A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to land disposal of yard waste.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

S.F. 2212

- 1 Section 1. Section 455D.9, subsection 1, Code 2014, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 l. Land disposal of yard waste as defined by the department
- 4 is prohibited. However, yard waste which has been separated at
- 5 its source from other solid waste may be accepted by a sanitary
- 6 landfill for the purposes of soil conditioning or composting.
- 7 A sanitary landfill may accept yard waste under any of the
- 8 following circumstances:
- 9 a. When the yard waste is separated at its source from other
- 10 solid waste and is accepted by the sanitary landfill for the
- 11 purposes of soil conditioning and composting.
- 12 b. When the yard waste is collected for disposal as a result
- 13 of a severe storm and the yard waste originates in an area
- 14 declared to be a disaster area in a declaration issued by the
- 15 president of the United States or the governor.
- 16 c. When the yard waste is collected for disposal to control,
- 17 eradicate, or prevent the spread of insect pests, tree and
- 18 plant diseases, or invasive plant species problems.
- 19 EXPLANATION
- The inclusion of this explanation does not constitute agreement with the explanation's substance by the members of the general assembly.
- 22 This bill relates to land disposal of yard waste.
- 23 Currently, land disposal of yard waste is prohibited except
- 24 yard waste may be accepted by a sanitary landfill for the
- 25 purposes of soil conditioning or composting.
- 26 The bill adds two additional circumstances under which yard
- 27 waste may be accepted for land disposal. The first is when the
- 28 yard waste is collected for disposal as a result of a severe
- 29 storm and the yard waste originates in an area declared to be a
- 30 disaster area in a declaration issued by the president of the
- 31 United States or the governor. The second circumstance is when
- 32 the yard waste is collected for disposal to control, eradicate,
- 33 or prevent the spread of insect pests, tree and plant diseases,
- 34 or invasive plant species problems.
