and mechanical systems board to issue a master license for sheet and professionals.

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
